
#### **VISION**

Approximately 250 participants, including teaching faculty, research scholars, post graduate and undergraduate students benefitted from this seminar.

#### FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PRESERVATION AND NUTRITION

The Department of Home Science organized a weeklong training course on 'Fruit and Vegetable Preservation and Nutrition.' Conducted by the Community Food and Nutrition Extension Unit, Chandigarh under the aegis of Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, it encompassed a series of workshops, practical demonstrations and lectures on nutrition, principles of preservation, breast feeding etc. 30 students of the department received practical training in the



preparation and preservation of various low cost nutritious dishes. In another workshop cum demonstration organized in collaboration with Pidilite Industries, Ms. Shashi Guleria gave hands-on-training in making decorative and utility articles like canvas, key holders and bandanwars.

#### INTERRELATION OF VOCAL AND INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC



The Department of Music organized a two-day National Workshop on 'Interrelation of Vocal and Instrumental Music with Reference to Technical Terms of Indian Music'. The workshop was conducted under the aegis of Rashtriyta Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyaan (RUSA). Dr. Nivedita Singh, Department of Music, Punjabi University, Patiala, Sh. Jagdeep Bedi, renowned Sitar and Sur Bahar artist and Dr. Pankaj Bala Sharma, Co-ordinator, Department of Music, Panjab

University enlightened the students on various aspects of music. The objective of the workshop was to deliberate upon the interrelation between the two and to apprise the participants of the technical terms common to both forms of music.

Both workshops catered to the needs of the students of post-graduation and honours course. Another workshop on 'Fairy Tale Test: A Projective

Technique of Assessing Personality' facilitated by Dr. Carina Coulacoglou, a renowned clinical Psychologist from Greece, was held for the post-graduate students, wherein Prof. Adarsh Kohli, Additional Professor, Department of Psychiatry, PGI, Chandigarh was the special guest. In an educative as well as interesting workshop held on 'Reiki, an Alternative Healing Technique', Ms. Poonam Sharma, a Reiki Grandmaster, healer and hypnotherapist, deliberated upon the topic and shared its techniques with the students.

A lecture on 'Laboratory Safety' by Dr. A. R. Choudhury, IISER Mohali was organized to sensitize students about the significance of following safety measures in laboratories.

#### REMEDIAL CLASSES

With an aim to supplement learning and improve the academic performance of the students, Remedial Classes sponsored by RUSA were held during the session. Practice exercises and extra study material were provided to the students in Commercial Law and Statistics in the **Department of Commerce**. Similarly, the **Department of Public Administration** also organized Remedial Classes for B.A. II (Honours) students in the field of Research Methods and Statistics.

#### INDUSTRIAL VISITS/EDUCATIONAL TRIPS

A series of visits to the Botanical Garden and Rishi Vatika were organized for the students of B.Sc. by the **Department of Botany**. At P. N. Mehra Botanical Garden, Panjab University, Chandigarh, students of B.Sc. II and III studied the local flora in its natural habitat. Students also visited Plant Tissue Culture lab of Botany department, Panjab University, Chandigarh, and learnt the ways and techniques of Plant Tissue Culture.

The Postgraduate Department of Commerce organized an industrial visit to JREW Engineering Ltd located in Industrial Area, Phase 7, Mohali for the students of M.Com to provide them practical knowledge about the processes and procedures involved in the production of various goods and HRM practices.

The Postgraduate Department of Economics conducted an industrial visit to Inter Solar Systems Pvt. Ltd., Dera Bassi, Punjab, where the representatives of the firm demonstrated various manufacturing processes of Solar Water Heaters and Solar Panels. The students were apprised of various quality checks carried out during manufacturing of the same.





The Postgraduate Department of English took the students of Functional English for a field trip to Doordarshan Centre, Chandigarh so as to provide them an insight into the world of television journalism. During this guided visit, the budding journalists were exposed to varied techniques of editing, lighting and camera.

Silmilarly, while the **Department of History** organized a one day educational trip to Virasat-e-Khalsa, a museum of Sikh history at Anandpur Sahib, Panjab to apprise the students of the rich culture and heritage of the state, a study tour to Pushpa Gujral Science City, Jalandhar was organized by the **Department of Microbial and Food Technology** for the students.

