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Bridge Course on Income Tax begins at MCM

Α 2-weeks Online Bridge Course on 'Basics of Income Tax Laws' began at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women here today. Organised under the aegis of the Post Graduate Department of Commerce of the



college, the course has been designed with the objective of creating basic understanding of income tax laws. The course was inaugurated by the college Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava, who lauded this endeavour of the department and emphasized the importance of this course as a foundation for creating a strong base for the subject. Dr. Bhargava also asserted that the field of income tax offers lucrative career opportunities. Ms. Raman Ghuman, the Head of the PG Department of Commerce emphasized on how income tax plays a significant role in nation building and thus, as responsible citizens, it becomes essential for everyone to have a thorough understanding of the nuances of the income tax laws. On the inaugural day, the resource persons for the course Ms. Sahiba Sharma and Ms. Ritu Rani, Assistant Professors at the college, explained the basic terminology of income tax laws including history of income tax, concept of income, basic clubbing provisions and current tax slabs. At the end of the first session, the queries of the participants were taken up by the speakers of the day as well as addressed by CA Shubham Pandey and CA Navneet Sharma.

National Workshop on Science in Action at MCM



A 3-day online National Workshop on 'Science in Action Series I' organized under the aegis of Dept of Food Science of the college in collaboration with Department of Biochemistry, Panjab University. The workshop is being held in association with the

Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, IISER, Pune, NCCS and Persistent Systems. The workshop is being organised with the vision to enhance the competence of participants in terms of reading and interpreting scientific literature and to introduce them to MANAV- The Human Atlas Initiative. Dr. Anupama Harshal, Consultant, Science Communication and Public Engagement (for MANAV Project), IISER, Pune was the resource person for this highly informative workshop that witnessed registration of 627 participants from across India. Speaking on this occasion, Prof. Archana Bhatnagar, Chairperson, Department of Biochemistry, Panjab University asserted that this collaborative endeavour envisions to contribute to the cause of developing scientific temperament among students. In her engrossing discourse, Dr. Anupama Harshal shed light on important aspects of scientific research including how to read scientific literature, research methodology and use of annotation for MANAV. She further educated the participants about project MANAV which is an initiative of Department of Biotechnology, Government of India wherein all the available scientific information related to human beings is being collected at one place. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava lauded this unique initiative to contribute towards scientific awareness. She said that this is an exemplary endeavour to reawaken ancient Indian wisdom as mentioned in our comprehensive ancient text on Indian medicine Charaka Samhita and literature like Atharva Veda.

Workshop on Empirical Financial Econometrics at MCM



A 9-day online workshop titled 'Empirical Financial **Econometrics** using Eviews' began at Mehr DAV Chand Mahajan College for Women here today. Organised under the aegis of the college's Internal Quality Assurance Cell and Postgraduate Department of Commerce,

the workshop witnessed enthusiastic participation of over 130 participants including students, researchers and academicians from various universities and institutions across India, Sri Lanka and Saudi Arab. Prof. Suresh Chadha and Prof. Suveera Gill, both from UBS, Panjab University also graced the inaugural session. Mr. Narain, Faculty of Management Studies, University of Delhi is the resource person for the entire duration of the workshop. Inaugurating the workshop, college Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava highlighted the importance of financial econometrics by pointing out the fact that the abundance of data available now-a-days makes it imperative to have an understanding and hands-on experience of data analysis softwares for better business and policy decision making. Besides providing hands-on experience of e-views to the participants, the workshop will include intensive sessions on regression analysis, regression estimates, time series analysis, Stochastic Processes, Stationarity, Cointergration analysia, ARIMA Modelling, VAR Modelling, Causality Analysis and ARCH/GARCH along with event study methodology.

