


#### PREVENTIVE EYE CARE IN THE ERA OF DIGITALIZATION







#### EXPANDING THE CREATIVE HORIZONS



# BUILDING RESILIENCE THROUGH EMOTIONAL STRENGTH AND MIND POWER



Resource person, Dr Pallavi Gupta briefed how LEDs have created a revolution in illumination technology. The workshop aimed to train teaching and non-teaching staff in assembling 9 W and 12 W LEDs. 43 staff members participated in this workshop and successfully made around 50 LED bulbs and tested them successfully at this workshop.



#### INVESTOR'S AWARENESS PROGRAMME'

The **Internal Quality Assurance Cell** organized a Webinar titled 'Investor's Awareness Programme' on November 18, 2020. The resource person, Mr Raghunandan Pattanaik, a National Trainer – BFSI (All India), generated awareness about various types, plans and components of investments through his presentation. 




#### NATIONAL NUTRITION WEEK

#### INTERNATIONAL DAY OF BIODIVERSITY



#### AWARENESS ABOUT CANCER





## SOCIAL OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

### coV-विजय

The College in collaboration with MGNCRE, GOI, launched a campaign on COVID-19 Vaccine awareness June 15, 2021 called "COV-विजय". Under this initiative, a team of 15 students two faculty members, along with MGNCRE official visited Butrela and Bhadheri village on 28 June 2021' did doordoor campaigning and covered 210 houses. The participants made the residents aware of the benefits of getting COVID vaccination. They also tried to bust various myths and fears associated with it.

## RESEARCH INITIATIVES

The College received grants worth Rs. 66,31,450/- for various Research Projects from Government and non-governmental agencies during the academic year 2020-21. Various initiatives were taken to promote research among students, faculty and outside agencies. Skills in conducting research were enhanced through workshops on Research Methodology, Intellectual Property Rights and Entrepreneurship. Apart from 29 research papers in International and National journals notified by UGC, a total of 36 Chapters in books, Books with ISBN and Conference Proceedings were published during the year. Three collaborative Research Projects on burning social issues were also carried out successfully.

#### STUDY ON CYBER HARASSMENT AMONG WOMEN IN CHANDIGARH

In a first-ever initiative by a higher education institution in Chandigarh, the college undertook a Chandigarh Police approved research project to investigate the phenomena of Cyber Harassment among Female Internet Users in Chandigarh and submitted its report to the Cyber Cell, Chandigarh Police. Titled 'Making Virtual Space Safer: An Analytical Study on Cyber Harassment Among Women in Chandigarh', the project was successfully completed by Dr. Mamta Ratti, Postgraduate Department of Commerce and Dr. Minakshi Rana, Postgraduate Department of Sociology.

#### RESEARCH PROJECT ON TRAFFIC CONGESTION IN CHANDIGARH

Mmembers of faculty and studens undertook a research project on Traffic Congestion in Chandigarh with the objective of investigating the problem at micro level and proposing solutions for better traffic management. The college was felicitated by Traffic Police for this project titled 'Traffic Congestion Created and Faced by Daily Commuters: A Case Study of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh'. This project was carried out by Dr. Kiran Jindal and Dr. Mamta Ratti, Assistant Professors, Department of Commerce, and Ms. Sanya and Ms. Zeenia, students of B.Com. III. For the purpose of this study, a data base of around 3400 daily commuters (students and staff members of the college) was taken and valuable suggestions were given to combat the problem of traffic congestion on Chandigarh roads.



#### RESEARCH PROJECT ON PLAY BASED LEARNING

The College completed a study titled 'Play based Learning: A Comparative Study on the Role of Traditional Toys and Smart Toys in the Metacognitive Learning and Language Development of Children'. The study was completed under the supervision of Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava as Principal Investigator, Dr. Mamta Ratti and Dr. Minakshi Rana as co-investigators. The study was based on comparing the perception of primary school teachers on the role of traditional and smart toys in the learning and development of children. In all, 418 primary school teachers participated in the study and the results showed that teachers accepted traditional toys as better than smart toys for stimulating learning, strengthening muscles and being more cost-effective, durable and eco-friendly. The project received appreciation from Chandigarh Commission for Protection of Child Rights (CCPCR). Keeping in mind the recommendations of the study, CCPCR plans to distribute 500 kits of the recommended toys mentioned in the study in the schools of UT Chandigarh as a pilot initiative.


#### INTERACTIVE SESSIONS WITH ALUMNI