The **Department of Physics** arranged a visit to the Institute of Nano-Science and Technology (INST), Mohali where students and faculty interacted with the scientists and learnt about various research fields at INST. A visit to INDOSAW Industrial Products Pvt. Ltd. was organized wherein students visited production, R & D and workshop sections of this scientific instruments industry. They learned how instruments are used and manufactured right from the designing stage to the final product. Eight students of B.Sc. III (Non-Medical) participated in National Anveshika Experimental Skills Test and four were selected for the Preliminary Test. An educational trip to Kasuali, Himachal Pradesh was also organized. Students visited Central Forensic Science Lab and learnt various techniques like voice identification, mobile data recovery and data recovery from hard disk. Students visited UIET and performed additional experiments based on Bernoulli's theorem at the mechanical engineering lab.

#### RESEARCH

The quality conscious MCM faculty and students are constantly updating their knowledge base and research component. A large number of members are involved in writing books, undertaking projects, and presenting and publishing research papers at various levels - international, national, and regional. In the last

session, faculty members bagged 2 minor projects; contributed 50 research papers in peer-reviewed and indexed national and international research journals; published 11 books, and 12 chapters in various books with ISBN numbers. They also bagged 6 research awards for contributions in their respective fields. Following the footsteps of their teachers, 20 students also presented research papers at various conferences.



The college crossed yet another milestone when its refereed and peer-reviewed research journal 'New Horizons' was included in the list of journals approved by UGC.

#### FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME UNDER RUSA

Learning process for students can become effective only when the teacher is herself inspired, motivated, and eager to learn and innovate to make teaching fruitful and enjoyable. Cognizant of the need to update and upgrade the knowledge component of the faculty, IQAC planned several programmes for the benefit of teachers.



#### ICT: NEW DIMENSIONS IN RESEARCH AND HIGHER EDUCATION

A seven day RUSA sponsored FDP on 'ICT: New Dimensions in Research and Higher Education' was organized in the College from 26 November to 02 December 2016. Eminent speakers from diverse fields updated and imparted knowledge to the participants on new technological trends emerging in the field of Higher Education.

Professor Suresh Chadha, Chairperson, University Business School, Panjab University,



Chandigarh delivered the Inaugural Address and suggested that the academicians should try to identify the problems faced by the small scale industry and carry out research in this regard to bring forward solutions to bridge the gap between academia and industry. He said that in order to scale heights, every student should have five basic things namely, education, knowledge, skills, values and sense of responsibility towards the environment.

Prof. Ravi K Mahajan, USOL, Panjab University,

Chandigarh apprised the participants of the latest developments in the field of ICT. He emphasized on the use of technology in education and that Digital India, Startups are all good signs of the same. He also deliberated upon the challenges in the form of emerging ICT, Choice Based Credit System, accountability and ever expanding horizon of information age.





Prof. R. K. Singla from the Department of Computer Science, Panjab University, Chandigarh deliberated upon the topic ITC and its development. He informed the participants about importance of ITC in the higher education sector in the present scenario. Tracing the development of ITC, he also drew attention towards its benefits and challenges.

Dr. Anil Angrish, Associate Professor at NIPER, gave a presentation on various grants offered by diverse

National, International and Multi-lateral Bodies such as the UGC, DBT and ICSSR. The meaning, purpose and eligibility criteria for various grants, Major and Minor Research Projects, Post Doctorate Fellowships, Academic Staff Fellowships and many more were explained in detail.



Mr. Naveen Thakur, Business Head from Technova Solutions conducted an informative session on Smart Classrooms and the use of Smart Boards. He stated that the classrooms of today have graduated from blackboards and face-to-face interaction of the teacher with a small number of students to virtual classrooms wherein a teacher addresses a very large number of students located at different places across the globe. He also discussed the use of 'Information Kiosk' and Digital Podium.



Prof. Neena Capalash from Department of Biotechnology, and Dean, Students Welfare, Panjab University, Chandigarh held a session on 'Basic Tenets of Writing a Scientific Research Paper'. She discussed various types of scientific writings which included abstracts, research papers, review papers, book chapters, short communications, commentary and technical reports. She explained about the anatomy of a scientific research paper pinpointing the equal importance of each of its components.

