It was an illuminating and enriching experience for the participants as it enabled them to reflect on complementarity of sociology and its intricate concepts. It emphasized on the need to comprehend the sociological theories while living in the extraordinary times of Covid-19 at present. "It was an extremely invigorating course", said Anita who was one of the participants. The pandemic has made the education institutes worldwide to come up with varied ways to keep learners engaged. This was a unique initiative under the guidance of Dr. Nisha Bhargava, Principal of the college.

3. Bridge Course for Beginners in Research

Bridge Course for Beginners in Research was held under the aegis of PG Department of Sociology from 4th August to 18th August 2020. The course offered a development of understanding of basic concepts of research, writing a research proposal, data collection tools, statistical analysis of findings, and use of computer to facilitate research. Dr Minakshi Rana, Dr Neeraj Kumar, Deputy Librarian, Panjab University, Ms Pallavi Kapila and Ms Shabnam were the **resource persons. A total of 66 numbers of participants registered for the course.**

Reflective thinking is critical for pursuing research in any discipline. Research is all about adopting scientific method to arrive at conclusion and derive findings that can be applied universally. Identification of a problem considering the feasibility of the topic, a sound theoretical framework, review of existing and related literature are the initial and significant steps to start with writing a research paper/proposal. The significance of pursuing the selected topic and the objectives the study is aspiring to achieve should be precisely mentioned. The tools of data collection and techniques of data analysis must be carefully selected to suit the objectives of the study. In case of using secondary data, the source of data must be authentic otherwise it may harm the whole purpose of investigation.

The basic characteristics and assumptions of various statistical measures like measures of central tendency, measures of dispersion and coefficient of correlation that can be applied in data to arrive at conclusions were briefly explained to participants. Further, the use of MS Word, Excel and PowerPoint in developing a research paper or writing a thesis was explained with the help of live demonstration. In a significant session on plagiarism check and citation style, the various free online software like Citation Machine, Plagcheck were shared with the participants that can help in checking the percentage of copied text in the research paper. Further, with help of online tools like Mendeley and Citation machine, the researcher can download the citation of the desired research work in the required format.

An assessment consisting multiple choice questions based on the taught topics was also taken to gauge the understanding of the topics among the participants. A recapitulation of all the topics covered in the bridge course was done in the concluding session.

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4. Data Analysis - 5-day Series

5-day Series on Data Analysis was held under the aegis of PG Department of Sociology **from 27th** August to 31st August 2020. Quality research can contribute significantly towards development of a nation through various inventions and innovations. Considering the present scenario where the human kind is facing new challenges often, relevant and practical research has become more significant find feasible solutions. The 5-day Series aimed to provide knowledge about various statistical as well as non-statistical tools to analyze and interpret data so that valid generalizations can be drawn. Dr. Bhavna Sood and Dr. Minakshi Rana were the resource persons. A total of 47 (Students, research scholars, faculty and professionals from all around the India (Faculty and research scholars from prestigious institutions like PGIMER, Chandigarh, Institution of Production Management, Kansbahal, College of Community Science (PJTSAU), Hyderabad (TS) Central University of Kerala, College of Applied Sciences, Salalah (Oman), Department of Social Work, Canada.

Sound analysis of data lay foundation to authentic research. Thus, before planning a research, researcher has to know how to handle and analyze the data so that data collection tools can be designed accordingly. The various sessions of the data analysis series were based on identifying variables, formulation of hypothesis, Parametric and Non-parametric tests and analysis of qualitative data so that the aspiring researchers would be able take

well informed decision for the handling, collection as well as analysis of data. All the sessions were facilitated with live demonstration and a practice sheet. Besides the knowledge of various statistical as well as non-statistical tests and measures, the use of Mendeley Software to generate references and few online plagiarism check software was also discussed in the sessions.

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5. One Day National Webinar on Gender Equality Matters in the Time of Pandemic Crisis: An Overview

One Day National Webinar on Gender Equality Matters in the Time of Pandemic Crisis: An Overview was held on 04th September 2020.

