







Business Plan/Prototype Competition to Invite Innovative Business Models from Students (8 February 2021)








Workshop on Entrepreneurship & Innovation as Career opportunity (27 November 2021)







Industrial Cum Field Visit to Global Apiaries India, Dera Bassi (22 February 2022)

Department of Zoology under the aegis of Institution's Innovation Council and MCM Vigyan Manch organized an industrial cum field visit to Global Apiaries India, Dera Bassi on 22 February, 2022 for the students of B.Sc-III Medical. The field visit was organized to make the students understand the problems faced in establishing a successful Apiary. The students asked various questions from the officials in the company. 20 students and 3 faculty members went for the field visit.


Sh. Madan Sharma, the Proprietor of the firm shared his entrepreneurial journey and motivated the students to go for start-ups in beekeeping. He said that beekeeping is a technology that is simple, easily accessible and affordable, especially in rural areas. A number of small-scale industries depend upon bees and bee products. Honey and bee products find use in several industries such as pharmaceuticals, bees wax industries, bee venom, royal jelly, bee nurseries, bee equipment and hives etc. He emphasized that beekeeping is not only a source of honey and a variety of beehive products but it also enhances the productivity of crops due to better pollination and seed setting. There is a vast scope for expansion of beekeeping in India because we need at least 3 colonies/ha in crops and 5/ha in forests for pollination. Further he said that honeybees are affected by large number of viral, bacterial and protozoan organisms, ecto and endoparasitic mites, insects and non-insect enemies. The success of beekeeping depends upon proper understanding of the biology and behaviour of honeybees, their scientific management techniques including methodologies to combat various maladies like diseases and enemies. In spite of great potential of beekeeping in India, apiculture research in India and its gainful utilization has not yet received the required impetus and is far below the available resources. At the end he concluded that there is a need for undertaking scientific beekeeping in increasing honey production and pollination of crops. He motivated the students to apply their scientific knowledge and to explore the potential of biotechnological interventions for improving the quality and quantity of products.




Workshop on Entrepreneurship Skill, Attitude and Behaviour Development (3 March 2022)

He also emphasized on the need to identify, validate the concepts and make customer relations. Gaining loyalty of a customer is an asset for a good entrepreneur. In order to develop an innovative ecosystem in an institution, there is a need to have cost benefit, technical benefit and strategic fit analysis. Also discussed the importance of more experiments and business plans for successful innovations. The session was very informative and interesting and well received by the participants. The students actively participated in the session by raising various questions and discussing their doubts with the resource person. They gained a lot of information on the government measures to support startups and how to tackle failures in the entrepreneurship journey. Overall, the session was very informative and insightful for the students aiming to be successful entrepreneurs with innovation skills.









Idea Competition (09 March 2022)





10. Workshop Cum Mock Drill on Fire Fighting

Date: 24 March 2022

Number of NSS Volunteers participated: 100

Objectives:

- To sensitize the volunteers about the necessary steps taken during a fire outbreak
- To demonstrate and give hands-on exposure to the handling of different types of fire extinguishers

The Context: Fires not only destroy property but cause injuries, and cost lives. With proper training in basic fire-fighting techniques, one can eliminate fire hazards and respond quickly and efficiently, thus helping in preventing small fires from becoming big



emergencies. As a committed NSS volunteer, one must know what to and how to do in case of a fire hazard. With this objective, a Workshop cum Mock Drill on Fire Fighting was organized under the supervision of NSS Programme Officers – Dr. Pallvi Rani and Dr. Purnima Bhandari and Dr. Anju Lata (Co-Convenor, Disaster Management Committee) and Ms. Baljeet Kaur Tiwana (Dean, Hostel) on Day 3 of Seven Day/Night NSS Special Camp— 2022.