Dr. Tejinder Pal Singh, Assistant Professor, University Business School, Panjab University, Chandigarh conducted very useful sessions on 'Reference Management' and 'Plagiarism'. While explaining different referencing styles related to various disciplines of research, he also focused on publications with variable reference styles and laid special emphasis on Mendeley, a reference management software that is available online.



Dr. Amit Lal, Assistant Professor, NIT, Jalandhar conducted sessions on 'Understanding Fundamentals of Research with SPSS'. He discussed about important assumptions such as normality, homogeneity, linearity and independence for statistical tests. He also emphasized on the importance of these vital parameters, to avoid misleading or false results. He suggested the use of kolmogorov-smironov and shapirowilk statistical tests.

Dr. Harish Kumar, Head, Skill Development Centre, Panjab University, Chandigarh held a session on 'Skill Development and ICT.' He highlighted the shooting need to impart skill-based knowledge to the students, and to include skill based curriculum and teaching methods. He also updated the participants on the new teaching methodologies in ICT.





Dr Dalip Kumar, ASPD, RUSA, Chandigarh Administration delivered the Valedictory Address in which he deliberated upon the various programmes, grants and schemes being initiated by the Government of India under Rashtriya Uchchtar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) to enhance the levels of academics and infrastructure in the institutions of Higher Education across the country. He also lauded the efforts of the team for organizing programmes to improve the quality of pedagogy in the college.

#### FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME



Another seven day National Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on 'Expanding Paradigms of Pedagogy' encompassing a broad spectrum of topics relevant to the current higher education scenario was organized by the IQAC from 13-19 April, 2017. The endeavour aimed to sensitize the participants about the various facets of teaching, research, technicalities and challenges therein. In this programme, expert speakers from diverse fields at pan-India level shared their concerns and deliberated on various aspects of pedagogy. It included an eclectic mix of topics like effective teaching techniques, latest teaching tools, fundamentals of research and statistics, research ethics, promotion of research at students' level, learning disabilities, stress management, industry-academia interface, API, theatre and classroom teaching, etc. to enhance pedagogical expertise of teachers. The FDP was attended by teachers and researchers from 7 states and 2 union territories.

In the inaugural session, the keynote speaker, Prof. (Dr.) V. Vijaya Kumar, Founder Member, National Law School of India University, Bangalore asserted that teaching is a commitment and 21<sup>st</sup> century poses a lot of challenges for the teaching community in the form of integrating ICT mechanisms in teaching practices, keeping abreast of contemporary changes and creating an enabling academic environment for teacher-student interaction.





Prof. (Dr.) Jaspal Singh Sandhu, Secretary, UGC, New Delhi delivered the inaugural address in which he shared anecdotes from his own life to emphasize the paramount importance of teachers in the lives of students and urged the teachers to internalize the basic tenets of teaching like good communication skills, investigative mind, updating knowledge and promoting research.

In his presidential address Prof. Ranbir Singh, VC, National Law University, New Delhi laid stress on collective responsibility of teachers in sailing through the transformative changes in the field of education and creating a conducive environment for teaching-learning where teachers are technically sound, professionally competent, socially relevant and accessible so that they can chisel out the best from the students.





Prof. (Dr.) Paramjit S. Jaswal, VC, Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Patiala highlighted the responsibility of teachers in moulding generations, and urged the teachers to work consistently on enhancing their competency.

Dr. Parvinder Singh, Controller of Examinations and Dean, College Development Council, Panjab University, Chandigarh proposed

the Vote of Thanks in the inaugural session of the FDP and appreciated this endeavour of the college in addressing such pertinent issues.





Prof. Adarsh Kohli, Department of Psychiatry, PGIMER gave an insight into 'Learning Disorder' (LD).

She apprised the participants of the signs and types of LDs, factors responsible for the disorder, procedure for assessment of LD. She lucidly explained the dynamics of students' learning styles, classroom education design, socio-emotional impact of LD and individually tailored remedies, and stressed on the need to address this issue at community level.

Prof. Kapil H. Paranjpe, Department of Mathematical Sciences and Dean (Faculty), IISER, Mohali shared his expertise with the participants on the statistical programming language. He elucidated on data management, ways of data presentation and also conducted a sample data analysis session using R Studio which enabled the participants to get a better understanding of the software.



