- Renewable energy committee of the college organized a demonstration session on **‘Installation and working of solar panels’** on March 30, 2017 for all science students. Students were taken to rooftop of the college to explain the principle and working of solar panels. An engineer from Multi Overseas Pvt. Ltd. was invited as resource person to conduct the session. Students learned how solar technologies convert sunlight into electrical energy through photovoltaic (PV) panels.



- The committee organized a panel discussion on the **‘Role of Women in Renewable Energy Revolution’** on April 06, 2017 in collaboration with CII, where eminent speakers from diverse fields shared their views on the topic. of villages, sensitizing different stakeholders, etc. Prof. (Dr.) Rudra Rameshwar, Incharge-Energy Power Environment and Sustainability Development, Thapar University, Patiala stressed upon the gravity of the looming power crisis and urged the women to play a proactive role as leaders, entrepreneurs, role models in promoting renewable energy. Mr. Harpal Singh, Chairman, Nanhi Chhaan Foundation highlighted that greater participation of women in the renewable energy revolution can do wonders for the revolution.
