



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ENDEAVOURS AND ACHIEVEMENTS, 2018-19

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh has, since its inception, consistently shown a zeal to implement the high and noble ideals laid down in the Mission Statement of the institution. Led by its highly dedicated members, especially those representing diverse fields of knowledge and industry, the IQAC has been constantly striving to maintain high standards and quality in all arenas—academics, sports, pedagogy, skill development, evaluation, governance and administration.

As the college entered into its Golden Jubilee year in 2018, the IQAC planned and organized a variety of programmes and activities to impart quality education, proficiency in soft skills, practical knowledge and employability-enhancing capabilities apart from enhancing social sensitivity among the students of the institution. Throughout the session, the stakeholders were provided varied opportunities to learn from and interact with the best of minds through a series of seminars, workshops, awareness campaigns, extension lectures, field trips and industrial visits.

To bridge the gap among the stakeholders, and strengthen the system for a consistent academic and administrative improvement of the institution, the IQAC held its periodical meetings on October 29, 2018 and May 21, 2019. During these interactions, a variety of issues and plans such as increasing ICT based Teaching Aids and Projectors in the classrooms, improving the ventilation and cleanliness of the Canteen, provision of a restroom for mess workers, installation of CCTV Cameras in the hostel etc. were discussed. Based on a comprehensive analysis of the inputs and feedback received from the stakeholders from time to time, new strategies, activities and plans were chalked out.

In the internal IQAC meetings held on February 16, 2019 and March 13, 2019, the members discussed in detail various components of each Criterion stipulated by NAAC such as Teaching Learning Curriculum Development, Learning Resources and Student Support apart from projected programmes for enhancing research, skill development, value-added courses and short term courses. The members also deliberated upon the procedure to be followed while submitting the Annual Quality Assessment Report 2019 online to NAAC in December 2019.

Epitomizing the values of resilience, determination, endurance and indomitable spirit, the distinguished guests motivated the students with their stimulating stories of courage and conviction, and urged them to challenge the norms of the patriarchal society.



DIGITIZING INDIA: AN ENDEAVOUR TO EMPOWER AND TRANSFORM BUSINESS

The students were taught all technical and theoretical aspects of mushroom cultivation in four modules to give training in spawn production, substrate collection and sterilization, filling of bottles and bags through spawn layering technique, identifying and optimizing spawn run, pinning and harvesting stages. A total of 47 students from various colleges participated in this workshop.

COGNITIVE SKILLS, DESIGN THINKING AND CRITICAL THINKING

The **Institution Innovation Council** (IIC) organized a workshop on the theme 'Cognitive Skills, Design Thinking and Critical Thinking' on April 4, 2019. Dr. Shilpa Suri, Deputy Chairperson, CII Indian Women Network, Tricity Chapter sensitized 47 students and 16 members of faculty about the cognitive skills that are required for the making of a successful entrepreneur. A series of workshops across 60 hours from February 16 to April 16, 2019 titled 'Be a Health Manager' was initiated by the **Skill Development Committee** to equip women with skills in the area of food and nutrition through 23 intensive sessions that included 12 interactive sessions and 11 hands on training sessions on issues pertaining to nutritional deficiencies, meditation, yoga and healthy cooking. Hands-on workshops on making organic body-care products, multigrain cookies, guilt free cakes, etc. were also held. The programme was an amalgamation of practical and theoretical knowledge to help women manage the health of those around them apart from their own.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND COMMUNICATION SKILLS

The **Postgraduate Department of English** held a 4-day workshop on English language and Communication Skills on June 15-18, 2019. It witnessed an enthusiastic participation of 25 participants including students, research scholars, social workers and housewives. DECODING BUDDHA THROUGH ART



They were acquainted with various steps, procedures and processes involved in the production of many life-saving drugs and vaccines.

RESEARCH

With the aim to promote **Research at the Undergraduate Level**, the college sanctioned 7 Research Projects of students from the Seed Money stipulated for the same. 3 students of the **Department of Public Administration** undertook a Research Project titled "Students' Perception of Online Admission System: A Case Study of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh (2018-19)" which studied the student's perceptions of the current online centralized admission system prescribed by the Chandigarh Administration and also the online admission system followed by the college for admissions to various classes. The aim of the project was to examine the Role of E-Governance in Higher Education; Concept and Objectives of Online Admission System, and its benefits so as to suggest improvements in the current system.

During 2018-19, apart from contributing 21 Research Papers in the International UGC approved journals and 7 research papers in National UGC journals, faculty members published 17 books, 40 chapters in various books with ISBN number and 3 conference proceedings. Members of faculty also presented 22 papers at International, 18 at National, 6 at State and 2 at local level Seminars and Conferences. 14 faculty members acted as resource persons at various workshops and events. A total of 135 members attended Seminars and Workshops at different levels.