The Practice: Considering the need of the hour to deal with fire hazards, a Workshop cum Mock Drill on Fire Fighting by Leading Fire Man (LFM) Bhupinder Singh and Team from Fire Station, Sector 38, Chandigarh was organized in the third session by NSS Units in collaboration with Disaster



Management Committee of the college. During the workshop, LFM Bhupinder Singh demonstrated the correct techniques for using fire extinguishers during emergency. He informed the volunteers about the dos and don'ts of the fire safety norms, types of fire hazard and ways to control fire outbreak. 

Dr. Manika explained how the concept of Business Model Canvas is an essential step for entrepreneurship and start-up. 



The students actively participated in the session and found the session very interesting and informative.







Online Awareness Session on Accelerators/Incubators- Opportunities for Students and Faculty (Early-Stage Entrepreneurs) (27 May 2021)

An online awareness session on 'Accelerators/Incubators- Opportunities for Students and Faculty (Early-Stage Entrepreneurs)' was organized by the IIC, Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women on 27 May 2021 to familiarize students with the role of accelerators and incubators in promoting entrepreneurship. The resource person for the session was Mr. Satyendra Singh, Chief Executive Officer-Technology Business Incubator at IISER Mohali. As many as 268 students from undergraduate and graduate streams of sciences and 18 faculty members attended the session. Mr. Satyendra Singh introduced the concept of entrepreneurship to the participants by discussing various factors, risks and rewards associated with creating a start-up. The participants were briefed about the personal and social barriers they need to overcome and the qualities they require to develop in order to see their start-ups thrive. Mr. Singh continued by talking in detail about business incubators and their significance in overcoming the numerous hurdles an entrepreneur might face during the early stages of his/her venture. He discussed the active involvement of the Government of India in encouraging and motivating people to come up with ideas and creating start-ups that would contribute to the community. He highlighted that India is ranked 2nd among global start-up systems. This is due to the fact that the Government of India has set up numerous accelerators/incubators in educational institutes all over the country so as to motivate students to come up with creative start-up ideas and to make the process of setting up and building a successful start-up easier. He informed that there are several schemes available specifically for women which would help them with their business planning. Mr. Singh gave a list of academic incubators in and around Chandigarh which included the incubator at IISER Mohali -iRISE (Raising Innovative and Sustainable Enterprises). He encouraged students as well as the faculty members to be creative and innovative, and come up with sustainable ideas which would help the community grow and improve. The session ended with an interactive question and answer session round with all the participants. Mr. Singh encouraged participants to send their innovative

ideas to him through IIC of the college to further explore the opportunities that they can avail.







Webinar on Lean Startup and Minimum Viable Product or Business (27 May 2021)

An online session was conducted by the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC 3.0) on the topic "Lean Startup and Minimum Viable Product/Business". The resource person for the lecture was Prof (Dr.) Raj Kumar Singh, Dean (R&D), HOD (Department of Commerce) and Chairperson (Centre for Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Skill Development), School of Management Sciences, Varanasi. A total of 129 students and 12 faculty members attended the webinar through Google meet link and YouTube live streaming platform. The lecture provided a thorough insight into the meaning of lean startup and how it is different from start up. The resource person also discussed the need for more startups in a developing country like India where the percentage of successful startups is just 10 percent and around 70 percent of the businesses fail to second generation and around 90 percent to third generation due to lack of innovation, feasibility analysis, poor succession planning, etc. The resource person also emphasized the need for startups as economic growth drivers, employment generators, skill and service development measures, increasing exports, balanced regional development, etc.

Further, the speaker discussed that the right way to do Minimum Viable Product or business (MVP) is to add value to the products. He supported his statement with example of manufacturing cycle first and then adding value to it in form of a normal motorcycle and then its modified forms. According to the speaker, the correct way to plan Minimum Viable Product is through identification and understanding the problem. Further, various real life examples were also discussed on lean startups and Minimum Viable Product to which the students could easily relate to. The speaker also emphasized on design thinking for innovation for lean startups. The students actively participated in the session. They raised various questions and discussed their doubts with the speaker and found the session very informative and interesting. Overall, it was an extremely interactive and insightful session where students acquired enormous knowledge and information on lean startups and Minimum Viable Product/Business supported with various practical examples. This lecture was certainly of great help for the students aiming to create lean startups and

entrepreneurship ventures.



