Recently, its efforts have become more focused in the anticipation of the implementation of the New Education Policy which envisages a paradigmatic shift in the existing approach, strategies and systems in the institutions of higher learning. Maintaining its glorious tradition in the changed scenario, the College is committed to achieve new standards of quality education and research.

The institutional efforts in this direction are being spearheaded by its dynamic Internal Quality Assurance Cell which is continually involved in upholding, monitoring and revising the quality parameters in all institutional practices. Apart from streamlining various policies for the smooth functioning of various administrative departments, the IQAC also prepared and submitted in time the Annual Quality Assurance Report, 2021; the IIQA and the Self Study Report to initiate the 3rd Cycle of Institutional Accreditation by NAAC, Bengaluru.

Aligning itself with the emerging needs and expectations of its learners, the College added new infrastructural facilities and pedagogical aids including an administrative block, an auditorium, projectors in classrooms and a lecture recording studio. To upscale multidisciplinary research, a new Social Science

Research Lab and a Mathematics Lab were added through DST- FIST grant and instrumentation facility. The existing Research Centre in English was also equipped with more infrastructural and ICT resources.

It is said that knowledge grows when it is shared. With this belief, the College promoted knowledge sharing with the other institutions by holding joint academic and research based activities for the benefit of learners of both institutions. 5-day/7-day workshops on Advanced Research and Research Tools were conducted in collaboration with Bhopal School of Social Sciences, MP and Rajeev Gandhi College of Management Studies, Navi Mumbai.

FROM THE CHIEF COORDINATOR'S DESK



THE SHAKUNTALA ROY MEMORIAL LECTURE

SURVIVAL AND RESILIENCE AMONG WOMEN: A GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE

In a befitting tribute to its Founder Principal and her resilient spirit, the College organized Mrs. Shakuntala Roy Memorial Oration Lecture (3rd in Series) on 'Survival and Resilience among Women: A Global Perspective' on May 14, 2022. Prof. Allen Furr, Professor Emeritus of Sociology, Auburn University, USA was the keynote speaker. Prof. Arun K. Grover, Professor Emeritus, PEC, Chandigarh; Mrs. Neera Grover, Head, Music Department, SNDT University, Mumbai; Dr. Gurdip Sharma, Secretary, GGDSD College Managing Committee, Haryana, Punjab and former PU Senior Senate and Syndicate Member, and Mrs. Manju Gosain, daughter of Mrs. Shakuntala Roy were Special Guests on this occasion. Mrs. Madhu Raka, the topper of the first batch of the College was also present on the occasion.

Prof. Furr, in his presidential lecture, called upon everyone to overcome the prejudices of the past since 21st Century is the age of women who have, unfortunately, been in a position of social disadvantage but now there is a dire need to reconstruct the gender narrative. Sharing examples of extra-ordinary Indian women who have made their mark in the society, Prof. Furr urged the students to realize their innate abilities and aspire for higher goals.

In his address Prof. Grover traced the journey of women achievers from across the globe and motivated the students to seek inspiration from their lives.



WEBINARS/SYMPOSIUM/SEMINARS

GET THE LUMP OUT OF YOUR THROAT THROUGH CREATIVE WRITING

A webinar on 'Get the Lump out of Your Throat through Creative Writing' was organized by the **Personality Development Club** and **Equal Opportunity Cell** on October 27, 2021. Resource Person, Ms. Suditi Jindal, Life Coach and Founder of PHILYRA Training and Consultancy, Chandigarh shared with the participants the importance of creative writing and explained its effect on the existing state of writer's mind and intrinsic aspects of his/her personality. The online session saw an enthusiastic participation of over 100 students.

THE JOURNEY OF THE SEMICONDUCTOR TRANSISTORS AND MOOR'S LAW

A webinar on the topic 'The Journey of the Semiconductor Transistors and Moor's Law' was organized by the **Department of Physics** on January 7, 2022. The resource person in the webinar was Dr. Abhijit Chandra Roy, Department of Physics, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore, India. He traced in detail the journey of semiconductors from vacuum tubes, diode, and triode to the present semiconductor systems. He also introduced the concept of molecular electronics to the audience, where molecules are used as the primary building blocks for electronic circuits which are expected to replace the traditional semiconductor electronics devices. 50 students and 6 staff members participated in the webinar.

