The Medical Committee of MCM DAV College for Women organised a Cancer Awareness session with the aim of apprising its' staff and students about the causes, prevention and treatment of the

dreaded disease. Dr. Shaveta Gupta, Obst-Gynaecologist and Gynaec-Oncologist, Max Super Specialty Hospital, Mohali conducted the highly informative session. Dr.Gupta shared insightful information about the symptoms of cancer, including breast

cancer and cervix cancer, causes and treatment of cancer. Elaborating on the ways to fight cancer, she said that regular exercise, diet modification, stress management, vaccination and regular screening can save lives from the clutches of this deadly disease. The interactive session witnessed enthusiastic participation as the audience put forth their queries. In another event by the Environment Committee, Meenu Sachdeva, a textile designing expert, conducted a 3-day workshop on Textile Printing and Designing. Ardor marked the participation in the workshop wherein the participants got the opportunity to learn and hone their skills in creating beautiful designs on textiles. College Principal Dr.NishaBhargava stressed upon the fact that MCM is dedicated to the holistic development and well-being of its' various stakeholders and such programmes are a reiteration of its commitment.

- **Health Check-up Camp**

The Medical Committee of MCM DAV College for Women organised a Health Check-up cum awareness camp on 10th August, 2017 for the workers employed in the college canteen, mess and shops on the campus. Around 40 workers were examined by a team of experts from Healing Touch Hospital which conducted various tests including eye check up, dental check up, tests for diabetes, haemoglobin and PFT (Pulmonary Function Test). The experts also sensitised the workers on issues of general hygiene and a healthy lifestyle. The workers enthusiastically participated in the camp and benefitted from the insights of the experts.



Lecture on Drug Abuse

The medical committee of MCM DAV College for Women organised a highly informative lecture on 'Drug Abuse: Problems, Prevention and Management'. Prof. Gulshan Kumar Bansal, Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Drug Research, Punjabi University, Patiala delivered the lecture to generate awareness about the prevalence of menace of drug abuse, ways to tackle and about the treatment of drug addiction.



- Medical committee of the college in association with State Bank of India, Sec 36A, Chandigarh organized two lectures in view of women day on 8th March to spread the awareness among faculty and students about gynaec related diseases and problems. In the lecture sessions, Dr. Atul Joshi of Fortis hospital, Mohali made the faculty and students aware of breast cancer its symptoms and possible preventions and treatments. Another lecture was delivered by Dr. Vandana Mittal from Shalby hospital, Mohali about women personal hygiene and avoidance of major gynae problems. Dr. Vandana mittal also provided the counselling to the students regarding their gynae related problems.



- Medical committee organized a medical camp in the college campus on 29 March, 2018 in collaboration with Fortis hospital, Mohali. In this camp around 300 staff members and students were offered health check up related to gynaecology, Orthopaedics, Dermatology, Ophthalmology, General Medicine and Diabetes. Tests like ECG, Hb, BP, Sugar and Bone Density were also conducted.
