Research Ethics Committees review proposed studies, with human participants, to ensure that they follow internationally and locally accepted ethical guidelines. They also perform other functions, such as drafting policies or offering opinions on ongoing ethical issues in research. Institutional Ethics Committee of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women was constituted to offer assistance in addressing ethical issues that may arise during the research performed by the students and the faculty of the college. The main responsibility of the Ethics Committee is to monitor the treatment towards potential participants in the research and ensure all aspects of their security, safeguarding their rights. It also takes into account possible risks and benefits for the community in which the research will be carried out. Its ultimate goal is to promote high ethical standards in research. IEC conducts regular meetings for reviewing the research proposals and gives suggestions to the investigators to make their research ethically viable before approving their proposals.