WEBINAR-CUM-WORKSHOP ON PROBLEM SOLVING AND IDEATION

A webinar-cum-workshop on 'Problem Solving and Ideation' was organized by the **Department of Computer Science** under the aegis of **IIC 4.0** on February 15, 2022. The resource person, Mr. Neeraj Mehta, Entrepreneur, Investor and Philanthropist discussed how students can look around at their surroundings and identify real-life problems and solve them with the use of innovation and information technology. 61 students and 11 members of faculty participated in the event.

EMERGING TOPICS AND OPPORTUNITIES IN PHYSICAL SCIENCE

The **Department of Physics**, under the aegis of **MCM Vigyan Manch**, organized a Webinar on 'Emerging Topics and Opportunities in Physical Science' on February 24, 2022. The event was sponsored by the **Department of Science and Technology, Chandigarh**. Dr. Debabrata Deb, Assistant Professor, School of Physics and Material Science, Thapar Institute of Engineering and Technology, Patiala, was the resource person who provided information regarding emerging topics for research in physical sciences after graduation. He also listed various summer internship programmes in reputed institutes along with numerous national and international fellowship programmes like JRF, DAAD, TWAS. 73 students and 6 members of faculty joined the session.

COMBATING CYBER CRIME DURING COVID19

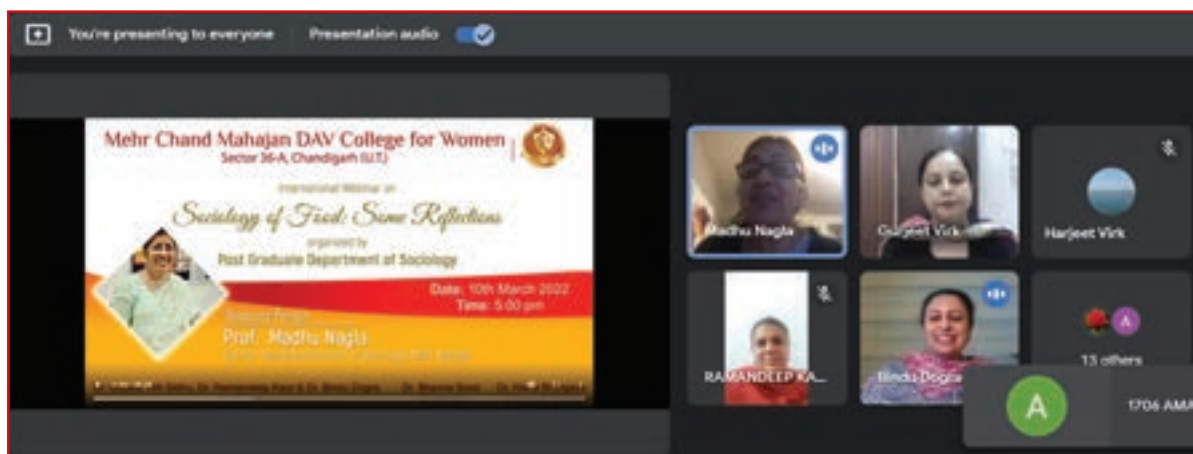
A national webinar was organized by the **Department of Computer Science** on 'Combating Cybercrime during Covid-19' on February 25, 2022 under the aegis of **MCM Vigyan Manch**. The webinar was sponsored by the **Department of Science and Technology and Renewable Energy, Chandigarh Administration**. The Resource Person for this webinar, Sh. Arun Soni, an internationally acclaimed author and cyber security expert from Chandigarh, generated awareness among participants about various kinds of cybercrimes and the ways to make secure online transactions. Around 114 students and 8 members of faculty attended this Webinar.