Prof. R. S. Salaria, Educator, Author and Motivator held a brainstorming session on 'Holistic Approach to Education, Research and Humane Conduct' during which he underlined the significance of teachers' role as mentors, role models and nurturers of future generations and the need to continuously upgrade one's knowledge in order to be an effective guide to one's students.

Dr. Abhishek Chaudhuri, Assistant Professor, IISER, Mohali held an informative session on 'Data Presentation: Statistics and Graphical Presentation'. He emphasized that research is used in different spheres of life and can have implications for decision making and policy making too.





Prof. Archana R. Singh, Chairperson,
School of Communication Studies, Panjab
University, Chandigarh delved into the way digital technology has changed the teaching-learning process. She emphasized upon the techniques for effective classroom teaching.

Prof. Gulshan Kumar, Associate Professor, UILS, Panjab University, Chandigarh while deliberating upon the relevance of API in Higher Education, pointed out that updation and academic development of faculty is crucial to boost professional competency of students.





Prof. Sucha Singh Gill from the Centre for Research in Rural and Industrial Development,

Chandigarh enlightened everyone on 'Demonetization'. He pointed out the loopholes in the data collection process using relevant examples from the demonetization drive and stressed on the need to integrate empirical findings and ground reality for a holistic view of a problem.

Prof. N. G. Prasad from the Department of Biological Sciences, IISER, Mohali conducted an informative session on 'Writing Research Papers and Getting Grants'.





Dr. Prabhjot Malhi, Department of Paedriatics, PGIMER, Chandigarh deliberated on 'Resilience in Young Adults'. She emphasized that young people need role models and not critics, and, apprised the faculty about the ways of fostering resilience, right skills and competencies among students.

Prof. Neelam Mansingh Chowdhry, a noted theatre personality, expressed her views

on the role of theatre in different aspects of life. Referring to classroom as the place to take risks, open doors, challenge status quo and opening the minds of students to complex/mature ideas, she reiterated that a teacher is a performer who weaves a thread to connect with his/her audience and adds different dimensions to their personality.



Dr. Dapinder Kaur Bakshi, Principal Scientific Officer, Biotechnology Division, Panjab University, Chandigarh State Council for Science and Technology, Chandigarh and an MCM alumna enlightened the audience on the topic of 'Women Empowerment and Funding for Women Entrepreneurship'. She made the participants aware of the various funding agencies like DBT, DST, CSIR, MSME, DRDO, etc. which promote entrepreneurship.

Prof. R. Gadagkar, Year of Science Chair Professor, Centre for Ecological Sciences, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore dealt with the practical aspect of designing experiments. He stressed on the fact that science is a democratic process and can be practiced by anyone as inquisitiveness is the foundation of knowledge.





Prof. Arun Kumar Grover, Vice Chancellor, Panjab University, Chandigarh, who was the Chief Guest in the valedictory session, congratulated the college for this novel initiative of enabling the creation of academic environment for excellence in education. He lauded the efforts of the institution in holding such programmes to benefit the teaching faculty.

#### WORKSHOPS FOR SUPPORT STAFF

The thrust of IQAC on capacity building of the teaching faculty and support staff continued in the form of a RUSA-sponsored workshop on Stress Management organized to ensure a qualitative change in the personalities of participants. Mr. K. S. Chatwal, a Management Trainer with SBI and a Life Coach conducted a stimulating programme to help the participants inculcate life skills. He maintained that fruitful channelization of our time and energy fosters a sense of well-being and leads to healthy interpersonal relationships.



Led by the same goal, the **Department**of Computer Science and Applications
conducted a seven day Workshop on 'Digital
Literacy' for the non-teaching employees of
the college. It included topics like Digital
Payments, use of Office and Web applications
and apprised the support staff of their usage in
a series of lectures and practical sessions. Prof.
B. S. Ghuman from the Department of Public
Administration, PU was the Chief Guest.

