

चंडीगढ़। नेशनल रिकॉर्ड तोड़कर नया इतिहास रच चुकी सिटी ब्यूटीफुल की इकलीती तेराक चाहत अरोडा अब सैफ गेम्स-2019 में अपना लोहा मनवाते हुए तीन मेडलजीतकर इंडिया की बेस्ट परफॉर्मर बनीं। यह सैफ गेम्स काठमांड् में 5 से 19 दिसंबर तक खोले जा रहें हैं। तैराकों में भारत की ओर से चाहत अरोड़ा ने शानदार प्रदर्शन करते हुए 2 गोल्ड और 1 सिल्बर मेडल जीतने में कागयाची सामित्न की है।

50 मीटर ब्रेस्ट स्टोक में चाहत ने 33.32 का स्कोर बनाते हुए गोल्ड मेडल हासिल किया और इसकेबाद

100 मीटर बेस्ट स्ट्रोक इसेंट में 1.13.52 का समय लेते हुए सिल्बर मेडल जीता। वहीं बार गुणा सी मेडले

रीले इवेंट में गोल्ड हासिल किया। इन तीनों कंपीटिशन में प्रशिवा के बेस्ट नेसकों ने हिस्सा लिया था। सैफ गेम्स में तीन मेडल जीतने पर चाहत अरोड़ा परिवार और सिटी के

तैसकों में खुशी का माहील है। देश के लिये तीन मेंडल जीतने पर चाहत के कोच गरचरण सिंह काफी खश हैं। उन्होंने बताया कि सैफ गेम्स में चाहत ने किसी तैराक को कंपींटिशन के दौरान अपने आसपास भी नहीं पहुंचने दिया।

जीते नेशनल-इंटरनेशनल मेडल



- 2. **Best Red Ribbon Club** by the National AIDS Control Society for the exceptional work in engaging college youth for awareness on HIV/AIDS.








Campus Mentoring Programme Report 2020-21

Solar panels have been installed in the campus and electricity generation through these was 921533 KWH till July 6, 2020 and accounted for Rs. 6450731 through net metering. Since Feb 2020, we are getting the benefits of surplus solar generation reflected in the reduced electricity bills.