Workshop on fashion designing at MCM



Elegant Attire, a 7-day online workshop on the basics of fashion designing culminated at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women. Organised under the aegis of Skill Development Committee of the college, the objective of the workshop was to aware students about career opportunities in the fashion industry and also to enhance their sense of personal styling. Ms. Heena Sharma, Founder, CRIO and Heena Style Studio was the resource person for the entire duration of the workshop. 70 students partook in the workshop and benefitted from the expertise of

Ms. Heena, who educated the participants about the basics concepts in fashion designing. Enlightening the participants about the plethora of opportunities in the area of fashion designing, Ms. Heena shared that besides being a fashion designer, various other avenues like art director, technical assistant, marketing head, product development and merchandise planner can be explored and pursued in this field. The expert also shed light on the aspects of personal styling, presence on social media and how to pursue career in fashion industry. A highlight of the workshop was the introduction of the concept of sustainable fashion, which is much needed in these times of environmental crisis, wherein the participants learnt about how the use, type and style of fabric can be made sustainable. college, the FDP is being conducted for the faculty in higher educational institutions of Vidarbha Region of Maharashtra. An overwhelming number, i.e. 250, of academicians including Principals and Senior Professors registered for the programme. Dr. Gurvinder Kaur, Associate Professor of Public Administration at MCM, Dr. Minakshi Rana, Assistant Professor of Sociology at MCM and Dr. Neeraj, Deputy Librarian, Central Library, Panjab University are the resource persons for the FDP. The week-long intensive programme is designed to provide orientation to the participants on basics of research, developing a research proposal, tools of data collection and analysis of findings, submission of research papers to SCOPUS and CARE listed journals, plagiarism check and relevance of applied research.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava asserted that this endeavour of the Sustainable Practices Committee holds immense significance in the light of contribution of research towards betterment of the society by guiding sound policy formulation. She added that keeping in mind the importance of research, the college not only promotes research by its faculty but also motivates and guides students to undertake research and contribute positively towards social welfare.

MCM holds webinar on sexual harassment at workplace



The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised a webinar titled 'Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Act 2013): Prevention, Prohibition and

Redressal'. Prof. Anand Pawar, Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Patiala was the resource person for the webinar that envisioned to enlighten the staff members about the various legal provisions governing sexual harassment at workplace. Over 50 staff members participated in the webinar and benefitted from the insights shared by Prof. Pawar. Beginning with a brief description of the Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act 2013, Prof. Pawar elucidated the concepts of workplace and sexual harassment to clarify what all organisations come under the definition of workplace and what all behaviours constitute sexual harassment. Prof. Pawar also shed light on the definition of aggrieved persons under the Act and elaborated, with examples, on the common forms of inappropriate behaviour like quid pro quo and hostile work environment. He further apprised the attendees about the constitution and composition of ICC as required under the Act, and discussed the responsibility of employer in prevention and prohibition of sexual harassment. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava said that the webinar was organised with the aim of generating awareness and orientation on the issue of sexual harassment and how to prevent it. She added that the college is committed to making the workplace employee friendly and has an ICC in place for creating policies regarding prevention of sexual harassment incidents.

Role models inspire students during 'Unsuni' by MCM



In a novel initiative aiming to provide a platform for interaction with individuals who have unique stories in terms of social inclusion, creativity and inspiration, the Sustainable Practices Committee of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised 3 different sessions under the series 'Unsuni: The Unheard Voices'. As part of the series, three individuals who have broken the glass ceiling in their respective ways interacted with students. The first session was an interaction with Mx. Dhananiay Chauhan. а transgender activist and Mr. Oiaswwee Sharma. Filmmaker.

The session encapsulated Mx. Chauhan's struggle as a transgender, wherein the focus of the talk was to extend social sustainability aspect to gender, equality, justice and dignity. Mr. Ojaswwee Sharma apprised the students about the journey of shooting his documentary 'Admitted', through which he wanted to put forth the story of Mx. Dhananjay as a famous example of transgender education in a mainstream public university in North India highlighting the development of transgender rights, education and acceptance to the mainstream.



