

Inaugurating the lecture, Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava hailed Swami Vivekananda as a major force behind reform movements, highlighting his efforts to spread the message of eternal Vedanta philosophy and to seek foreign assistance and technical knowledge for India's development. Paying tribute to this distinguished son of Mother India, Dr. Bhargava added that Swami Vivekananda's philosophy is life transforming and his life journey is so inspiring that students can learn many valuable lessons from him. In his engrossing lecture, Mr. Sudhir Baweja said that if you want to be a person with muscles of iron and nerves of steel, then Swami Vivekananda's friend request awaits you. He impressed upon the youth to befriend Vivekananda through reading of his writings and emulating his lessons in one's life. MCM holds online awareness programme on 'Eat right during COVID'



The NSS units of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh, in collaboration with the college's Health Committee, organised an online awareness programme titled 'Eat Right During COVID: A Comprehensive Approach'. The programme aimed to mobilize sustained community participation

for health and nutrition issues across the country and to conduct Swastha Balak-Balika Spardha as part of celebration of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. Dr. Harjot Kaur Mann, Assistant Professor, Department of Home Science of the college was the resource person for the programme. Dr Harjot highlighted the importance of monitoring growth vitals of children of age group 0-6 years especially during the prevailing COVID-19 conditions. She discussed about several healthy dietary approaches including immuno-enhancers. Growth and development tips to improve the height, weight and the overall health of children were also highlighted. She shared tips regarding use of immunity boosters readily available in everyone's kitchen. In addition, guidelines on post-COVID care management including type of food such as usage of prebiotics, probiotics, super immunity chargers, herbs, condiments etc. and food handling and disposing practices were also discussed. At the end of the session, doubts and queries of the participants were discussed. Lauding this highly contextual initiative, Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava said that due to prevailing COVID-19 pandemic, it is difficult to assess the malnourishment status among children, and hence, there is a dire need to sensitize and mobilize community participation for ensuring healthy nutrition among children especially infants.

MCM NSS celebrates Makar Sankranti with yoga session



To mark the holy occasion of Makar Sankranti under Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, the NSS units of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh organised an online Yoga session on "Surya Namaskar for Vitality". The session aimed to promote emotional as well as psychological wellness of the students

during these stressful times and to create a culture of fitness and healthy lifestyle through the practice of yogasanas.

The session's resource person was Ms. Keisham Monarita, Gold medallist in Yoga at National and International level. During the session, Ms. Keisham discussed the importance of yoga and its different aspects, especially in the prevailing COVID-19 conditions and demonstrated 12 different steps of Surya Namaskar. She explained in detail the benefits and correct way of doing Surya Namaskar and highlighted the implication of practicing yoga asanas in daily life. At the end, certain cooling asanas and pranayama were also demonstrated. The session concluded with queries of the participants that were suitably resolved by the resource person.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava wished everyone on the occasion of Makar Sankrantia a festival for expressing gratitude to mother nature. Highlighting the benefit of the day's session, Dr. Bhargava asserted that Surya Namaskar provides various benefits like strengthening muscles and joints, ensuring better functioning of digestive system, helping with weight loss, etc.

MCM holds webinar on Semiconductor Transistors and Moor's Law



The Department of Physics at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women. Chandigarh organised a webinar on the topic 'Journey of Semiconductor Transistors and Moor's Law'. resource person of the webinar was Dr. Abhijit Chandra Roy, Department of Physics, Indian Institute of Science.

Bangalore, India. Dr. Abhijit gave a detailed explanation of the journey of semiconductors- from vacuum tubes, diode and triode to the present semiconductor systems. He also introduced the concept of molecular electronics to the audience which is expected to replace the traditional semiconductor electronics devices. A total of 56 students and staff members participated in the webinar.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava lauded this initiative of the Physics Department to widen the horizons of students regarding semiconductor transistors and motivate them for future research in this area. She expressed hope that the webinar will go a long way in educating the audience about the key features of semiconductor transistors.

MCM holds Panache 2022



The Department of Office Management and Secretarial Practice at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh organised a hands-on 3-day online workshop 'Panache 2022'. The workshop aimed to acquaint the students with the art of Resume Writing, Interview Skills, Communication Skills and other facets of personality development

including personal grooming and professional etiquette. It consisted of three sessions conducted by Dr. Jasmine Anand, Dr. Apara Sharma and Ms. Ruchika Singh from the college's Department of English. On day 1, Dr. Jasmine Anand apprised the participants of the nitty-gritties of Resume Writing and Interview Skills. Focusing on actual errors in resume writing, Dr. Anand discussed the appropriate resume length and content. She also familiarised the students with interview skills and helped them to work on standard interview questions, discussing the various responses to behavioral interviews, case interviews, stress interviews, online interviews. On day 2, Dr. Apara Sharma shared with the participants tips for better communication skills. She impressed upon the participants to incorporate reading habits, deliberate on important issues and engage in discussions with their classmates on regular basis for enhancing their communication skills. The third day's session titled "Body Language and Business Etiquette: Decoding the Basics" was conducted by Ms. Ruchika Singh. She apprised the students of the nuances of nonverbal communication, primarily the body language with respect to business etiquette. The students were motivated to focus on positive body language which helps foster team spirit at the workplace. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava lauded this initiative to equip students with skills that add to their employability quotient. She added that in this age of cut throat competition, it is imperative to chisel one's skills including communication skills for acing competition.

