



MCM celebrates National Wildlife Week



The Character Building Committee and Parivesh- the Eco Club of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh, celebrated National Wildlife Week with a host of events under the theme of 'Recovering key species for ecosystem restoration'. The week-long celebration aimed to sensitise the students about the importance of flora and fauna, and their conservation and protection through

various events like Documentary Screening, competitions like Flower Photography, Extempore Speech, Power Point Presentation, Butterfly Pebble Painting, Debate, Wildlife Search in the Backyard and Face Painting, and Nukkad Natak. The celebration began with screening of documentary titled 'One Hour of Amazing Animal Moments' based on the diversity of wildlife in different habitats. On the next day, a Flower Photography Competition was organised with the objective of motivating students to explore different species of flowering plants, and to spread the message about the relevance of all types of flowers, their conservation and restoration for sustainability and ecological stability. The Extempore Speech Competition included topics like religion based sacrifice of animals, slaughtering of animals for food, effect of tourism on wildlife, disadvantages of technology on flora and fauna, exploitation of plants in cosmetic and skincare industry, and so on. In the 'Wildlife Search in the Backyard' event, the participants clicked photographs of wildlife in their respective backyards. The Power Point Presentation Competition was held on the topic "Threat to aquatic wildlife", which witnessed presentation of thought provoking views by the participants on climate change as the greatest threat to ocean health, ill effects of ocean dumping, dredging, land run off, oil spills, water and noise pollution from ships, plastic pollution and so on. In the Pebble Painting Contest, the participants painted butterflies of different genera on pebbles.

A Debate Competition was also organised on the topic 'Pros and Cons of Genetically modified organisms (Plants/Animals)'. In the E-Posters Competition, the participants presented posters on the topic 'New animal/plant species discovered in 2020-2022'. Face Painting Competition on the theme 'Endangered Wildlife' gave the participants the opportunity to demonstrate their artistic acumen while raising awareness about the endangered animals. In an effort to enhance awareness about wildlife conservation, the student volunteers of Parivesh staged a nukkad natak highlighting the issues related to wildlife.

Two day International Conference on Beyond the Contemporary Sciences inaugurated at MCM



A 2-day International Conference on 'Beyond the Contemporary Sciences (BCS-2022)', being organised jointly by the Department of Physics, Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College, Chandigarh and School of Physical Sciences, Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Mysuru, began here today. The inaugural session was graced by Prof. Arun K. Grover, Emeritus Professor, PEC as Chief Guest and Prof. Navdeep Goyal, Department of Physics, Punjab University was the keynote speaker. Inaugurating the conference, Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava said that innovative and practical demonstration teaching methodology has been scientifically proven to promote efficient learning, and thus, the college follows this methodology in letter and spirit. She added that this conference is an extension of the approach to integrate theory and practice, and is an effort to correlate science, technology and innovation. In his address, Prof. Arun K. Grover mentioned that contemporary science is an organic unity of science as knowledge, science as an activity and science as a social institution, and therefore each educational institution should inculcate self learning amenabilities among students to make them innovative, creative and self-reliant to work independently in future. He highlighted the role of emerging demand, scope and development in the area of Quantum Computing that has the potential to revolutionise computation by making certain types of classically problems solvable. He related his expertise in the field of intractable supercomputers, semiconductors and nanotechnology to coherence, fidelity, and

ultimate scalability to large systems for utility in Quantum computers. Prof. Navdeep Goyal explained the role of solar simulators as a prerequisite in current digital world and their utilisation challenges with their efficiency enhancing factors. He also explained the role of Li-Ion batteries and replaceable ions like Na+ ions to understand the factors affecting the photovoltaic parameters of the devices. He incentivised the students and research scholars to understand and execute their learning skills by correlating them with day-to-day applications, thereby developing innovative ideas to tackle challenging research areas and contributing to the society. After the inaugural session, invited lectures by Prof. Ravindra Pandey from Michigan Technical University, USA (Topic- Nanomaterials: Synthesis, Characterisation and Application), Prof. B.R.K.Nanda from IIT Madras (Topic- Computational design of cathode materials for AI based rechargable batteries), Prof. Ajay Singh from IIT Roorkee (Topic- Josephson Quantam Transport across Hybrid Nanostructures: Prospects and Promises), Dr. B. MCM holds talk on Career in Radio and the Art of Voice Modulation




MCM holds book exhibition on Indian freedom fighters