Emulating their teachers, 81 students also presented and published papers in various journals. 26 students cleared UGC NET examination in various subjects while 1 cleared GATE

Dr Mridula Sharma received a Travel Grant of 103360/- from UGC; Dr. Purnima Bhandari from the Department of Botany was awarded a Travel Grant of Rs. 4700/- from the International Union of Biological Sciences (IUBS), Paris for participating in the Sixth International Conference on Plants and Environmental Pollution organized by National Botanical Research Institute, Lucknow, India.

Dr. Vandana Sharma and Dr. Sandeep from the Department Food Science were awarded a Project grant of Rs 75,000/- to conduct research on 'Biosensor Based Kit for Rapid Detection of Enterobacteriaceae in Drinking Water' by the Department of Science and Technology and Renewable Energy, Chandigarh Administration.

MEDICAL CAMP





RASHTRIYA UCHCHTAR SHIKSHA ABHIYAN

Rashtriya Uchchttar Shiksha Abhiyan has contributed immensely to the growth of the institution, both in terms of staff upgradation through capacity building programmes; student improvement through skill-oriented sessions and infrastructure enhancement in the form of procurement of advanced teaching-learning resources, instruments for laboratories and pedagogical tools. Preparatory and Infrastructure Grants received under this mission was optimally utilized to transform the spectrum of higher learning.

A STEP TOWARDS SWACHH BHARAT

RUSA Infrastructure Grant of Rs. 1.5 Cr facilitated the infrastructural growth of the institution. In view of the rising student enrolment in the past few years, there was a dire need to add to the existing number of washrooms and support units in the college. Timely release of the RUSA Infrastructure Grant helped us undertake the construction of 27 new washrooms, including three washrooms, exclusively for Divyang users. Two projects were undertaken to meet the requirements of the students and staff.

Another project i.e. construction of 12 New Washrooms with one wash-room on each floor for differently-abled users was completed in Block D (First and Second Floors) under the aegis of RUSA. This project was inspired by Hon'ble Prime Minister's vision of Swachh Bharat.

NEW INITIATIVES - RAINWATER HARVESTING SYSTEM

Committed to sustainable growth and protection of the ecosystem, the institution has installed a Rainwater Harvesting System to channel the rainwater accumulation in four blocks of the college hostel. This project comprised the following steps:

1) Construction of RWHS, RCC Tank cum Injection Well which included reinforced concrete work. 2) Drilling of the Tubewell up to depth of 100M BGL and the construction of tubewell in accordance with IS:2800 (part I) and IS (11189) to establish maximum rate of usable water yield without sand content (beyond permissible limit). 3) Laying of



PVC/RCC pipe, Manhole, Main Chambers and Rainwater Chamber of size 1'6"* 1'6" for Existing Rainwater Disposal point to main Rainwater Chamber.

WATER BOOSTING SYSTEM

In order to meet the needs of the hostel students, a Water Boosting System was installed in A and B Blocks. An Underground Water Reservoir with a capacity of 10,000 gallons was constructed with RCC Walls of 9 inch thickness, doubly reinforced. 3 Horse Power single phase submersible motor pump, having 32mm dia suction was installed for boosting up the level of water with the help of 750 ft distribution pipe.

EQUIPMENT AND KNOWLEDGE RESOURCES

The funding provided by RUSA has given impetus to the infrastructural improvement of the institution so as to attain higher levels of access, equity and excellence. It has further accelerated not only efficiency but also exponential advancement in classroom teaching. In the pursuit of excellence, consistent strides have been taken to update institutional resources:

- ♣ Large Format Display was installed in the Conference Room
- Computers were procured out of RUSA Grant for setting up a Digital Lounge in the hostel.
- ❖ More Computers were procured for smooth functioning of the academic and administrative work.
- ❖ Interactive Boards as Pedagogical Aids were procured to facilitate teaching-learning environment

With the aim of enhancing the employability skills of the students, the **Placement Cell** organized several activities including a two-day motivational talk on 'Career Awareness in Indian Air Force' by Captain Manish Sabharwal on September 14-15, 2018 followed by an Orientation Session for Tata Consultancy Services; a training session on Resume Writing and a workshop on 'Interview Techniques'.

Many reputed companies visited the campus for placements, starting with the Convergys Placement Drive. The students were apprised of diverse opportunities available in the fields of microbiology and food technology.

SOCIAL MEDIA VIS-A-VIS SOCIETAL HARMONY

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell organized an enlightening panel discussion on 'Social Media visavis Societal Harmony' on August 7, 2018. 