In the 2nd session, Ms. Harbhajan Kaur, who started her entrepreneurial journey at the age of 90, shared her inspirational story with the students. In a lively interaction, Ms. Kaur said that having missed on formal education, she decided to rejuvenate her life by becoming an earner and thus, began her journey of entrepreneurship with her scrumptious 'Besan ki Barfi' and other delicacies. The 3rd session was dedicated to interaction with Ms. Jahan Geet Singh, the dhol girl. Breaking stereotypes since she was 12, when she decided to play dhol for the first time, Ms. Singh uses beats of her dhol to stir up support for various social causes. All the three sessions proved immensely fulfilling for the students who felt inspired after listening to these motivating stories of courage, determination, zeal, optimism and never say die spirit. Expressing appreciation for this unique initiative of the Sustainable Practices Committee, Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava informed that these sessions envisioned to inspire students to break the glass ceiling and to overcome the difficulties in life with strength and optimism. She added that the desire to learn and grow should never come to a stop.

10-day International Student Development Programme begins at MCM



A 10-day online International Multi-Dimensional Student Development Programme began at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women under the aegis of its Postgraduate Department of Economics. The objective of the programme is to enhance the research capability of the students by providing them a deep understanding of the various concepts pertaining to research and also to amplify their abilities to access various online learning platforms. Over 110 students registered for the programme, one of the highlights of which is that all the resource

persons are distinguished alumni of the college. Prof. Harsh Gandhar, USOL, Panjab University, Chandigrh and Ms. Nimisha Kumar, Head, Acquisition Advisory, Finman Capital were the Guests of Honour for the inaugural session. Inaugurating the programme, Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava lauded this initiative and expressed hope that a programme of this stature would be a value-addition to MCM's vision of providing holistic education. She added that even the pandemic could not deter MCM from pursuing this vision and education went on uninterrupted during this period.

Sharing her thoughts on 'Education, Skill Development and Youth Aspiration', Prof. Harsh Gandhar shed light on the importance of primary, secondary and higher education. Asserting that India has the advantage of demographic dividend, Prof. Gandhar impressed upon the importance of vocationalisation of education and skill development for enhancing employability of the youth. In her talk titled 'Getting Women into Leadership Roles: Challenges, Changing Trends and Role of Management', Ms. Nimisha Kumar discussed the prevalence of gender biases at the workplace and what measures can help in promoting diversity in organisations. Pointing to the fact that a lesser number of women make it to senior most positions in organisations, Ms. Kumar said that lack of senior support, poor mentorship, lack of support from family, etc. are few reasons that thwart the growth of a woman's career graph. During the second session of day 1, Dr. Tejinderpal Singh, Associate Professor, UBS, PU shared insights about Massive Open Online Course: How to start and Finish it Successfully. The 10-day intensive programme will equip students with valuable knowledge on a wide spectrum of topics including preparation for IES, career in communications, wealth creation via stock markets, data handling in SPSS, G Power Software, Behavioural Economics, Design Management and much more.

Bridge course in English begins at MCM



A 7 day online bridge course titled 'Learn Basics of English' began at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women. Organised under the aegis of the Department of English, the aim of the course is to cover the basics of English Language including basic grammar and tips for better speaking, listening and writing skills. Over 75 participants who registered themselves for the course included women from all walks of life; students, professionals, entrepreneurs, homemakers and many others who simply wanted to brush up their basic language skills. Dr. Apara Sharma and Ms. Ruchika

Singh, both Assistant Professors of English at MCM are the resource persons for the course. The 7 days of the course comprise intensive modules focusing on tenses, subject-verb agreement, speaking, writing and listening skills, and correct pronunciation. Practice exercises and practical sessions will also be a part of the modules, thereby helping in reinforcing the concepts learnt during the course. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava expressed appreciation for this endeavour of the English Department and stressed upon the importance of this course by pointing to the fact that in this era of social media, usage of internet slang has ruined linguistic skills. She added that this course gains even more significance in the light of the fact that good linguistic skills are of paramount importance in personal as well as professional life.

