Policy - Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC)

The Equal Opportunity Cell was formed in the College in July 2017 as per the mandate of UGC. The main objective of the EOC is to facilitate affirmative action to ensure equal opportunities for all within its fold. The EOC works for the benefit of the students belonging to the disadvantaged groups i.e. SCs, STs, OBCs (non-creamy layer), minorities and differently-abled Persons (PWD)

The College offers the following facilities for the benefit of its students:

A. Scholarships and Financial Support

- The College provides Scholarships and Financial Support to a number of students under various categories. The financial support is provided by the Institution, Government, College Development Council, Panjab University and other bodies. The main responsibility of the Equal Opportunity Cell is to ensure that the students from the disadvantaged groups of SCs/ STs/ OBC/ and minorities are benefitted through these schemes.
- The EOC and the Scholarship Committee disseminate information related to the schemes and programmes for the students.
- The PWD, SC/ST and EWS category students are being given tuition fee waiver on Merit-cum-Means basis from the session 2020-2021.

B. Preserve the rights of Minorities

- The College strength comprises of students from all communities Muslims, Sikhs, Christians, Buddhists and Jains. The College ensures that there is no discrimination on grounds of minority status.
- It is ensured that the rights of ethnic, religious, and linguistic minorities are considered. Protection of their identity is ensured. They benefit from the principles of effective participation and non-discrimination in all College activities.

C. Providing Infrastructural facilities to Differently-abled/ PWD/ Divyangjan

- The College has designated a room in the administrative block for EOC where students can meet the members of the Committee.
- The College building is disable-friendly to ensure hassle-free stay and movement of such students. There are ramps and a lift for students with mobility impairment for easy accessibility to the upper floors.
- The College has special toilets for differently-abled students and staff.

• The authorities and students are very supportive, considerate and empathetic to the students with special needs. Special care is taken while allotting timetable to students. They are encouraged to participate in various activities.

D. Grievance Redressal

• Complaints of students and staff members (teaching and non-teaching) if any, are addressed on regular basis.