Webinar on Intellectual Property Rights and Patents (28 May 2021)

A session was conducted by the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC 3.0) on the topic 'Intellectual Property Rights and Patents'. The resource person for the event was Mr. Rakesh Kumar Kushwaha, Assistant Controller of Patents and Designs of Electrical Section in Indian Patent Office, New Delhi under the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, GOI. A total of 153 students and 5 faculty members attended the event through Google Meet and YouTube live streaming platform. The session provided a thorough insight to the students into the points on which patent jurisdiction focuses for clearing any patent file, and rights granted to the creators of patents through practical examples. The session also apprised the students on how important prototype validation is to pitch one's business idea to prospective investors. Further, various real life examples were discussed by the speaker to illustrate various IPR's connected with an item. Students also gained knowledge about the different criteria which an invention should have to file it as a patent. The session equipped the students with the knowledge of steps to file a patent, fee structure, time to grant a patent, different stages a file passes through and what rights are associated with it. Overall, the session was very interactive and insightful.







Webinar on Angel Investment-Venture Capital Funding Opportunities for Early Stage Entrepreneurs (29 May 2021)

A webinar was conducted by the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC 3.0) on the topic 'Angel Investing/Venture Capital Funding Opportunities for Early Stage Entrepreneurs'. The resource person for the event was Mr. Dinesh Duggal, Ex-Banker and Freelancer. A total of 260 students and 06 faculty members attended the event through Google Meet and YouTube live streaming platform. The resource person made the participants aware about various funding options for early stage entrepreneurs such as, angel investing, venture capital, crowd funding, etc. The resource person also demonstrated the role of venture capital in the innovation ecosystem. Online awareness sessions by Innovation Ambassadors to promote Innovation and Entrepreneurship among Youth (28 June 2021)

On 28 June 2021, Innovation Ambassador's online awareness sessions were organized for internal college students. Innovation Ambassadors of IIC 3.0 @MCM: Dr Indu Arora and Dr Neetu delivered sessions to promote innovation and entrepreneurship among youth. Around 14 Faculty members and 91 students attended the sessions.



Session 1 Topic: Entrepreneurship Development

Resource Person: Dr Indu Arora (Vice President & Innovation Ambassador, IIC 3.0 and HOD, Department of Computer Science and Applications, Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh)

Dr. Indu Arora, Associate Professor, Innovation Ambassador IIC 3.0 and Head of the Department of Computer Science and Applications, was the resource person for the first session. She emphasized on the importance of entrepreneurship by illustrating stories of eminent entrepreneurs like Dhirubhai Ambani, Karsanbhai Patel, Ramesh Babu, Patricia Narayan, Narayan Murthy and Dr. Verghese Kurien. The session accentuated on being an entrepreneur, though compared to a salaried employee, the working hours are long, risks are more, income generation is a slow process but it leads to self-reliance, the path of Atam Nirbhar Bharat. Dr. Indu Arora explained that the success of an entrepreneur depends on the business, technology, ownership and size of business. It demands a creative mind, self-discipline and persistence. The session highlighted the journey of an idea to a business. The stages involved in the process were discussed like conceiving the idea, validation, defining problem and potential solutions, finding mentors or community, target group, writing a business plan and determining capital need. To be an entrepreneur, the need to set up goals and embrace failures were the focal points of the session. The session was very stimulating and motivating for the students.