NANOTECHNOLOGY: INNOVATION AND ROLE OF WOMEN

The **Department of Physics**, in association with **Women Development Cell** organized a national webinar on 'Nanotechnology: Innovation and Role of Women' on March 3, 2022. The resource persons were Dr. Pooja Devi, Principal Scientist, CSIR–Central Scientific Instruments Organization (CSIR–CSIO), Chandigarh and Dr. Madhulekha Gogoi, DST- Women Scientist, CSIR-North East Institute of Science and Technology (CSIR–NEIST), Assam. Dr. Pooja dwelled upon the varied innovations in nanotechnology used in daily life and explained how it is an emerging field for research and development. The resource person also inspired the participants to take up research and development as their career through examples of several eminent women personalities working in different scientific areas. 82 participants joined the session.

SOCIOLOGY OF FOOD: SOME REFLECTIONS

The **Postgraduate Department of Sociology** organized an international webinar on the theme 'Sociology of Food: Some Reflections' on March 10, 2022. Prof. Madhu Nagla, former Professor and Head, Department of Sociology, MDU, Rohtak, was the resource person for this event. She highlighted how food has emerged as a new field within sociological research and how this theme will play a significant role in the future in the area of social research which needs to be studied by researchers, policymakers, social workers etc. 50 students and 11 faculty members attended the session.



NATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON DIGITAL IDENTITY: CATALYST FOR DIGITAL ECONOMY

A national symposium on the topic 'Digital Identity: Catalyst for Digital Economy' was organized on March 30, 2022 by the **Postgraduate Department of Economics**. Mr. Sumnesh Joshi, Deputy Director-General of the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) and Prof. Ajeet Angral, Consultant UTs of J&K and Ladakh, AICTE, New Delhi were the resource persons. They elucidated how the traditional form of identity which used to be on paper has shifted to digital identity in the form of Aadhaar and has become a unique success story of digital India. The session recorded the presence of 250 participants.



PHYSICS: INNOVATION-STARTUP-ENTREPRENEURSHIP

The **Department of Physics** under the aegis of **Institutions Innovation Council (4.0)**, organized a webinar on the topic 'Physics: Innovation-Start up-Entrepreneurship' on May 14, 2022. The speaker for the webinar was Dr. Ashim Saha, Co-Founder and Chief Operating Officer, Navariti Innovation, Hyderabad, Telangana and Director & Co-founder of Tervis Medical Systems Pvt. Ltd., Hyderabad. The webinar highlighted the role of physical science in evolution of modern technology. The resource person elaborated the structure and dynamics of entrepreneurship in Physics and discussed the factors responsible for the success or failure of a new startup such as funding, technology transfer, business models etc. 67 students and 9 teachers participated in the programme.

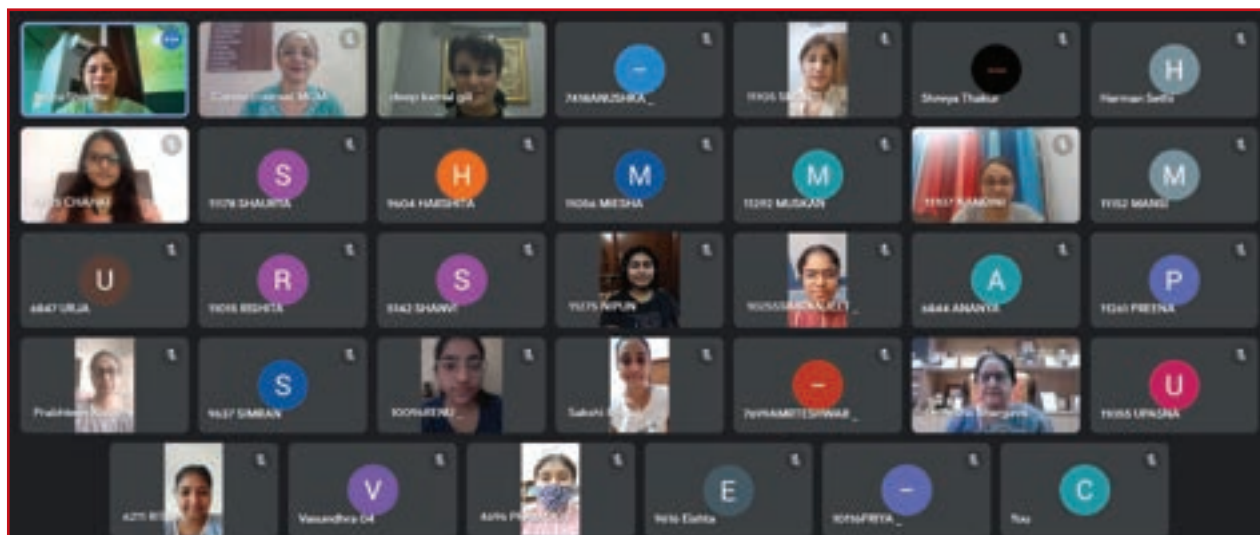
AWARENESS ON IPR, IP MANAGEMENT AND LEGAL FRAMEWORK