#### PRINCIPALS' MEET

A meeting of Principals, RUSA Institutional Coordinators, Nodal officers and officials of Accounts Department of various Colleges of Chandigarh was held in the campus to deliberate upon various academic activities, civil works including environment management, procurement, financial aspects and equity assurance plan implementation action plan and timelines with respect to the utilization of grant received under RUSA scheme of MHRD. Additional State Project Director (RUSA), Chandigarh Dr. Dalip Kumar presided over the meeting and briefed the participants about the grants available under the RUSA Scheme to the College and the optimum utilization of these grants. Mr. Vijay Vij, Assistant Controller Finance and Accounts, Finance Department, Chandigarh elucidated on the financial management aspect of the administration, nuances of financial handling in the offices and the need for maintaining greater transparency so far as the utilization of government resources is concerned.

#### SOCIAL OUTREACH PROGRAMMES

The Rotaract Club organized a literacy campaign wherein the volunteers actively engaged in conducting literacy workshops in slum areas. Books, stationary items and eatables were donated by the club to the under privileged kids. To generate awareness about the significance of Organ Donation, members of the Rotaract Club of the college participated enthusiastically in a 3 km walkathon organized by PGI and Fortis



in collaboration with NDTV India. The Club also organized a meet to spread awareness about Stem Cell Donation. On the eve of the Independence Day the club organized a visit to Prabh Aasra, a home for the destitute and forsaken old people.

The Club also organized a two day Blood Donation camp in collaboration with the Rotary Blood Bank Society, Chandigarh. In the camp inaugurated by Mr. Baldev Aggarwal, Chairman, Rotary Club, Chandigarh, 132 units of blood were donated.

The Club also donated an amount of Rs 20,000 to SAHAYTA, a welfare organization for cancer patients to support the chemotherapy of a child. The volunteers of the Club visited SOREM, a school for special children on a regular basis. They spent quality time with the children and taught them performing arts. The Club conducted various awareness drives like Health and Sanitation Drive, No Cracker Drive and Flash Mobs on important issues like women empowerment to sensitize people on social issues through street plays.

To bolster the element of social responsibility among the students, the **NSS unit** organized several programmes such as Rallies, Awareness Campaigns, and Drives on Natural Disasters, Prevention of Polio and AIDS, Tiranga March, Rashtriya Ekta Divas, Digital India, National Voters' Day and Blood Donation Camp in which volunteers participated enthusiastically. In a tree plantation drive, they planted saplings of trees which act as natural mosquito repellents. NSS volunteer Ashima did the college proud by participating in the Republic Day Parade at Raj Path, New Delhi.

#### NEW ENDEAVOURS




To inculcate the Vedic culture and value system rooted in our tradition and spirituality, the College formed an **Arya Yuvti Samaj** which initiated a new practice of organizing a Havan and Spiritual Discourse on the 1<sup>st</sup> of every month in the college campus. The programme is attended with zeal not only by the students and faculty but also by the support staff. Students are encouraged to express their views on various social and moral issues and awarded prizes for their initiative and effort.

The quality of teaching and learning process needs to be maintained by enhancing infrastructure and facilities from time to time. With this aim, new teaching aids such as overhead projectors, visualizers, computers, and Wi-Fi facility in laboratories were added. To cope up with the increase in the number of students new furniture, laptops, printers, compactor, and water dispensers were procured this year. In addition, students' washrooms were renovated for better facilitation and new washrooms were constructed for the differently-abled as well as for the bank within the college premises. 9 departmental staff-rooms, 5 new classrooms, 1 room each for NCC, NSS, and Rotaract Club, and 4 new storage spaces were also added to the existing infrastructure.

To make the campus eco-friendly, 3 solar power plants of 20kWp each have been installed. Sinks discarded after renovation of Chemistry lab were used as flower beds. E-waste bins were provided at various spots in the college and students were encouraged to dispose off their E-waste in them. 4 solar lights of high luminosity were also installed in the College. The hostel was furnished with solar heating systems for providing hot water to the residents.



To monitor the quality of air and sensitize the students about their responsibility to maintain clean and healthy environment, a Real Time Indoor and Outdoor Air Quality Monitoring System was installed in the campus, a first of its kind in the country. The daily data stored in the system can be used for conducting research on the changing quality and levels of pollution in the air we breathe in.



#### ACHIEVEMENTS IN ACADEMICS

The quality of teaching-learning receives a tremendous boost when our students make a mark for themselves in the Panjab University annual results and bag top slots. Keeping up the tradition, this year too, MCM results were far better than those of the university and many students did the college proud by securing positions among the top ten in various classes.