FDP on e-content begins at MCM



In view of the pandemic necessitating a switch to online teaching, the Department of Computer Science and Applications (DCSA) began a 5-day online Faculty Development Programme on 'e-Content: Designing and Deployment Using G Suite' in order to facilitate the faculty members to transition smoothly to the online mode of teaching. The objective of the programme is to empower the faculty with skills in utilising online teaching tools for effectively designing, developing, managing and delivering online lectures in this unprecedented situation. The resource persons for the programme include DCSA faculty Ms. Vandana Syal, Ms. Deepti Sharda, Ms. Navdeep Kaur, Ms. Deeksha Gupta and Dr. Ritika Bansal. The 5-day programme will focus on familiarising the participants with the tools available in G Suite and making them adept in using Google Classroom, Google Form as an assessment tool, Google Meet, Google Calendar, creation of lecture videos and generation of ecertificates. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava stated that bearing in mind the challenges posed by the pandemic in the field of education, it is essential that the teaching fraternity adapts to the new normal of online teaching by equipping itself with skills in online teaching, and asserted that this FDP is a step in this direction.

Workshops on painting and decorative items at MCM



Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised two different online workshops on painting and decorative items. A 6-day painting workshop titled 'Kala Abhivyakti- Manifesting Inner Artist' was organised by the Fine Arts Dept wherein the resource person Ms. Robina Singh taught the participants the nuances and techniques of painting on fabrics and bottles. During the course of the workshop, the participants were given complete insight into the subject through welldesigned interactive lectures and presentations by resource persons including Prof. Vijay Prabha, Department of Microbiology, PU, Dr.Jyoti, Dr.H.S Institute of Dental Sciences and Hospital, PU, Dr.Vandana Sharma and Dr.Sandeep Kaur, Food Science Dept of MCM.

Dr. Indu Arora, during the third lecture under the series, emphasized on the importance of entrepreneurship by illustrating stories of eminent entrepreneurs like Dhirubhai Ambani, Karsanbhai Patel, Ramesh Babu, Patricia Narayan, Narayan Murthy

and Dr.Verghese Kurien. The session accentuated on being an entrepreneur as it leads to self reliance, the path of realising the dream of Atmanirbhar Bharat. Ms. Disha Sharma, dwelt upon Intellectual Property Rights in the fourth lecture of the event. MCM organises virtual visit to the prestigious ATLAS at CERN



In a novel initiative to widen the horizons of students regarding particle accelerators, the Department of Physics of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised a virtual lab visit to the largest general purpose detector experiment- ATLAS (A Toroidal Large Hadron Collider Apparatus) at CERN, Geneva, Switzerland. More than 3000 scientists from 174 institutes in 38 countries work on the ATLAS experiment that basically provides unique experiences in

understanding the secrets of matter and exploring the mysteries of the universe. Dr. Muhammad Alhroob, Postdoctoral Fellow, University of Oklahoma, USA was the guide for the visit who very well explained the basic theories of particle physics like dark matter, standard model, muon spectrometer, Liquid Argon Calorimeter, etc. He virtually showed the laboratories, control centers and underground tunnels of LHC that are home to many experiments. Dr. Alhroob stepped into the most hidden corners of CMS and explained the enormity, complexity and incredible performance of the detector in layman's language. The visit was special as even without being physically present at CERN, participants were able to approach the detector closely and from different angles.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava expressed appreciation for this initiative of the Physics Department and said that this unique virtual visit to a world-class facility is highly significant as it exposes the students to the world of scientific progress and discovery in particle physics research, and to learn how science and technology work together for advancing our understanding of the universe.

