The students up to ninth grade were also encouraged to write an article on the value and scope of Sanskrit in today's world in both Hindi and Sanskrit.

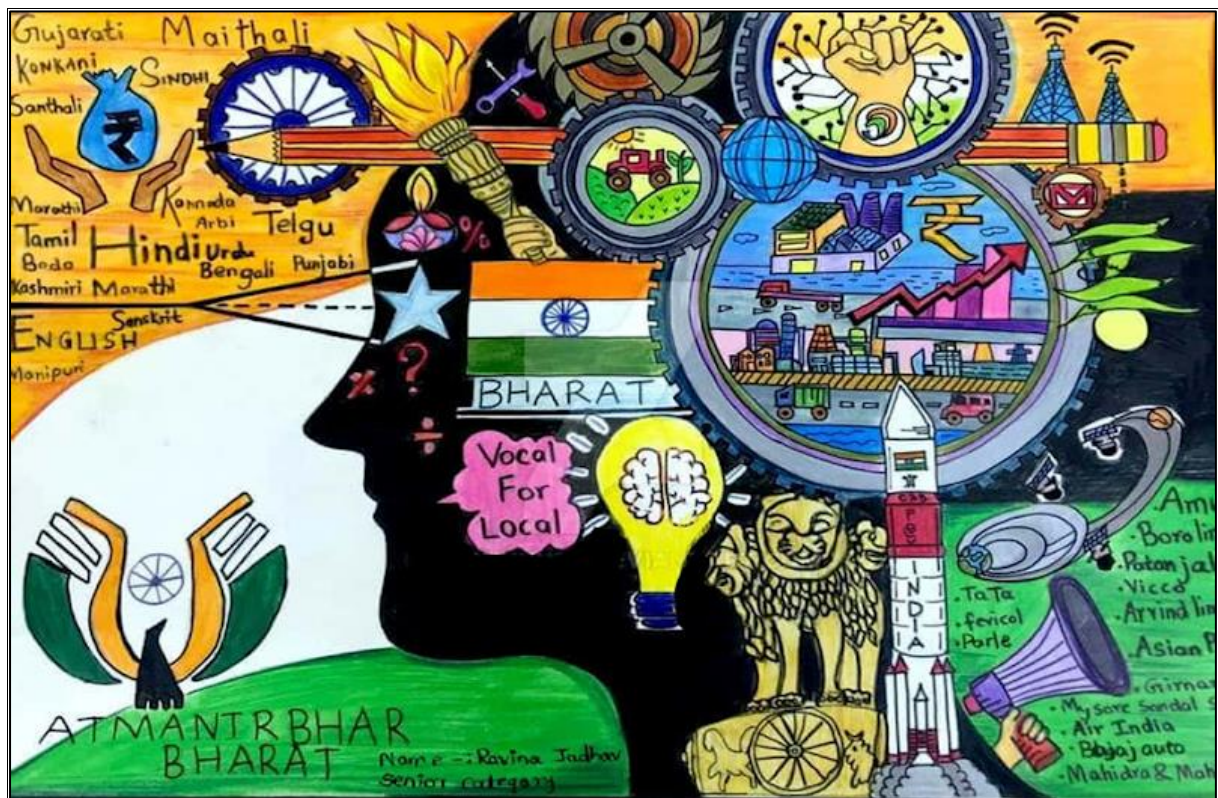

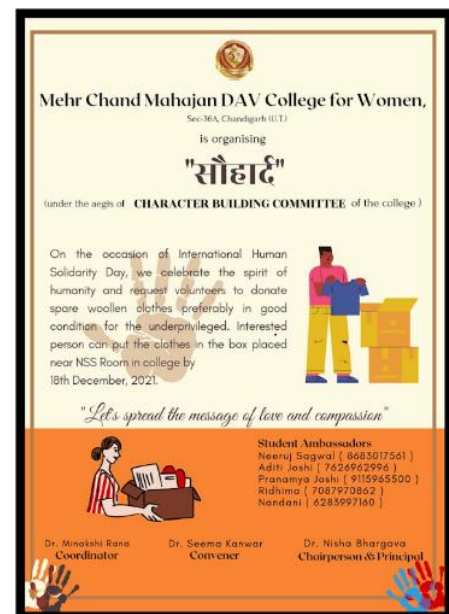
- Making students aware of the Clean India Movement and making them responsible for cleanliness.

