



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About the College

Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women is a prestigious institution of higher learning in Chandigarh which has completed 54 glorious years of its inception. The College has rendered stellar services in the fields of education, sports, culture, sustainable development, community welfare and empowerment in its illustrious 5 decade-existence. The College diligently upholds the ethics and ethos of the DAV fraternity alongside a culture of innovation, technological expansion and scientific temper.

Re-accredited with Grade "A" by NAAC the college was also identified as Mentor Institution by NAAC to formally induct non-accredited colleges. The college has been accorded the Star Status by Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, and has ranked in the band 101-150 as per NIRF Rankings consecutively for two years in 2021 and 2022. MCM DAV is also the first private-aided College in the city to be approved as a Research Centre in the subject of English by Panjab University, Chandigarh. The College continues to figure prominently in annual listings of the best colleges of India by various national dailies and magazines and ranks among top 50 colleges in India, as per the surveys conducted by The Tribune, India Today and The Week magazine. Faculty members as well as students are engaged in various National and International research projects, many of them being multi and inter-disciplinary.

The College has the distinction of consistently securing top 10 positions in Panjab University Examinations and our students bagged 160 top ten positions in the Panjab University Examinations 2021-22. We are also the undisputed winner of the prestigious All Round Panjab University Women's General Efficiency Trophy in Sports 40 times since the inception of the College in 1968. The College also has the outstanding accomplishment of being nominated by the Ministry of Food Processing Industry, Government of India, as the only state level technical institution for providing training in food processing.

Besides a Panjab University affiliated Research Centre in English providing PhD, currently, the College houses 8 postgraduate, 6 undergraduate, 13 honours degree programs, 2 postgraduate diplomas, and 6 Add-on courses. The courses, BVoc in Retail Management and Diploma Course in Microbial Analysis and Food Safety were introduced in the college in 2020, under the aegis of UGC-NSQF. The former opens up employment prospects in the fields of Retail outlets and Supply chain and logistics firms among various other avenues, while the latter intends to prepare skilled professionals for food Safety analysis and quality management professionals in the Food Sector.

The teaching methodology at the College follows a student-centric and holistic learning approach and is extremely adaptive keeping in view the requirements of the times. In sync with the New Education Policy, the college is now making skill development and Vocational education essential components of pedagogy. The college is a

Recognized Vocational Education Nai Talim Experiential Learning (VENTEL) Action Plan Institution under the Ministry of Education and has constituted the working groups for Vocational Education. With a view to adopt and integrate the directives and principles of the National Education Policy 2020, the college constituted the Character - Building Committee in 2020, which works for the holistic development of students. The various committees and clubs of the College make it a vibrant and intellectual space for inculcating life skills. The Skill Development Committee is one such committee, established under the flagship scheme of Government of India, 'Skill India' which aims to enhance the skill quotient of the youth and frequently conducts workshops that provide hands-on training and knowledge on fields ranging from meditation and good health to self-defence and sustainable urban farming. The college has been selected by MHRD for creating and promoting a culture of innovation and received a 4 Star Rating by Innovation Cell, MHRD, GOI, in 2020. Besides this, the Ministry of Food Processing Industry, GOI, nominated the college as the only state level technical institution for providing training in bakery and food processing in 2021 under which one batch of training has been completed. The Placement Cell of the College actively organises recruitment drives and arranges internship opportunities as per the needs and aspirations of the final year students.

The College is actively engaged in carrying out various social, environmental and educational outreach activities through committees like Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat, Swacch Bharat Abhiyan and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan besides the NSS and NCC.Besides this, MGNCRE, MHRD (under the Swachh Bharat Mission-Gramin), selected MCM DAV College as one of the HEI among 40,000 existing in India to transform the infrastructural and unhygienic sociocultural habitat of its neighbourhood villages through community engagement activities. The College was also nominated by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education, MHRD, GOI, as a Swachhta Action Plan Institution, in the year 2020. The UBA Cell of the College was also awarded a letter of appreciation by NITTTR, Chandigarh for rendering exemplary service and conducting various social outreach activities in its adopted villages, in the fields of environment, education and health. The college is a proud recipient of Swachh Prerak Samman in 2022. It also has the distinction of getting the Best Eco Club and Best Herbal Garden award award for two consecutive years in 2022 and 2023. The College has also received the best NSS unit award from Panjab University for the year 2018 and from DHE, UT, for the year 2022. Our College was recently awarded the National Rural Institutions Sustainability Award.

The College continues to remain committed in its objectives of nurturing its students to become women of substance and high moral values having a strong connectedness with their society and environment.

Leave Rules

Regular Attendance in class is compulsory and forms a part of the evaluation for Internal Assessment.





A relaxation of 5% marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/ Differently-abled and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time, or for those who had obtained their Master's degree prior to 19th September 1991. The eligibility marks of 55% (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) and the relaxation of 5% to the categories mentioned above are permissible based only on the qualifying marks without including the grace mark procedure.

- approved, recognized or authorized by an authority established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country for the purpose of assessing accrediting or assuring quality and standards of educational institutions, shall be eligible for admission to PhD programme.
- 7. The candidates who have MPhil degree from Panjab University and after taking admission to MPhil based on entrance test will be eligible to take admission to PhD programme without the entrance test. However, such candidates would have to qualify the interview. Candidates having MPhil degree from any other institution/agency/university shall have to seek admission in PhD programme through its normal admission process like entrance test followed by the interview.

Rules for Migration at the time of admission

 - o They are from a University other than Panjab University.

Rules for Local/Inter College Migration

- Obtained at least 25 percent marks in aggregate of all the subjects in the MST conducted by the College.
- Students with practical subjects / BCom cannot appear privately.
 Such students who do not qualify the MST would be detained for a year.
- In practical subjects a student must obtain at least 25 per cent marks in theory and practical examination separately.

Note: MST /Final Examination/ Practical Examination will be conducted as per guidelines of Panjab University, Chandigarh, because the college follows the Academic Calendar issued by Panjab University.














Hannah Onahi Peter, Nigeria (West Africa)
