**FUN FACT** 

The wood of the dead trees undergo metamorphosis due to the crystallization of resin which makes it brightly coloured and aromatic with a brittle, glassy feel. Known as jhukti, it is easy to ignite.

**COMMON USES** 

- 1. It is extensively planted for timber.
- 2. The wood is not preferred for building purposes, as it is the weakest and most prone to decay.
- 3. When the girth of the tree large, then the bark forms flat patches thus it has a layered structure but individual layers have no grain.
- 4. The green needle leaves are used to make hand brooms.
- 5. It isplanted in parks and gardens, as it can tolerate heat and drought well.