The COVID-19 crisis has thrown these gender-based differences into even sharper relief. To address these and similar challenges **One Day National Webinar** titled: *Gender Equality Matters in the time of Pandemic Crisis: An Overview*" was organised by the Post Graduate Department of Sociology, Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh on 4th September, 2020. The keynote speaker of the event was Prof Indira Ramarao, Mysore University. The Webinar was coordinated by Ms. Pallavi Kapila and 127 participants from across the country joined the Session.

The session was opened by esteemed Principal Dr Nisha Bhargava. Madam Principal began with the concept of gender equality and its importance in the time of pandemic. Despite the capacity of women to multitasking, endurance women are still referred to as weaker sex in society, especially in developing Countries like India. The patriarchal societies have refused to accept the fundamental fact. Throwing light on this issue, Dr. Bhargava illustrated the gender disparity in terms of low sex ratio, wage differentials, areas of employment, area of right to property as well as in participation of women in political sphere. Also, the work of women remains largely hidden in household scenario. This crisis has thereby increased in the pandemic situation. The proceedings were continued by Head of department, Ms. Kamini Tayal. Ms. Tayal introduced the College and achievements of the department. Further, she highlighted the role of gender parity in context to the contribution of students in terms of their responsibility towards society as well as humanity. The *Keynote Speaker, Professor Indira*'s lecture was divided into

two major parts, i.e. How the pandemic has affected society, particularly women; and How this social crisis can be dealt with the use of social networking. The Resource Persons for second session were Dr. Bhavna Sood and Dr. Bindu Dogra. Dr Bindu Dogra presented on the topic "Identifying Faceless Indian Migrant women during COVID 19" The Webinar was further continued by Dr. Bhavna Sood. 
2. <u>Three Day Lecture series on Issues related to Development'</u>

A three day *Lecture series* titled 'Issues related to Development' was organised by Post Graduate Department of Sociology under aegis of Rastriya Uchchtar Siksha Abhiyan (RUSA), MCM DAV College For Women from 23rd February to 25th February 2021. The resource person for the Lectures was eminent sociologist Prof S.L. Sharma, Director (Research) IDC, Chandigarh.

Day 1: 23rd February 2021: Rethinking Development post Pandemic was title of the first day lecture. The Lecture was introduced by RUSA Coordinator of the College, Dr Neena Sharma. She opened the event the argument with appreciation for the topical issue of development and related debates.

Dr SL Sharma began his lecture with the argument that theme of development is of perpetual importance. But pandemic has challenged several positions related to development. Under the current scenario he focussed on three issues: understanding development and related critique of development; impact of COVID on development and rethinking development as a paradigm.

According to Dr Sharma, pandemic has affected and is going to affect economy, public health, education and has shattered the life world at global level. As a sociologist, he questioned both economic centric and ecological sustainable models of development reiterating a need for development model supporting social structural transformation. Social harmony can be ensured only when issues related to social order is addressed.




Day 2: 24th February 2021: Gender and Development was theme of lecture on the second day. The second day started with observation by honourable Principle Dr Nisha Bhargawa. Dr Bhargava contended that the current development model has failed to benefit women as several human rights are not even available to them. Women are way behind in all dimensions of society and unbalanced sex ratio of India is evidence of that.

Dr SL Sharma's lecture raised three issues related to women and development: Do women find place in development discourse, if not then why and what could be the resolution to the problem. He presented theoretical discourse of feminist scholars like gender justice perspective and gender empowerment perspective that have dwelled on the above questions. Patriarchy manifests itself in forms of sex based division of labour, sexual servility and power structure in terms of decision making. He suggested that in politics, statist, in economy capitalism and in society patriarchy are three structures that needed to be questioned to usher equality of genders.



Day 3: 25th February 2021: Day three of the lecture dwelled on the contemporary theories of development- neo liberalist and statist. Both the theories suffer from lacuna and emphasize on developmental model that neglected human development. The development model that has been followed has been myopic and led to social degradation and value decadence in society. The development has in fact led to more poverty, disparity and inequality at intranational and international levels. The growing prosperity is of classes and the large masses still remain impoverished. This model of development is yet to find answer.

Dr Sharma concluded that we need a development which has to be human-centric and humane. The series ended with vote of thanks by Dr Bhavna Sood. She thanked Dr Sharma for raising pertinent questions and important dimensions of development in the time of pandemic.