MCM holds lecture on 'Women, Reason and Masculinity'



The Postgraduate Department of English of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women conducted an online lecture titled 'Women, Reason and Masculinity in the Era of the French Revolution'. Ms. Deeksha Bhardwaj, Journalist at Hindustan Times was the resource person. Ms. Bhardwaj explored the complex relationship between women and the masculine discourse of reason that pervaded the Enlightenment era leading up to and post the French Revolution. The speaker delved into how reason over emotions reinforced patriarchal constructs of masculinity over feminity. She focused particularly on the works of 18th century women writers, Mary Wollstonecraft and Mary Hays, and contrasted the approaches taken by both the authors towards the discourse of reason. The lecture was well received by students as well as faculty members.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava appreciated the initiative and underlined its importance by saying that such discourses act as a catalyst in the shaping of societal perceptions.

MCM holds National Webinar on Gender Equity during Pandemic

The Postgraduate Department of Sociology at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised a national webinar titled 'Gender Equity Matters in the Time of Pandemic Crisis: An Overview' here today. The webinar envisioned to deliberate upon gender as a social construct, particularly in the context of India and to make an attempt to understand how the pandemic crisis has affected women. Prof. R. Indira, Gender Expert, University of Mysore was the keynote speaker for the webinar and the resource persons were Dr. Bhawna Sood and Dr. Bindu Dogra, both Assistant Professors, PG Department of Sociology at the college. More than 110 participants from across the length and breadth of the country partook in this enlightening webinar.



In the inaugural address, Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava asserted that this webinar assumes great contemporary relevance in view of the fact that the pandemic has brought to fore the issue of gender equity once again as it has amplified and heightened inequalities prevalent in the society. Highlighting the huge gap between

theory and reality with regards to gender equity through examples of differentials in areas like sex ratio, employment, property inheritance, etc. Dr. Bhargava called for collective action in terms of finding ways and means of bringing about gender equity.



Delivering the keynote address, Prof. R. Indira highlighted the need for studying the impact of pandemic from the gender angle by asserting that the impact is differentially felt

by different people and to pave the way for a fair world, it is imperative to understand gender as a construct. Dr. Indira discussed at length the situations that women have encountered during the pandemic from different perspectives including economical, social, health, violence, etc. Stressing upon the need to approach the problems brought forth by the pandemic through a multidisciplinary framework, Dr. Indira proposed that to achieve equity, the civil society should proactively pitch in in rebuilding the lives of distressed women, building support structures for women and building the skills of women for becoming self-reliant financially. Dr. Bhawna Sood spoke on 'Crisis within a Crisis (Domestic Violence) wherein she pointed that gender equity is a fundamental right necessary for a peaceful, prosperous and sustainable world. She impressed upon the fact that sustainable development goals can only be achieved if the needs of women receive attention and are engaged in the implementation of Goal 5- not as beneficiaries but as agents of change. Dr. Bindu Dogra in her presentation titled 'Identifying Faceless Indian Migrant Women During COVID -19' focused on the dynamics of Indian migrant women and the specific risks they are facing during this pandemic. The webinar was well received by the participants who found all the sessions highly informative and enlightening.

Webinar on nutrition marks National Nutrition Week celebration at MCM



To mark National Nutrition Week, the NSS units of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised a highly relevant webinar on

'Nutrition & Immunity during COVID-19 times'. The webinar was held in association with Fortis Hospital, Mohali and the resource person for the same was Dt. MCM celebrates International Day for Preservation of Ozone Layer



To mark the upcoming International Day for Preservation of the Ozone Layer, Swachhta Committee (Arts) of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised an online talk on the topic 'Ozone

Layer: Importance, Depletion and Current Status'. Dr. Shafila Bansal, Department of Environment Science of the college delivered this enlightening talk that had more than 140 students in attendance. Beginning with an introduction to the ozone layer, its properties and types, Dr. Bansal went on to elaborate upon the importance of the ozone layer in protecting humans, animals and plants from the harmful effects of UV-B radiations that can cause skin cancers and sun burns, reduce immunity, cause mutations in plants, etc. The expert highlighted the fact that natural processes like volcanic eruptions, etc. are responsible for only 2% of the depletion of ozone while anthropogenic processes like fossil fuel burning, air conditioning, etc. have the most profound impact on the Earth's protective layer, and thus these need to be checked. Shedding light on the actions being taken to protect the ozone layer, Dr. Bansal educated the participants about the landmark agreement- Montreal Protocol to phase out CFCs and other ozone depleting substances. The talk was well received and the students also put forth their queries including the impact of ozone depletion during COVID times.

