The expert handled the queries of the students who found it an enriching experience as they gained knowledge about a crucial aspect of their health.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava informed that keeping in mind that the awareness about women health issues is still negligible despite the fact that women find themselves engulfed in the quagmire of health issues with PCOS being a major one, this webinar seeks to raise awareness about PCOS and to educate the students so as to enable them to manage their health in a better manner.



MCM DAV concludes eight-week Translation Skill Course with National Translation Mission, Gol



Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, a registered training center under Chandigarh Skill Development Mission (CSDM), concluded the 8-week online translation course- 'Beyond Boundaries: Creating a World of Understanding' in collaboration with the National Translation Mission (NTM), Centre for Indian Languages, Ministry of Education, Government of India.

Organized under the aegis of the Skill Development Committee of the college, the course sought to equip the participants with translation skills required in the flourishing multilingual world of literature, cinema, theatre, anchoring, print and social media. The valedictory session of the course was graced by Mr. Tariq Khan, Officer-in-Charge, NTM as Guest of Honour and distinguished translator Prof. Rana Nayar as the resource person.

Speaking at the event, Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava informed that the programme was designed to stimulate the growth of the nation by empowering the stakeholders with requisite skills so as to enable them to be job providers. She added that the course was in sync with MCM's vision of creating employment avenues through skill development and it also incorporates the ethos of the New Education Policy 2020 that emphasizes teaching and learning of Indian languages to be integrated with school and higher education at every level.

Prof. Tariq Khan underlined the need for such courses and their growing significance in the present scenario. Speaking about the immense potential in the field of translation, Prof. Rana Nayar motivated the participants to make good use of the skills learnt during this course. The course was navigated by eminent resource persons from the practical and theoretical field of translation. 60 participants from across the country, ranging from Jammu to Tamil Nadu and Goa to West Bengal, benefitted from the course. The participants were also awarded certificates.



Webinar on "Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Challenges in Youth"



The Geetanjali Counselling Helpline at MCM DAV College for Women, Chandigarh organized a webinar on the theme "Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Challenges in Youth" to mark the dual celebration of the World Mental Health Day (WHO) and International Day of the Girl Child (UNICEF). The keynote address was delivered by an eminent clinical psychologist Dr Adarsh Kohli, Professor, Department of Psychiatry, PGIMER, Chandigarh. The theme for World Mental Health Day this year is "Mental Health for All. Greater Investment – Greater Access". The event was enthusiastically attended by 126 UG and PG students. As we navigate our way through the unprecedented impact of the current global health emergency COVID-19 pandemic, we have a collective responsibility to keep the well-being of youth at the forefront. Suicide is the leading cause of death among India's youth aged 10-24 years, among the highest globally and more than one lakh lives are lost every year to suicide in our country. Dr Adarsh Kohli reflected on the prevalence of suicide across all age groups, education and professions as reported by NCRB 2019 and the various mental disorders such as depression, anxiety,

substance abuse, PTSD, impulsivity, family pathology, sexual abuse, etc which occupy a premier position in the matrix of causation of suicide. She elucidated upon the specific causes, risk factors predisposing adolescents to suicide and protective factors as evidenced with relevant medical research. She discussed the concept of psychological autopsy in suicide through case studies, stigma associated with suicide attempts, recognizing the red flags and early symptom identification among youth. She elaborated on stress management strategies and constructive coping skills encompassing appraisal focused, problem focused and emotion focused strategies among youth. She emphasized a multidimensional approach to suicide prevention through community based programmes. The resource person addressed all the mental health queries of our students in the interactive session later and encouraged reaching out to reliable mental health professionals for treatment. We received brilliant feedback about the enlightening session and the insightful learning experience from all the participants. Principal Dr Nisha Bhargava appreciated the work of the Geetanjali Counselling Helpline Committee in creating mental health literacy on such a pertinent topic among the college students creating symptom identification in themselves, in peers and fighting the stigma associated with help seeking behaviour.