#### ✓ सौहार्द: Donation of Woollen Clothes for the underprivileged organized by Character Building Committee on 20<sup>th</sup> December, 2021

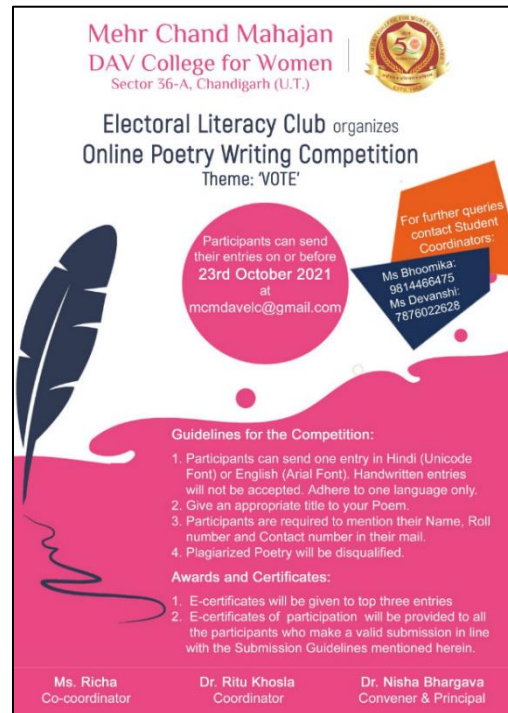

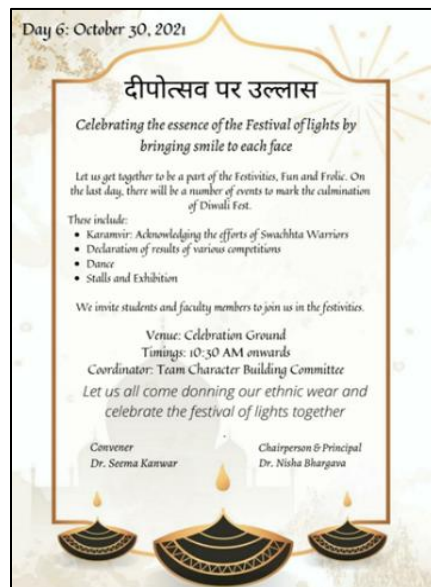

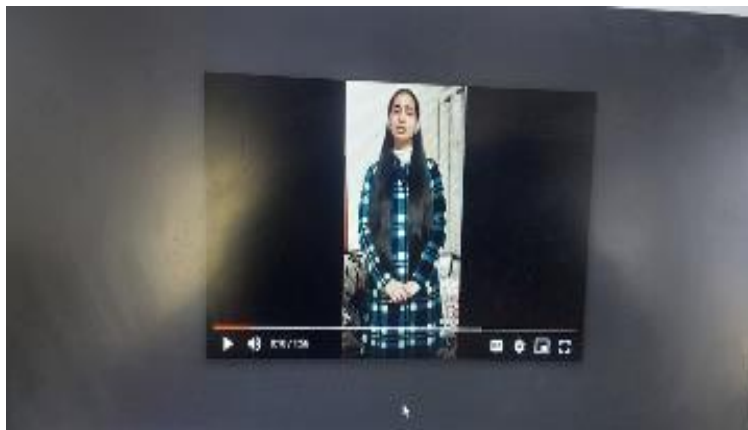


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(1705) of B.A.1st year and Ridhi (8130) of B.A 3rd year won second and third positions respectively.

✓ The **Electoral Literacy Club in association with NSS Units**

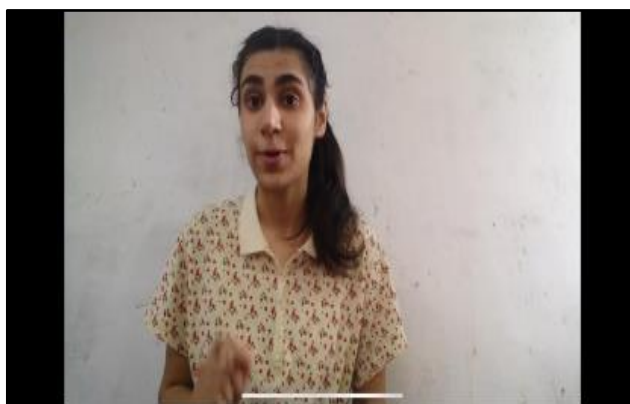
organized a declamation contest on 'Importance of Local Bodies Election (Municipal Corporation - 2021) in Chandigarh'. The contest created the much-needed