The **Department of Physics** under the aegis of **Institutions Innovation Council (4.0)** organized a webinar on 'Awareness on IPR, IP Management and Legal Framework' on May 23, 2022. The resource person Mr. Nitish Agarwal, Examiner of Patents and Designs, Office of the Controller General of Patents, Designs, and Trademarks, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India, showcased the importance of patents in today's world of innovation by explaining how a patent gives the person an exclusive right to sell, manufacture and license his new product. 119 students and 9 teachers participated in the webinar.



NATIONAL INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

An online Session on Intellectual Property Rights was organized on May 25, 2022 by the **Postgraduate Department of Chemistry** under the aegis of the **Institution's Innovation Council (IIC 4.0)** in collaboration with the Office of Controller General of Patents, Designs & Trade Marks, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India. The resource person Dr. Manoj Kumar Singh, Examiner of Patents & Designs, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India apprised the participants of the various nuances of intellectual property rights. 52 students and 17 members of faculty participated in the event.



WORKSHOPS

PAPER RECYCLING, PAPER PENCIL MAKING AND SEED BALLS MAKING

The **Internal Quality Assurance Cell** organized a Workshop on 'Paper Recycling, Paper Pencil Making and Seed Balls Making' on July 17, 2021 to mark the celebration of Annual Festival Van Mahotsav and to generate awareness about the importance of recycling and nurturing a clean, green and healthy environment. Dr. Shafila Garg, Assistant Professor in Environment Science, demonstrated a step-wise procedure of making handmade paper for painting, making bookmarks, decorative envelopes etc. from waste papers. She also explained the steps for making paper pencils using waste newspapers and introduced the participants to the concept of seed balls. Dr. Shafila also highlighted the importance of 3 R's i.e. reduce, reuse and recycle for environment conservation. 23 students participated in the workshop.

ADVANCED COURSE IN RESEARCH SKILLS

The **Skill Development Committee**, in collaboration with Rajeev Gandhi College of Management Studies, Navi Mumbai organized a seven-day workshop on Advanced Course in Research Skills from August 20-27, 2021 to promote scientific temperament among students. The workshop focused on varied aspects of research including selection of research topic, writing review of literature with the help of online tools, data analysis using SPSS Software and introduction to the R software. The resource person, Dr. Minakshi Rana, Assistant Professor, Postgraduate Department of Sociology was the resource person in which 100 research scholars and students belonging to Delhi, Haryana, Jammu and Kashmir, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Punjab registered.

PREPARATION FOR IELTS

An online Workshop on 'Preparation for IELTS' was organized by the **Career Counselling Cell** on September 30, 2021 in collaboration with StarQuest, an educational venture of highly experienced corporate professionals that focuses on improving the standard of English. The resource person Ms. Deep Kamal Gill, Chief of StarQuest with an experience of 22 years in corporate leadership provided 89 students the requisite information on IELTS and the best strategies to clear it.