Session 2 Topic: Pre-Incubation and Incubation Management

Resource Person: Dr. Neetu (Convenor and Innovation Ambassdor IIC 3.0 and HOD, Department of Zoology, Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh)

The second session under the IIC Online Awareness sessions was conducted by Innovation Ambassador, Dr. Neetu. Dr. Neetu explained the role and importance of pre-incubation and incubation processes as catalysts for innovative entrepreneurs. In the Ideation stage, the ideas need proper nurturing and hand-holding, and incubation centres are established to cater to the needs of the budding start-ups. In a very interesting manner, Dr. Neetu used the analogy of incubation of an egg by hen to explain the meaning of business incubation. She distinguished between the role and meaning of Pre-incubation and Incubation using comparative approach. In the Pre-incubation stage, ideas are vague and need to be streamlined. This stage uses minimum resources; is of short duration; and leads to the prototype stage. On the other hand, in the Incubation stage, there is a flow of ideas with a clear path of progress including the proof of concept. This stage includes

multiple resources, is longer in duration, and leads to Intellectual Property and Prior-to-Scale stage. Dr. Neetu elaborated on the crucial role of institutions to act as innovation drivers and devise mechanisms to ensure maximum exposure to the students through idea contests, hackathons, seminars, conferences, etc. Her presentation gave an insight into the requirements for successful Pre-incubation stage and who can undergo pre-incubation program. The services included in this stage comprise idea screening and refinement, guided mentoring to make idea bankable, progressive evaluation, access to internet and networking. The session also covered a brief history of Business incubation having its roots in the U.S. in 1959. In this highly informative session, Dr. Neetu clearly explained key factors for selecting start-up ideas and the importance of access to funding through agencies like Angel Networks. Her session also included a list of Central Government Institutions for start-up growth and some agencies like Her & Now, Dhriti, Nexus and Start-up Oasis which support women entrepreneurs. Dr. Neetu concluded her session by explaining points regarding the selection of right start-up incubators. Overall, the session was quite beneficial and insightful for the students aiming at creating start-ups and entrepreneurial ventures.









• Webinar on Importance of profession ready training in clinical research, Pharmacovigilance, Data management and other domains held by the Department of Botany on 9.6.2021

Workshop on Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Macro Economic Variables Conducted by Postgraduate Department of Economics 7 November 2019



The Postgraduate Department of Economics of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women organized a one-day workshop titled 'Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Macro Economic Variables' here today. The Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) sponsored workshop witnessed enthusiastic participation of 50 students. Spread over 3 invigorating sessions, the workshop had Ms. Ritu Singal, MD, Raglan Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd. and Winner Nippon Leatherette Pvt. Ltd., Mr. Vivek Atray, Former IAS, author and motivational speaker, and Prof. Suman Makkar, Prof. of Economics, Department of Evening Studies, PU as the resource persons.

Interwoven with examples from her own inspiring entrepreneurial journey, Ms. Singal's lecture motivated the participants to adopt an out of box approach and promote ideas that can resolve the problems of the masses. Right from product development, finance to marketing the product, Ms. Singal touched upon the practical problems that an entrepreneur faces and suggested solutions for the same.

Speaking on attributes of an entrepreneur, Mr. Atray reiterated that creativity, risk taking ability, resilience, determination, self-belief, interpersonal skills and right attitude are the ingredients for success. In a lively lecture tempered with anecdotes, he stressed on the importance of innovation in entrepreneurship and urged the participants to develop their entrepreneurial acumen through an innovative approach to the problems of the society.

Prof. Makkar discussed Schumpeter's theory on innovations, highlighting the crucial role of innovations and that of an entrepreneur in the development of an economy. The views were supported by the mathematical presentation of the model depicting the role of the various economic indicators such as saving, investment amongst others to achieve development.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava complimented the Department of Economics for igniting the young minds to contribute towards nation building. She added that such workshops are of essence for nation's economic growth as these educate the youth to acquire new knowledge and skills as well as sensitise and guide them about ways of tackling the existing problems faced by the economy.

Leadership Talk Series-"Innovation for Resurgent India"

Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College, Chandigarh participated in the India first leadership talk series on 22nd August, 2019. The theme of the talk was "Innovation for Resurgent India". It was delivered online by Honourable Minister of HRD Dr. Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank'. College Venue for attending this talk was Lab 1 of Department of Computer Science and Applications. 76 students and 12 faculty members attended this talk.

