

7 day Bridge Course 'Learn Basics of English' July 18 to 24, 2020




A 7 day bridge course on 'Learn Basics of English' was organized by the Postgraduate department of English by Dr Apara Sharma and Ms Ruchika Singh, Assistant Professors in the Department of English of the college. The course was conducted from July 18 to 24, 2020.

The course was aimed at understanding and applying the basic skills of English Language in day to day life. The resource persons introduced the basics of phonetics and pronunciation to the students and also made the students understand the basic concepts of grammar which form the building blocks of any language. The course was also timed with the lockdown

during the Covid-19 pandemic so as to keep the students constructively engaged.

Participants from all walks of life registered for the 'Basic Course in English'; students, professionals, homemakers and many others who simply wanted to brush up the basic



skills of English language. The modules covered rules relating to tenses, subject verb agreement, speaking skills, writing skills, listening skills and basic pronunciation. The sessions were followed by online tests and PowerPoint presentations of the respective topic were shared with the participants. The sessions were made interactive by permitting the participants to interact during the last fifteen minutes of each session.

10 day Bridge Course 'Advanced Course in English' July 26 to August 4, 2020



A 10 day 'Advanced Course in English' was organized by the Postgraduate department of English by Dr Apara Sharma and Ms Ruchika Singh, Assistant Professors in the Department of English of the college. The course was conducted from July 26 to August 4, 2020.

Some of the primary objectives of the course were to understand and apply the rules of advanced grammar in English; to prepare the participants to apply for a job right from writing a Resume to facing an interview as well as to keep the students constructively engaged during the lockdown.

The ten day 'Advanced Course in English' covered topics like rules for transformation of sentences, narration, writing applications, writing Resume, facing interviews and other related skills. Participants who registered for the Course included women who wanted to upgrade their language skills and also wanted to prepare themselves to enter the professional world. Sessions included online lectures, tests and PowerPoint presentations based on the day's session. The resource persons tried to make the grammar topics easy to



Online Lecture on 'Women, Reason and Masculinity in the era of the French Revolution' *August 28, 2020*

The Postgraduate department of English conducted an online lecture on 'Women, Reason and Masculinity in the era of the French Revolution' on August 28, 2020.



The resource person for the lecture was Ms Deeksha Bhardwaj who is presently a journalist with Hindustan Times and covers governance, politics and policy. A graduate in literature from LSR, Delhi, she is currently pursuing her MPhil from Delhi University and has worked extensively in the realm of literary theory.

lecture Her explored complex the relationship between women and masculine discourse of reason that pervaded the Enlightenment era leading up to and post the French Revolution. The speaker explored how emotions reason over



reinforced patriarchal constructs of masculinity over femininity. She focussed particularly on the works of 18th century women writers, Mary Wollstonecraft and Mary Hays, and contrasted the approaches taken by both the authors towards this discourse of reason. Locating them in specific cultural milieus and the spaces both the women inhabit, the lecture tried to re-evaluate the existing, rigid idea of 'reason.'

The speaker tried to reevaluate definitions (as in the passion/reason debate) to allow women the space to be able to articulate their thoughts and anxieties more freely. The lecture was well received by the students as well as by the teachers.

A 5-Day Online International Workshop on: "Breaking the Stereotypes: A Paradigm Shift in Gender Studies" was jointly organized under the aegis of Post Graduate Departments of Sociology and English. workshop was organized from November 2 – 6, 2020 on Google Meet. The Co-conveners of the workshop were Ms Kamini Tyal and Ms Neena Sharma. The Coordinators of the workshop were Pallavi Kapila and Urvi Sharma, Assistant Professors in Department of Sociology and English, respectively.

Professor Elisabetta Marino, Associate Professor of English Literature at the University of Rome, Italy was one of the resource persons who spoke on "The Woman Question at the end of 19th century: The British and the American Context". As a renowned scholar of American and British Literature, she used intertextual references to examine the intersection of gender relations with sexuality, race, class, religion and culture. By focusing on the terms like "good wife", "selfless mother"; she delved into how the emancipation came with the realisation of a feminist awakening for women in the nineteenth century.

Professor Aparna Rayaprol, Former HOD and Associate Professor of Sociology at the University of Hyderabad, India was the other resource person who spoke on "Understanding Migration and Gender in Contemporary Times". With proficiency in the area of diaspora and gender, she discussed the gender inequality, wage discrimination and pay inequities using her expertise in the area. Her talk concentrated on the migration of poor and marginalized women for work, with a special focus on how the upending times of pandemic have affected them and their sources of income.

Captain Keatings, MCM Book and Movies Club 'Discussion on the Cinema of Wong-Kar Wai' November 20, 2020




The Book and Movies club of the College held a discussion on the Cinema of Wong-Kar Wai on November 20, 2020. The participants of the Club were asked to watch Wong-Kar Wai's movies for the discussion. discussion started with introduction of cinema followed by a discussion on various types of cinema like escapist cinema. The problematic nature of the Indian movie industry which has often been criticised for creating unrealistic content was also discussed. The discussion continued with the members of the club sharing their views on how Bollywood had witnessed many eras of particular heroes with specific genres of movies entitled to them. The meeting was initiated with a general discussion on how everyone copes with stress personally. The answers were vibrant

An interesting activity was conducted wherein the participants expressed what fictional characters they associated with the most, why and how. They also shared how knowingly or unknowingly they had imbibed the traits of these fictional/non-fictional characters in their real life.