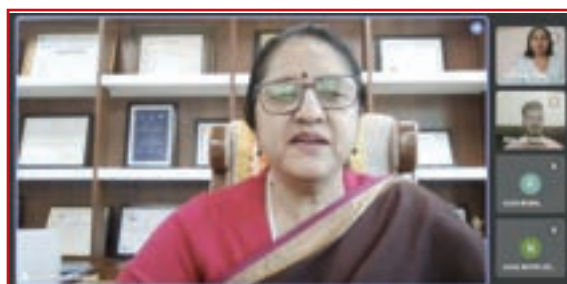
INCOME INEQUALITIES IN INDIA: PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC ERA

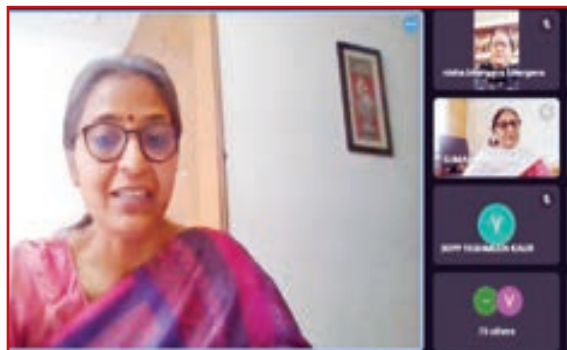
OUR PLACE IN SPACE

At the end of the session, based on consistency and performance, a recommendation letter will be issued to the buddy researchers. 21 researchers are currently enrolled in the lab.

LECTURE RECORDING STUDIO

The College has established a **Lecture Recording Studio** that meets all the video recording requirements of the College apart from equipping the students with requisite skills in news anchoring, interviewing, etc. equipped with sound-proof environment, high tech video recording equipment, TV, PC for editing and Wi-Fi connection, the studio is used for recording MCM News and interviews for MCM TV. It also offers the facilities of recording video lectures to the members of faculty and thus assists generation of e-content.

CENTRAL INSTRUMENTATION LAB

The **Postgraduate Department of Chemistry** under the aegis of **IQAC** inaugurated the 'Central Instrumentation Lab' on March 25, 2022 established by using DST- FIST zero level grant of Rs. 53 lakhs. With this grant, the department has been able to procure a benchtop NMR Instrument worth

40 lacs and an FT-IR Instrument worth 13 lacs to give an impetus to research in the department. The procurement of these instrument will serve as pedagogical tools and bolster research-based activities among both students and teaching faculty. On this occasion, Dr. Rohit Kumar Sharma, Department of Chemistry, Panjab University, Chandigarh delivered a lecture on the basics of NMR spectroscopy and explained how these new instruments can help in analyzing the synthesized compounds in a more accurate manner.



FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

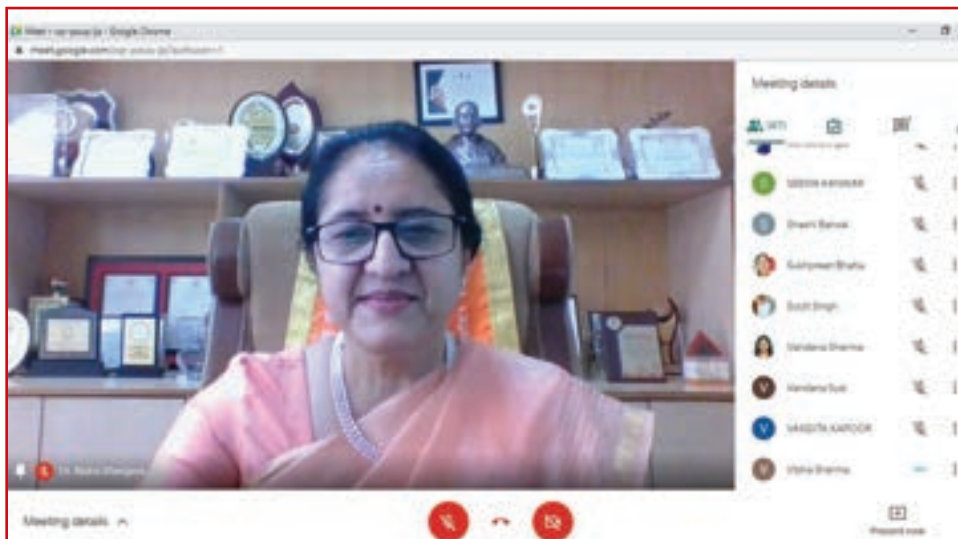
WORKSHOP ON E-CONTENT GENERATION

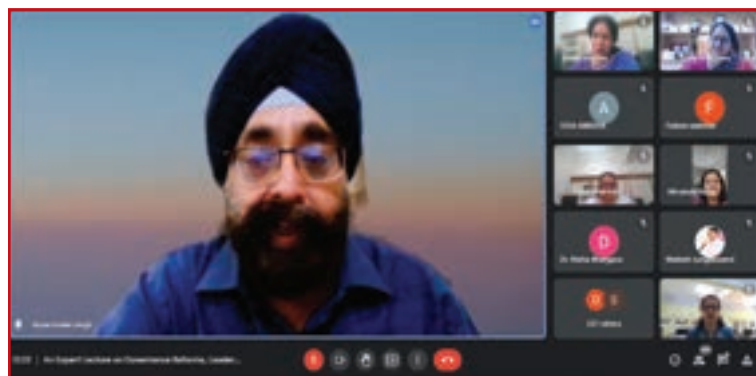


PUBLISHING QUALITY RESEARCH PAPERS IN INDEXED JOURNALS

The **College** organized a programme on Cyber Swachhta in collaboration with **Chandigarh Police** November 15, 2021. Sh. Praveer Ranjan DGP, Chandigarh Police; Prof. Baldev Setia Director, PEC and Mr. Jatin Jain Cyber Expert addressed the students and spread awareness about varied forms of cyber crimes and ways to prevent them. A total number of 89 students participated in the event which aimed to warn and sensitize students regarding the increasing crimes in the times of digital revolution.



DISABLED-FRIENDLY INFRASTRUCTURE

The **Character Building Committee** in collaboration with the **NSS Units** organized a session on the International Day of Persons with Disabilities on 'Raising Awareness about Disabled-Friendly Infrastructure' on December 3, 2021. The objective of the program was to sensitize the students about the rights and well-being of persons with disabilities in all spheres of society and development. It aimed to increase awareness and sensitivity towards the needs of persons with disabilities in every aspect of political, social, economic and cultural life. 25 students attended the session.

The **Electoral Literacy Club** in collaboration with the **NSS Units** organized a series of Programmes



to commemorate the Electoral Awareness Week from December 13-15, 2021 to sensitize young voters about their rights and duties. III (Medical) were showcased. The **Department of Botany** and the students of **Add-on Course in Floriculture and Landscaping** under the aegis of **MCM Eco Club** organized an awareness activity titled 'Maintain your Pots' on January 30, 2022. The activity was performed by 20 students under the guidance of Dr. Gunjan Sud and Ms. Kajal Loria. It aimed to create awareness among the students regarding proper hydration of pots appropriate soil mixture, manures and fertilizers, maintaining adequate humidity and selection of pot size for different kinds of plants.

The **Department of Botany** and the Add-on Course in **Floriculture and Landscaping** organized a one-day field trip to National Cactus and Succulent Botanical Garden, Sector-5, Panchkula on November 30, 2021. (Medical) to learn about the career avenues available in the field of forensic science. SOCIAL OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

PLANTATION OF TREES

NSS volunteers planted saplings of fruit-bearing trees like lemon, kat-hal, anaar, amrud, jamun and mausami apart from air purifying plants such as ficus. These saplings were procured from the Department of Forest and Wildlife, UT Administration, Chandigarh, in the premises of Government Model High School and Anganwadi Multiple Complex, Sector 41-D, Village Badheri, Chandigarh (U.T.) on July 1, 2021 to mark the celebration of Van Mahotsava.