Hindi Diwas celebrated at MCM



The Postgraduate Department of Hindi at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised an online discussion on the topic 'Contribution of Hindi in Nation's Development' to mark Hindi Diwas here today. With the aim of reflecting upon the current state of the Indian economy and deliberating upon the challenges lying ahead. the Postgraduate Department of Economics at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised a highly relevant webinar on the topic 'Indian Economy- Challenges Ahead'. Mr. Sarvesh Kaushal, IAS, Former Chief Secretary, Government of Punjab graced the webinar as the Chief Guest and Prof. J.S. Bedi, Professor of Economics, IDC, Chandigarh was the Guest of Honour. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava inaugurated the webinar by welcoming the

distinguished guests and participants from across the country numbering upto 600. In her inaugural address, Dr. Bhargava impressed that the slowdown which the Indian economy was already witnessing due to diverse factors has been augmented by the outbreak of COVID-19. Sharing Mohammed Iqbal's words 'kuch baat hai ki hasti mit-ti nahi hamari', Dr. Bhargava asserted that the Indian economy has always shown resilience and versatility and it will rise like a phoenix from this unforeseen challenge as well.



In his engrossing and comprehensive discourse, Mr. Sarvesh Kaushal outlined the prospect of India-China standoff spilling into the economic realm, COVID-19, building a robust healthcare infrastructure, reforms in financial governance, generation of demand, converting population into a strength, leapfrogging in the area of innovation, agriculture and environment as the challenges before the Indian economy. Discussing the economic disruption brought about by COVID-19, Mr. Kaushal highlighted that the pandemic has primarily hit India through the health sector as the investment in preventive measures and state's allocation of funds to healthcare is highly undervalued. Discussing at length issues like the increase in deficit, the problem of unemployment and underemployment, burdening of government with liabilities, leakages in public spending, non performing assets, profound challenge of shift from primary to secondary and tertiary sector, Mr. Kaushal asserted that re-engineering of business processes, move towards 'Atmanirbhar Bharat', improving health of banking sector, generation of demand, promoting MSMEs, making strides in innovation and research hold the key to



economic resurgence of India. Mr. Kaushal added that indeed COVID-19 has put Indian economy in a tailspin but there is a ray of hope in the form of a decisive and resolute leadership combined with the tenacity of Indian population to stand up to the challenge. Using the example of manufacturing of indigenous ventilators, Mr. Kaushal remarked that Indian economy has the potential of transforming a global challenge into an opportunity. In his enlightening address Prof. J.S. Bedi eloquently quantified the past challenges being faced by the Indian economy. Quoting CMIE database, Prof. Bedi said that COVID-19 has severely deteriorated the employment prospects and has led to grave reduction of incomes of the people, migrants in particular. Prof. Bedi added that such severe and deep-rooted problems will prove to be an enormous challenge for the Indian economy to overcome in the future course of time. Advising that India needs to develop sectors where it has competitive advantage, Prof. Bedi concluded on an optimistic note that innovative development works are to be readily required to generate industrious employment opportunities.

7-day online workshop on GST commences at MCM

Shedding light on operationalisation strategies and the relevant issues, Prof. Srinivas impressed upon the need to embrace change in order to remain relevant as technology of online education and all digital initiatives have possibilities to revolutionise higher education.

Dr. Dalip Kumar said that in the changing global scenario technology will be pivotal to ensuring equity, access and quality in higher education. He further stated that technological intervention has helped to cope with the disruption in academics brought



about by COVID and stressed upon the need to strengthen the structure further for meeting unforeseen challenges. Advocating the integration of online learning, digital education and technology, Dr. Kumar highlighted the role of HRDC and NIEPA in laying out the module for developing resources and infrastructure for online education.