Dr. Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank' addressed the questions of students on different areas including education policy, innovation and start-ups, career development, employability, digitization of education and how students and educational institutes can contribute towards the national mission. He focused on the importance of education in a person's life and mentioned about the reformations that have been implemented or are yet to be made in the education system of India.

He focused that the new education policy of India is based on moral virtues, behaviour, vocational education, science and research. He spoke about the importance of Sanskrit in the field of science and education and cited various ancient Indian scientists. He pointed out that different programmes like Make in India, Digital India, Skilled India and Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana are focusing on employability and overall development of the nation.

On the aspect of affordability of education to the students, he justified that free education is given to children up to 14 years of age and there is also availability of scholarships to the students. He revealed that the budget kept for education has also been increased to 125000 crore rupees. He further added that the students can contribute towards national missions like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan by saving at least 1 liter water per day, stopping littering and by planting at least one tree on their birthday.

He also shared his life experiences and focused on the value of hard work, team work and

determination in one's life. He also explained that one should not get demotivated by

failures as failures still give knowledge and a person who has at least tried will always be ahead of those who have never tried. Difficulties give success and positivity is required to be successful in your life. All you need is the power to change your vision to your mission.

Lecture on "Social Entrepreneurship"

The Post Graduate Department of Sociology in collaboration with the Institution Innovation Council (IIC) under the aegis of MOE's Innovation Cell (MIC), organized a lecture on "Social Entrepreneurship" on **26th November**, **2019**. Professor Rajesh Gill from the Department of Sociology, Panjab University delivered this lecture which was attended by 57 students and 76 faculty members.

The session was very enriching as she gave real life examples based on her research in rural area and was stressing on the importance of being gender sensitive and that we need to be the change agents if we want to see a change in the society. So, the need of the hour is to merge social work with entrepreneurship.







Idea Competition

An "Idea Competition" was organized on 6th March 2020 to provide students a platform to use their creativity to develop social and technological innovations, cost-effective and practical solutions for addressing the everyday problems. 38 teams participated in the competition and their ideas ranged from the field of waste management, technological innovation, agriculture, sustainable development, healthcare to biomedical devices.

The competition had two rounds- the pre-screening round and the final round. 10 teams were shortlisted from the pre-screening round for the final round by the pre-screening committee. The final round of the competition was judged by Dr. Gurmeet Kaur Nanda, Principal Associate (Patents), IIPRD and Khurana & Khurana Advocates and IP Attorneys, and Dr. Yogesh Nagpal, Co-founder and Head of Operations - Winsome IP.

The first prize was awarded to Ms. Aditi Bhagat of BSc MFT III for her presentation on "Mycofoam Packaging- an alternative to Styrofoam Packaging". Ms. Peeyushi Grewal of BA III bagged second prize for her presentation on "Running Electronically powered Vehicles with Super Capacitors" while third prize winner was conferred on Ms. Deepakshi Rawal and Manpreet Kaur from BCA I on their innovative method for "Waste Management".

Awardees of Idea Competition were continually guided and mentored By Dr. Neetu to participate in next level of competition i.e. Proof of Concept (POC) submission. The submitted POCs were evaluated by an external IPR expert Dr. Gurmeet Nanda and were uploaded on MIC portal. The students were motivated to participate in Prototype Submission Competition.

Activity 2: Lecture on Happiness and Swachh Mann Abhiyan





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The second event of the day began with a talk by Dr. Nitasha Khehra, Assistant professor in the PG Department of Psychology, Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College, Chandigarh who started the interaction by sharing some facts about happiness and reports by WHO, where Finland is ranked as the happiest country in the world. She told the students that mental illness should not be treated as a social stigma; instead, it should be talked freely. She laid emphasis on depression, which is widespread nowadays. She highlighted the importance of a rich diet and sufficient intake of water for a healthy mind. She encouraged students to have self -talks, stop negative thoughts and understand that there are things, which are outside our control and must be accepted the way they are.