ANTI-PLASTIC DRIVE

The volunteers of the **Character Building Committee** carried out an Anti-Plastic drive in Sector 36, Chandigarh on October 5 and 6, 2021. The objective of the event was to create awareness regarding the negative impact of using plastic items. To celebrate Diwali in its true spirit, **NSS volunteers** organized a Donation Drive and a Visit to the Institute for the Blind, Chandigarh on October 19 and November 16, 2022 NSS volunteers, members of teaching faculty and non-teaching staff contributed generously to the fund which was later donated vide a cheque favouring 'Society for the Care of the Blind' to be utilized for the welfare of blind students in the best possible way.



A Donation Drive of woollen clothes was organized on December 20, 2021 by the **Character Building Committee** on the occasion of International Human Solidarity Day, for the underprivileged people in sector 15 and sector 37 of Chandigarh. The objective of the Drive was to sensitize the students about the difficulties faced by these people and also to make them appreciate their own blessings.

The **Medical Committee** in collaboration with **NSS Units** organized an Oral Hygiene Camp in their adopted village Badheri on March 8, 2022 as a part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'. The resource person, Dr. Anupam Upall, a noted dentist, shed light on the importance of oral health and discussed several oral hygiene practices one should adopt during one's daily routine. In this camp, more than 50 residents including women and girls were examined and benefited. NSS volunteers assisted Dr. Anupam and encouraged residents to follow proper oral hygiene.



DONATE A PAD

The **Women Development Cell** conducted a sanitary pad collection drive 'Donate a Pad' for the underprivileged women of slum area of sector 25, Chandigarh to mark the International Women's Day



celebrations. Sanitary pads collected during this drive held on March 3-4, 2022 were distributed to the underprivileged women of slum area in Sector 25, Chandigarh. A Nukkad Natak was also performed on the menstrual hygiene and its importance for class IV employees. Students also interacted with these women and spread awareness about the importance of menstrual hygiene. 15 students and 3 teachers participated in this drive.

RESEARCH INITIATIVES

The College received grants worth Rs. 4,17,965/- under various schemes from various government and non-government funding agencies to create state-of-the-art laboratories and to encourage faculty and students to carry out innovative research. Seed funding of Rs. 20 Lakhs has been allocated by DAV Managing Committee, New Delhi to promote interdisciplinary research projects and publications in UGC Care Listed/ SCOPUS/ Web of Science indexed journals among faculty and students. Travel grant and re-imbursement of Registration fee is also offered for participation in national and international conferences. In the session 2021-2022, 19 teachers published books with ISBN number, 12 teachers contributed chapters in edited books, and 29 teachers published research papers in UGC listed journals.

The College gave a grant of Rs. 1,06,000/- to the members of faculty and students in the session 2021-2022 to conduct various research projects on the topics relevant for the societal development. The College undertook a research project on Water Conservation titled '**Impact of Concrete Canal Lining on Water Conservation: A Socio Economic Evaluation of JLN Feeder submitted to Irrigation and Water Resources Department, Haryana, Panchkula**' this project was completed in 12 months by Dr. Nisha Bhargava, Principal of the college, Dr. Manika Kohli and Dr. Mamta Ratti from the Department of Commerce with the grant of Rs. 34,000/-. Another research project was conducted on Solid Waste Management titled '**Solid Waste Management: A Study of Household Practices and Perception among Residents in the City Beautiful**' with Dr. Nisha Bhargava as principal investigator, and Dr. Mamta Ratti from the Department of Commerce, and Dr. Minakshi Rana from the Department of Sociology as associate investigators. The project was completed in 12 months with the grant of Rs. 50,000. The College also funded a research project on the importance of soft skills under NEP 2020. The title of project was '**An Undergraduate Course on Soft Skills-Need, Scope and Modalities of Implementation: A Step from Vision to Reality for NEP 2020.**'

It was conducted by Dr. Aparna Sharma, Department of English in 12 months with the research funding of Rs. 20,000/-. From the Department of Sociology, Dr. Bhavna Sood completed a study titled '**From a Risk Society to a Resilient Society**' in 4 months and was awarded Rs. 2000/- for this research project.

