The barks of Paper Mulberry yield a fiber which is used in papermaking. In Polynesia paper mulberry is used manufacturing of a coarse fabric called Tapa cloth.

COMMON USES

- 1. The fibre from the inner bark is of very good quality and is used for making high quality cloth, rope and paper.
- 2. The fabric is produced by beating strips of bark on flat surface with a wooden mallet.
- 3. A very fine cloth is made from this fibre, the more its bark is beaten, the better becomes the quality of the cloth.
- 4. Its fruit is edible.