Even though this discussion was not the conventional, meditative method of putting one's worries to rest but the interactive and light-hearted conversation brought mirth to many.


Online Training Workshop on 'Information Disorder and Media Literacy: Fighting or Fake Fighting' December 19, 2020


Interactive session on "Writing the I" by Ms Pia Bakshi 23 December 2020

The Mavericks Club of the PG Department of English organised a meeting on Vishal Bharadwaj's trilogy of film adaptations based on William Shakespeare's tragedies, namely Maqbool (2003), based on Macbeth; Omkara (2006), picturised on Othello and Haider cinematised on Hamlet. The participants of the group had been asked to watch the movies and acquaint themselves with the plays. The links for the movies had been shared in the groups. The similarities between Shakespeare and Vishal Bharadwaj's storytelling and depiction were shared by Dr Komil Tyagi with the participants by the faculty members. The opuses of the two respective creators have something for everyone

irrespective of their class. This is at least partly due to the universality of human experience and emotion impeccably shown in these works. Dr Komil Tyagi also pointed out how both the maestros have powerful monologues in their oeuvres. She also shared little trivia about Shakespeare's life and the British Theatre of the time.

The students shared their insights about these movies and their characters. Through the course of the discussion some students had pointed out that Bharadwaj uses a lot of the dark/cold palette in his movies. Some also noted a lot of green in the movies. The participants added that the music and lyrics



were a major highlight of Vishal Bharadwaj's works. The discussion was drawn to an end with the organisers taking suggestions from the participants on future activities of the club. The session had seen an enthusiastic participation from the attendees. This was partly the reason that the session stretched for 20 minutes more than had been planned. The meeting was held via Google Classroom and had 23 attendees.

RUSA Sponsored Online Workshop-cum-Awareness-Programme 'Ethics and Plagiarism' January 7, 2021





Prof. Deepti Gupta, Chairperson, Department of English and Cultural Studies, Panjab University, Chandigarh the resource person for the witnessed programme that an overwhelming response of more than 1619 participants from 11 countries and 28 Indian states and UTs. informative session. Prof. Gupta highlighted the significance of maintaining high ethical standards while

writing research papers and theses. Drawing from her vast experience as a research supervisor, she narrated incidents of gross plagiarism which marred the career of researchers. She apprised the participants about various types of plagiarism in practice including cyber plagiarism and delf-plagiarism. Prof. Gupta gave a hands-on exercise to the participants to demonstrate the art of acknowledging other writers' ideas.

Principal Dr Nisha Bhargava appreciated the efforts of RUSA and the Department of English for undertaking this academic initiative and highlighted the fact that ethical practices must be followed in order to maintain the sanctity of research in this age of information and technology.



The Book and Movie Club, Mavericks Presents Online Discussion on 'The Vagina Monologues' January 20, 2021



The Mavericks Club organised a discussion on Eve Ensler's The Vagina *Monologues*. It is a "revolutionary play which continues to empower women around the world by normalising their body, by giving them agency, by speaking out about insecurities and injustices which they might not dare voice in real life."(Amrita Paul, 2019). discussion began with members sharing their favourite parts from the book. Taking instances from the play, "They beat the girl out of my boy... or so they tried", a discussion was initiated on human fear and

discomfort associated with the unknown. The discussion elaborated on the subconscious need of validation ingrained in an individual's psyche. It focused on the idea of conforming to the social conventions in order to seek comfort in day-to-day life. The participants agreed on the urgent need of unlearning the irrational thoughts and ideas prevalent in the society to generate better social relations which can only be achieved through acceptance of diversity and freedom of an individual.


The conversation proceeded with another influential idea from the play 'Reclaiming Cunt' especially because of the language used in the section. The discussion swiftly switched to the concept of 'virginity' how it became a tool to subjugate women? The commodification of women was also elaborated on. It stressed on how the pronoun 'her' is reduced to be an extension of him. The participants alsospecified the problematic representation of sexual violence against women in films and media than the open representation of female sexual pleasure. For instance, a film 'Lipstick Under My Burkha' was denied certification solely because it was a film about female sexual needs.

During the course of the discussion, some of the issues touched upon were:

- Romanticism of love and its problems
- Violence against women during the time of war as a method of revenge.
- Mutilation of female genitals as a mode of exercising control over women's bodies and their subjugation. (based on 'Not So Happy fact' section of the Vagina Monologues)


There were thought provoking and deeply moving discussions on the personal experiences of participants regarding the change in their body during adolescent age which was followed by stories of acceptance. An elaborate discussion was conducted

about the judicial system and its treatment of rape cases like the Bhanwari Devi case, Mathura rape case, and the more recent Hathrascase. The meeting concluded with a discussion on intersectionality in feminism with special focus on caste system in India. It



was deduced that women need to stop romanticising their physical pain suffered during child birth and menstruation.


RUSA-Sponsored Online Awareness Programme on 'Literary Movements and Periodization: Negotiating Challenges' February 12, 2021