INTERACTION WITH ALUMNI

RENDEZVOUS AND REMINISCENCES

The Annual Alumni Meet was organized on 2 June 2022 in the College wherein more than a hundred alumni participated. Dr Bharti Uppal, Retd Professor, Biochemistry and Associate Medical Superintendent, CMC Ludhiana - an alumna of the College from the 1977 batch, was the Chief Guest at the event. Dr. Uppal donated an amount of Rs. 1 lakh to the College as a mark of gratitude towards her alma mater. Ms Sharandeep Kaur, IAS and Ms Gursimranjeet Kaur, PCS were present as Guests of Honour. The event was also attended by illustrious alumni of the College including Ms. Neeru Bali, an entrepreneur; Ms Renuka Salwan, Associate Professor, Department of Mass Communication, Panjab University, Chandigarh; Ms Jasmeet Shan, a choreographer, and Ms Kimmi Dhanoa, Vice Principal, Vivek High School, Chandigarh. 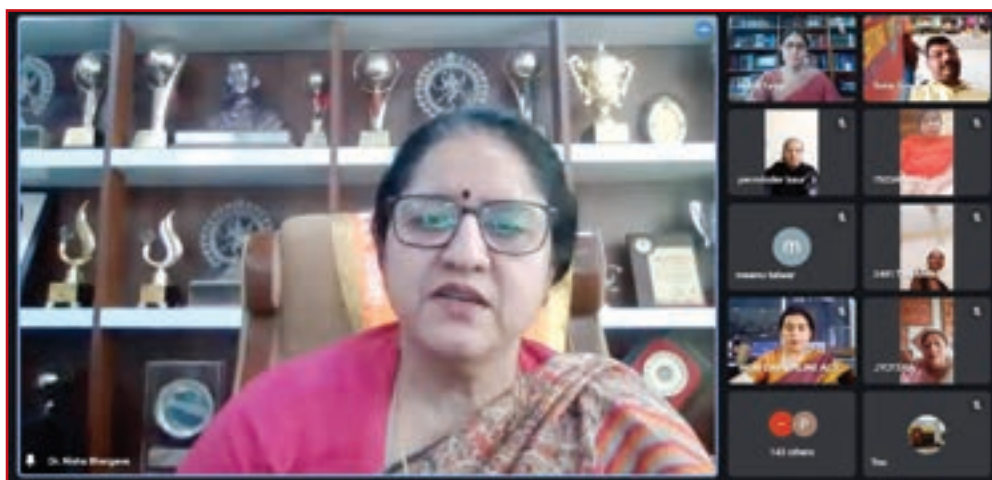

INTERACTION WITH STAKEHOLDERS

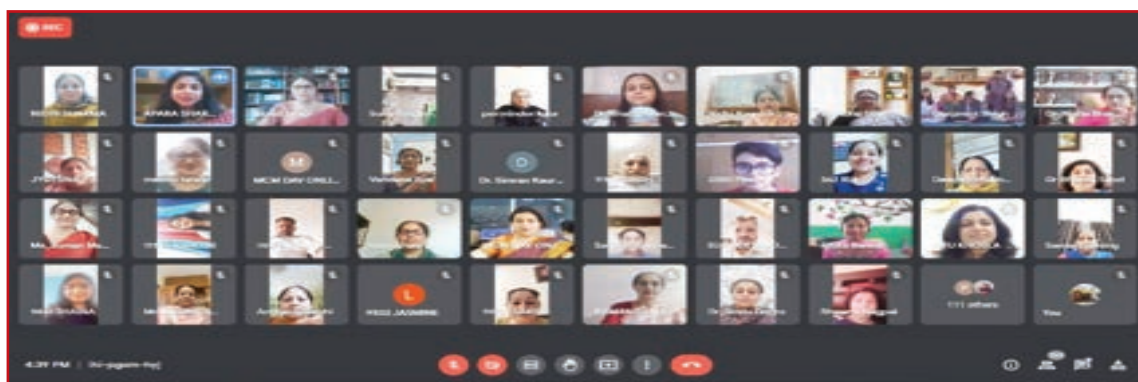
PARENT TEACHER MEETING