3. 
4. <u>Preparing UGC NET 2021</u>



1. The session began with Suman Bizla who gave a presentation by highlighting the following points in the workshop of NTA UGC NET held by the Department of Sociology Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh:

- strategy I followed to crack NTA UGC NET
- Time management
- Sources
- Pattern of exam

2. Sylvish on the other hand discussed the syllabus of Paper-1 of NTA UGC NET exam were discussed. The sources that she followed for paper 1 and Paper-2 were also discussed. Main focus of her discussion was her preparation strategy. Understanding the topics mentioned in the syllabus is crucial in cracking any examination. Analysing past year questions is of utmost importance so that preparation can be done along the lines of the exam. Certain concepts asked are also repetitive. Note making can also be done for easy revision in the proximity of exams. To know the gist of the exam (the exam is going to be online),mock tests available at the NTA website can also be practiced. There are many materials online which students can effectively utilise for their preparation. Ignou study materials for both BA and MA are very good. Mock test for Paper 1 is available on an app called Grade Up. Daily quizzes are also given which can be practised on a regular basis. The session was attended by 34 students and 8 faculty members.



The resource person of the event was Professor Priya Sepaha, Founder and Director of a Start-up 'Law Colloquy". The webinar was coordinated by Dr.Bindu Dogra, Dr. Ramandeep Kaur and Dr. Gurjeet Virk Sidhu. The Webinar was attended by more than 50 participants.


The session was opened by Dr. Bhavna Sood, Head, Post Graduate Department of Sociology who highlighted the achievements of the college and the department. Dr.Bindu Dogra introduced and welcomed Prof. (Dr).Priya Sepaha and also highlighted the theme of the webinar and its relevance to Global Denim Day.

Prof. Sepaha introduced that our Indian legal system has provided many rights and special laws to protect women and keep on amending such laws from time to time. Prof. Priya began her lecture and mentioned that it was very evident and pertinent to remember the Nirbhaya Case i.e. a brutal gang rape case which was held in the year 2013 and after that various amendments has been made in the Indian legal system and especially in India Penal code for women. Some of the provisions for the women in criminal law have been made specifically for her and which every woman should know. She defined and explained the significant provisions for women specifically in criminal law which protect women in India like Stalking, voyeurism, Word, gesture or act intended to insult the modesty of a women, Acid attacks, Sexual harassment of women at workplace etc. Prof Sepaha elaborated offline and online category of offences with special reference to sexual harassment of women at workplace. She provided valuable information regarding the punishments; penalties or fines relevant in the respective provisions as well guided the right directions to be adopted during the proceeding with regard to these provisions.

Prof. Sepaha concluded her lecture by suggesting that in this modern era of life it is a really a need of hour to be aware about these special provisions as these were generally made to prevent and protect women in India. Her informative and interesting presentation kept the participants attentive.

At last, the webinar concluded by Dr. Gurjeet Virk Sidhu thanking the college Principal madam, resource person, faculty members as well as students for making this webinar successful. The webinar was attended by faculty members of the department as well as more than fifty students.





6. The department organized a session on "Critical Citizenship- Earning and Learning Sensibly: A workshop cum Awareness Program" in collaboration with the Character Building Committee on 7th May, 2021

The Resource Person for the session was Dr Vinod Chaudhary from the Department of Sociology, Panjab University, Chandigarh. He is a naturalist and worked on several national and international work fronts to promote working and studying while staying close to nature. The participants were encouraged to develop an amalgamation of civic sense with scientific aptitude through the webinar. Prof. Vinod mentioned how the cultivation of some ecofriendly plants like bamboos, hemp and vitrati grass can help not only re-storing the ecological balance but also offers lucrative earning opportunities. Dr Nisha Bhargava, principal said that the theme of critical citizenship has profound contemporary relevance because the present lifestyles and living mechanisms have by passed sustainable development. Humans are busy in a mindless plunder of natural resources without bothering about their conservation and rejuvenation. The human beings have created forests of concrete and contaminating air, land and water resources. In the process we are damaging our precious lifelines. At such a time, it becomes even more relevant to organize this workshop. She appreciated this initiative and further mentioned that the college is continuously working for the betterment of the society. 7. Two-day Lecture Series on" Sociology for India" by Prof B.K.Nagla



The resource person for the Lecture series was Prof BK Nagla. Several deliberations were made by Prof Nagla. The event was appreciated by the Principal Dr Nisha Bhargava as apt for the time and excellent for the students.


