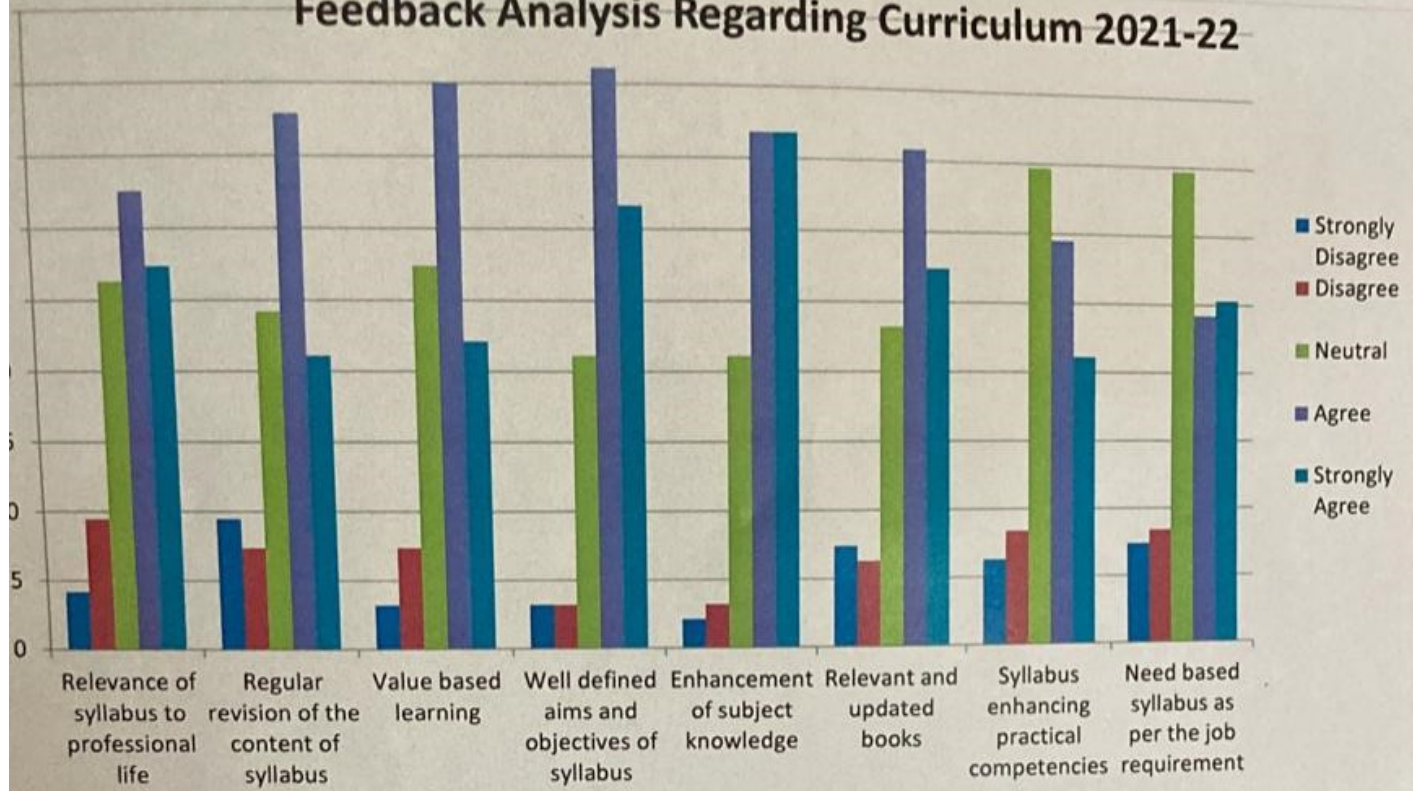

## Feedback Analysis Regarding Curriculum 2021-22



### Analysis of Feedback from Alumni

#### Statement 1: Relevance of Syllabus to Professional Life

Majority of the students i.e., 27.4 percent of students strongly agreed and 32.6 percent agreed that the syllabus studied has been relevant to their professional life. While 24.2 percent students held a neutral opinion in this regard.

#### Statement 2: Regular Revision of the Content of Syllabus

21.1 percent students strongly agreed and 37.9 percent students agreed that the content of the syllabus has been revised at reasonable intervals. On the other hand, 23.1 percent students held a neutral opinion in this context.

#### Statement 3: Value Based Learning

22.1 percent of the students strongly agreed and 40 percent of students agreed that the syllabus imparts value-based learning in terms of skill, concepts, knowledge and critical thinking in them while 27.4 percent students have neutral response in this regard.

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**Statement 4: Well defined Aims and Objectives of Syllabus**

31.6 percent of students strongly agreed and 41.1 percent agreed that the aims and objectives of the syllabus were well defined and clear to the teachers and students. On the other hand, 21.1 percent held a neutral opinion in context.

**Statement 5: Enhancement of Subject Knowledge**

Majority of students i.e., 36. percent strongly agreed and 36.8 percent of students agreed that the syllabus has increased their knowledge and understanding of the subject studied. 21.1 percent students held neutral response in this regard.

**Statement 6: Relevant and Updated Books**

27.4 percent of students strongly agreed and 37.8 percent students agreed that the prescribed books were relevant, updated and appropriate. On the other hand, 23.2 percent held a neutral opinion in this context.

**Statement 7: Syllabus Enhancing Practical Competencies**

21.1 percent of the students strongly agreed and 29.5 percent students agreed that the syllabus enhanced their practical competencies while 34.7 percent students held a neutral response in this regard.

**Statement 8: Need Based Syllabus as per Job Requirement**

25.3 percent students strongly agreed and 24.2 percent agreed that the syllabus is need based as per the requirement of the job/industry. On the other hand, 34.7 percent held a neutral opinion in this context.
