The Context: The role played by wildlife in maintaining the ecological balance of Nature is undeniable. Any harm to the wilderness can pose a threat to the entire





Date of activity: 17 November 2022

Objectives: The primary purpose of conducting this exercise was to provide students with an opportunity to learn about many innovative approaches that can be used to manage the waste in such a manner that it can be brought into use again. Water Coolers - 15.10.2022 and 21.12.2022


Number of Participants: 6 hostel superintendents and the cleaning staff of the hostel.