Objective: The objective of this lecture was to promote Swachh Mann Abhiyan i.e. to inculcate various characteristics in one's life like spiritual balance, optimistic approach towards solving problems, learn to face the realities, self-criticism, self- compassion, prioritize things that matter, have patience, to live in the present moment, to nurture our creative abilities and most importantly how to heal oneself.

The highlights of the session were as follows:

- Inculcation of spiritual balance, which helps oneself to stay focused and concentrated in one's life by merely connecting oneself with god
- Inculcation of optimistic approach towards solving problems that not only lessens our daily burden but also helps in dealing with difficulties
- Learning to face the realities gives us inner strength and helps us to expect less
- Self-criticism is necessary to evaluate oneself and know our strengths and weaknesses
- Self- compassion, one should treat oneself tenderly and with patience while suffering

- Prioritize things that matter and cut-short what is least important in life
- Have patience while dealing with self and others
- How to train one's mind to live in present
- To nurture our creative abilities and let them help to evolve us
- How to heal oneself after going through a tough situation

Methodology: Dr. Nitasha Khehra emphasized on the importance of psychological wellbeing and resilience. She explained that the leading cause of depression is perfectionism and at times parenting, and also major cause of increasing number of suicides. The lecture was made even more interactive with discussions of case studies. She explained the volunteers through many life examples the importance of a healthy diet in controlling mood swings. She emphasized that the use of drugs to deal with depression is not a solution; rather it leads to psychological addiction. She concluded the session by stressing on the importance of reading and self-introspection. The resource person motivated the volunteers by guiding them towards their future endeavours and how to tackle any problem and not to feel low. The session was concluded with doubt clearing session.

Impact: The volunteers felt empowered with optimism that helped them to have different perspectives in life, towards oneself and others. It was a fruitful session with an aim to bring out the capabilities of the volunteers. The meditation session held later had a tranquilizing effect on the audience. As a result of this activity, everybody learnt the qualities of selfevaluation, self-compassion, self-healing, self-love and such attributes helped the volunteers to develop themselves wholly. This session was the foundation for all other activities as it gave an energetic and a positive push to the volunteers for their active participation.

Activity 3: Rehearsal for Cultural Practices

In the afternoon session, teamwork and coordination were clearly visible as volunteers geared up for the cultural dance event for the Valedictory day. The volunteers were full of enthusiasm and zeal as the dress rehearsals of the entire cultural programme was done. This session intended to achieve perfection in the cultural performances in order to put forth a successful show in the valedictory event. Later, in the evening session, the volunteers made posters to depict the vivacity of the culture, tradition and ethnicity of Dadra and Nagar Haveli under the Flagship programme 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat'. This initiative not only increased the unity among the volunteers, but also filled them with a sense of pride and respect for the richness of our culture and heritage.

SESSION 2018-19

Mentoring is a valuable strategy to provide students with the emotional and psychological support students need to achieve their academic as well as extra-curricular goals during the college degree. By providing information, guidance, and encouragement, mentors' role is integral to nurturing students' college aspirations, helping them prepare for challenges ahead, leading them to the threshold of success and ultimately better graduate outcome.

NATURE

The Mentorship Meet is an institutionalized and organized program for which one hour is squeezed out and accommodated during the college hours. The Meet scheduled once a month for each class is reaping rich fruits in terms of students attendance and participation in the same. The benefits of the Mentorship Program are conspicuous in the warmth, cordiality and sense of belongingness engendered in the mentors as well as mentees.

METHODOLOGY

Assessing our previous year's feedback and tracing our steady growth, some changes have been made in the criteria of assigning the mentees to their mentors. In the current session, mentors have been assigned new students in addition to the previous students. However, mentors and mentees are not unknown to each other; rather the students have already been taught by these teachers. They have been purposely matched to each other in the larger interests of the students where the students can have a better comfort level and air of ease with the mentor. This approach

has witnessed students shedding off their inhibitions and sharing their personal as well as academic problems with the mentor unencumbered by any psychological constraint.