MCM holds electoral awareness competitions

MCM holds session on eco-friendly food packaging



The Swachhta Committee (Arts) of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh organised an online interactive session on 'Eco-friendly Food Packaging Solutions'. The resource persons for this enlightening session were Mr. Sandeep Mehto, Founder Bharat Calling and Vikalp and Mr. Paneti Rajesh, Sanitation and

Environment Secretary, Municipal Corporation Nellore, Andhra Pradesh. The session got a befitting start with the recitation of a thought provoking poem titled 'sookha paed' by Dr. Minakshi Rana, college's Department of Sociology, composed by Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava, that depicts the condition of trees due to indiscriminate deforestation. Thereafter, the audience took a pledge to minimise the usage of single use plastic bottles. Dr. Nisha Bhargava appreciated the efforts of Swachhta Committee for organising informative session on such a relevant topic. She added that United Nations Decade on Ecosystem Restoration (2021-2030) challenges everyone to massively scale up restoration efforts that breathe new life into our degraded ecosystems and it is high time to think of sustainable solutions.

Mr. Sandeep Mehto talked about zero waste lifestyle and eco friendly ways of reducing plastic pollution including use of edible cutlery and reusable shopping bags. Mr. Paneti Rajesh suggested plant based alternatives to plastic material used for packaging. The session ended with an interactive session wherein the participants put forth their queries as well as suggestions for ecosystem restoration.

MCM holds 5-day workshop on SEM analysis



With the objective of equipping faculty members, research scholars and students with skills in using advanced research tools for quality research, the Skill Development Committee of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh organised a 5-day online workshop on Structure Equation Model

Analysis. Organised in collaboration with Bhopal School of Social Sciences, Madhya Pradesh, the workshop had Dr. Amit Kumar Lal, Founder, Skills Learning Solutions and Data Scientist as the resource person. The workshop began with session on meaning and use of Regression Analysis. Further, exploratory factor analysis (EFA) and confirmatory factor analysis (CFA) were explained in detail. After the detailed explanation, the concept of Structure Equation Model was introduced to the participants. Dr. Lal told the participants that a careful selection of theory to answer the problem in question is crucial for Structure Equation Model analysis. The various drawing tools of AMOS software were also explained during the workshop and a model was run to facilitate practical application. The expert took a detailed session on interpretation of findings and reporting of results in research paper. The workshop provided hands on training to the participants as practice sheets were provided for better understanding and application of the concepts learnt during the workshop. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava said that quality research is the tool for creating authentic knowledge for civilizations and is important for a nation's progress as well as personal and professional growth in academia. She added that the college is committed to promoting research aptitude and shall continue organising workshops on advanced research tools and techniques in the future.

MCM NSS holds virtual awareness session to mark the celebration of National Girl Child Day



The NSS units of College organised a virtual awareness session on Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) Scheme as part of the weeklong celebration of National Girl Child Day 2022. During the session, Dr Pallvi Rani, MCM NSS Programme Officer apprised the NSS volunteers about the objectives and significance of National Girl

Child Day and quoted examples of Mrs. Indira Gandhi, Savitribai Phule and Dr. Kiran Bedi who contributed significantly in the field of girls' education and brought revolution in the society. In the subsequent session, Dr Purnima Bhandari, MCM NSS Programme Officer briefed the volunteers about the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme, highlighting its objectives and the current strategies of the scheme adopted by the Govt. of India. Dr. Bhandari also apprised the volunteers about the eligibility condition, documents required for BBBP scheme and various initiatives launched by Govt. of India under the scheme such as Sukanya Samridhi Yojana, Balika Samridhi Yojana, Ladli Laxmi Yojana, etc. During this session, a poster making competition on the theme 'Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao' was also organised wherein the participants presented their hand made posters virtually. In the end, the queries of the audience were addressed. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava lauded this endeavour of the NSS units to spread awareness about the Government of India's highly significant initiative to improve the efficiency of welfare services intended for girls in India. She added that such sessions are important from the point of sensitising citizens about the issue of gender inequality and challenging the prevalent gender stereotypes.


MCM NSS holds webinar on survival & protection of girl child



The NSS Units of the College organised a webinar on 'Survival and Protection of the Girl Child' under the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme as part of the weeklong celebration of National Girl Child Day 2022. The speaker on this occasion was Ms. Sakshi Muwal, Co-founder, Samvaad and a

Certified Trainer (Eradication of Child Sexual Abuse Literacy, Menstrual Hygiene). Ms. Sakshi began the webinar by drawing attention to the problems faced by females in Indian society such as female infanticide, child marriage, trafficking and gender discrimination. She asserted that there is a dire need to adopt a multisectoral approach to prevent and combat trafficking of women and children for commercial sexual exploitation. Ms. Sakshi educated the participants about the rights of a girl child and shed light on the initiatives taken by Government of India to protect girls' and women's rights such as raising marriage age of girls from 18 to 21, Beti Bachao Beti Padhao scheme, POCSO Act 2021, Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana, etc. At the end of the webinar, 'Girl Child Protection Oath' was administered to all the volunteers with the promise to eliminate gender discrimination and work towards the safety and development of girl child. The NSS volunteers and staff members of the college also shared the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao logo on their WhatsApp status and social media handles so as to create awareness about the day among the masses. 
Science Week concludes at MCM

Gandhar emphasised the role of research and innovation in the betterment of society by citing relevant examples of pathbreaking innovations that changed the world. He motivated the students to be persistent in their quest for knowledge and be the harbingers of change by finding novel solutions to the problems ailing the society. Dr. Rohit Sharma in his talk on the basics of NMR spectroscopy, explained that NMR spectroscopy can be defined as an indispensable tool which applies a magnetic field to an atomic nucleus radio frequency pulse to characterise the resonant frequency of that atomic nucleus according to its chemical or environmental surroundings.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava said that with the creation of a Central Instrumentation Laboratory in the campus, new avenues of research will open up for both students as well as faculties. She added that procurement of the advanced instruments- NMR and FT-IR will act as pedogeological tool for research based activities, thereby enhancing the research orientation of students.