Day 1: 1st June 2021: Emergence and Development of Sociology In India

The event started with Dr Bhavna Sood, Head of the Department, introducing of the College and highlighting the achievements of the department. The welcome note was delivered by Dr Bindu Dogra. Prof Nagla began his lecture with tracing of development of Sociology in different phases: from ancient Indian texts like Vedas, Puranas, Smritis, the colonial discourse and Indological studies to the post-independence evolution through the contributions of sociologists like GS Ghurye, Radha Kamal Mukherjee, DP Mukherjee, MN Srinivas and Yogendra Singh. He also explained important sociological concepts like Sanskritisation, Westernisation and dominant caste that have been useful epistemological tools for sociology. He also discussed several inter-disciplinary influences on the emergence of sociology as an independent academic discipline in India.

Brief summary of development of sociology department in various parts of the country was also given.

Prof Nagla was critical of Indian sociologists for neglecting pathological issues and focussing only on convenient themes in their studies. He called for supporting academic honesty by the sociologists rather than on self-interest.






Day 2: 2nd June 2021: Sociology for India

On the second day Prof Nagla explained colonial and administrative perspectives and evolutionary approach shaped the cognitive and paradigmatic themes of Indian sociology. The reformative rationality has been largely informed by the Western Sociology. He highlighted absence of any general theory development in Indian Sociology and slow professionalization of sociology in India. The village studies according to him largely were structural and functional in 1960s-70s and dialectical in 1970s onwards, clearly showed the popular thought of the times. Prof. Nagla pointed out towards need to update our courses and syllabi as per the current context. In the era of specialisation, Sociology in India has been somewhat unable to cope. Through updated research and teaching only contextualised

discipline can be called Sociology for India. There is also need to overcome colonial ideology and go for Indenisation of Sociology.


The event saw enthusiastic participation by students, faculty members as well as outside participants. The event ended with formal vote of thanks by Dr Ketaki Dwivedi.




8. Orientation Program, 30th September, 2021

9. An international discourse on Sociology of Health by Professor Allen Furr on 5th October, 2021

The PG department of Sociology organised an international discourse on Sociology of Health with special reference to work-life balance challenges for women in the era of digitalization 0n 5th October, 2021.. Allen Furr, Professor Emeritus in Sociology, Auburn University, USA was the resource person. Prof Furr is the Emeritus Professor of Sociology in Auburn University. He did his Ph D from the State University of Louisiana in 1986 and thereafter remained faculty and taught medical sociology in top American Universities. Besides, being

the faculty, he also chaired the Department of Sociology in University of Lousville from 2004-2010 and then in Auburn University from 2010-16.

Prof Allen mentioned that digitization the application of technology to disseminate information. In the era of globalization, almost all fields of work have adopted digital mode even during the pandemic of COVID-19, educational institutions were compelled to use online mode of teaching and learning. He furthered mentioned that, work-life balance indicates how effectively one can manage all the domains of work without any personal and emotional stress. The digital world has put extreme pressure of performance and availability on the workforce. In our society, women's self-identity is more related to household work and care of family members and due to pressure of work on digital platform, women are vulnerable to stress, anxiety and depression more in comparison to men. People suffer from the chronic techno stress and feel emotionally distant while working on gadgets in isolation. The participants asked Prof Allen about how to strike a balance in personal and social domain as internet has become an essential part of daily lives. Prof Allen suggested try to stay disconnected for the time being and spend quality time with family and dear ones to stay mentally healthy and professionally more focused.

Dr Nisha Bhargava appreciated the initiative of PG department of Sociology. She mentioned that digital platform has eased out dissemination of information and processing of data but physical interaction and quality time with family is still very much relevant for the emotional vigour and professional excellence. More than 100 participants thanked the organizers for arranging such an informative and relevant session with the help of feedback form.