NCC Naval Wing at MCM holds webinar on NEP

MCM holds brainstorming session on National Innovation and Start Up Policy



Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised a brainstorming session on National Innovation and Start Up Policy (NISP) under the aegis of its Start Up Cell. The session envisioned to list policy level issues and to undertake a SWOT analysis of the innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem at the higher education institutions' level. The panel of experts who shared their valuable insights about promoting entrepreneurship culture and practices, and overcoming bottlenecks in this field included Prof. Suresh K. Chadha, (Professor & Chairman University Business School, Panjab University, Chandigarh), Dr. Amandeep Singh Marwaha (Training-cum- Placement Officer, University Institute of Applied Management Sciences, Panjab University, Chandigarh), Prof. Deepti Gupta (Chairperson, Department of English and Cultural Studies, Panjab University), Mr. Dinesh Dua (CEO, Nectar Lifesciences Ltd.), Mr. Sidhant Banura (Director, Ashvamegha Solutions), Mr. Pawan Kamra (MD, Nutraceutex), Mr. Balvir Kumar (Director, Simer Biotech), Ms. Deepti Goyal (Clinical Dietician, Tricity Diet and Wellness Clinique), Ms. Shivanshi Vashisht (BIRAC Innovation Fellow, Cluster Innovation Centre in Biotechnology), Mr. Vikram Dhawan (123 Startup Ventures Founder), Dr. Swati

Dhawan (123 Startup Ventures Co-founder), Dr. Preeti Vohra (Behavioral Counselor and Motivational Speaker, Wellbeing Counselling), and Amanjot Kaur (Director, Innovative Financial Management) gave their valuable insights. Welcoming the experts, Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava asserted that their meaningful observations, ideas and plans will be instrumental in drafting policies regarding the promotion of innovation and start-ups at the institution. Highlighting the fact that the job market has shrunk during the pandemic, Dr. Bhargava said that entrepreneurship has direct and positive impact on economic development of a country and thus, the college has undertaken this initiative to promote the culture of innovation and entrepreneurship. Prof. Suresh K. Chadha impressed upon the instrumental role of parental support and exposure at the college level in promoting entrepreneurial aptitude among students. Dr. Amandeep Singh Marwaha contributed to the discussion by endorsing the role of mentorship so that students receive proper guidance and timeline within which to work so as to enable them to execute their plan of action effectively. Prof. Deepti Gupta highlighted the role of awareness generation sessions among students regarding start-ups, including sharing of success stories of entrepreneurs. Mr. Sidhant Banura emphasized on the need of polishing soft skills of the students apart from strengthening their domain expertise. Dr. Swati Dhawan highlighted the role of capstone projects, counselling and promoting industry readiness in students. Mr. Vikram Dhawan pointed out that besides the perspective of students, it is imperative to understand the psychology of parents, and point of view of entrepreneurs and start-ups. He also enunciated the lack of industry readiness of the students which should be taken up seriously by the stakeholders. Ms. Amanjot Kaur added another dimension to the discussion when she mentioned that students who are ideagenerators and willing to execute the same should be given extra credits in academics to motivate them. Ms. Shivanshi Vashisht emphasized that students need to be patient while going for startup as success in first instance is not guaranteed. The session ended on a promising note of encouraging students to be innovative and develop a spirit of entrepreneurship in them.

MCM holds workshop on Floriculture for Entrepreneurship Development

In an endeavour to promote entrepreneurial aptitude of students in the flourishing field of floriculture, the Department of Botany, Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organised a one-day Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) sponsored online workshop on 'Floriculture for Entrepreneurship Development'. The aim of the workshop was to generate awareness among students about the bright prospects this promising industry possesses and to motivate them to be employment generators. The resource person for the workshop was Dr. Puja Sharma, Associate Professor cum Scientist, Department of Floriculture and Landscape Architecture, Dr. Y.S. Parmar University of Horticulture and Forestry, Nauni, Solan. 101 participants including students and faculty members took part in the workshop.

Dr. Nisha Bhargava, Principal of the college appreciated this initiative to sow the seeds of entrepreneurial spirit and encouraged the students to take up skill development courses such as add-on course in Floriculture and Landscaping which is being run by the college. Stressing upon the relevance of such workshops in furthering the idea of 'Atmanirbhar Bharat', Dr. Bhargava said that floriculture is a fast developing industry that holds immense potential to provide employment to millions of people, both skilled and unskilled.







Dr. Puja Sharma gave an enlightening talk on different aspects of floriculture. She explained how both landless people and the ones with large land holdings can avail the different opportunities provided by this field. Besides providing an insight into the cut flower cultivation industry,

Dr. Sharma also discussed about the other related fields like seed production, loose flower industry, of setting up green houses. propagation of greens, decoration and garland industry, dry flower industry, pot and basket making industry.

Dr. Puja also provided interesting information on certain by-products such as the xanthophyll extract from the marigold flower which is being fed to the chicks for developing colour of the yolk. RUSA Institutional Coordinator at MCM Mrs. Neena Sharma expressed gratitude to the expert for enlightening the students

about the opportunities in this sunrise industry.
