

 Making students aware of the Clean India Movement and making them responsible for cleanliness.





Activities to help to combat child abuse and depression, sessions to inspire entrepreneurship in women, promotion of personal hygiene and sanitation at the community level, the campaign against single-use plastic, solid waste management, awareness drive on human parasites, the grant of scholarships and emotional support to disadvantaged groups, gender sensitization and creation of inclusive culture on campus for a diverse student body are examples of the kind of initiatives taken at the college.
