12 October 2022: Inaugural Session



An Introduction to Research: Emerging Areas in Academic Scholarship'

Principal Dr Nisha Bhargava welcomed the resource person for the session, Prof Akshaya Kumar, Chairperson, Department of English and Cultural Studies, Panjab University, Chandigarh and extended her warm wishes to the Department of English for taking this academic initiative.



In the inaugural lecture, 'An Introduction to Research: Emerging Areas in Academic Scholarship', Prof Akshaya Kumar introduced the research scholars, students and other participants on the latest and emerging trends in research. Prof Kumar discussed the multiple possibilities in research in the English departments, like AI, Biological threats, Environmental Issues, Digital Humanities along with a flux of sociological and cultural areas.

He emphasised on the importance of experimental, original and systematic research. He urged students not to take research just as a matter of course, rather to be alert enough to find new possibilities of research.

Prof Akshaya Kumar underlined the importance of integrity and honesty in research. He motivated the students to think and re-think of research areas through an original gaze to find new possibilities. The highly informative inaugural session by Prof Akshaya Kumar set the tone for the upcoming sessions and gave the necessary impetus to our participants and budding researchers.

14th October 2022: Open Educational Resources and Research

Second session of the Workshop on Research Methodology (October 2022) saw Dr.Neeraj Kumar Singh, Deputy Librarian, AC Joshi Library, Panjab University, Chandigarh, as the resource person for the session on 14th October, 2022. Dr.Neeraj delivered a very informative and enlightening talk on "Open Educational Resources and Research" which centeredaround a very pertinent problem faced by young researchers in accessing and making optimum use of open educational resources like MOOCs, EPG Pathshala, etc.



Dr Neeraj Singh started his talk by highlighting the importance of online courses in the current teaching learning process. He also demystified popular perceptions regarding the copyrights and Creative Commons License. Dr. Neeraj encouraged the students to avail themselves of various freely available educational resources and raised awareness among them by giving handy tips and list of such resources for a ready reference.

15 October 2022: Structure of Dissertation

After an introduction to the importance of Research and need for accessing academic resources, the third day of workshop by Dr.Meenu Gupta an Associate Professor in the Dept. of English and Cultural Studies, Panjab was on 'Structure of Dissertation' on 15th October 2022. She dealt with the ABC of technical writing of dissertation for Postgraduate students. She dwelt at length on the various parts of the dissertation and apprised the scholars of paying due attention to each and every detail of their project.

27 October 2022: Research Ethics

Prof Deepti Gupta, an eminent academician and a widely-acclaimed scholar, Department of English and Cultural Studies, Panjab University, Chandigarh, conducted a stimulating workshop on 'Research Ethics' on 27th October 2022.



She highlighted the problematics of Plagiarism in research as 'Cut, Copy, Paste' culture is sadly prevalent in the academia. Dr Deepti cautioned the students against this trend and exhorted them to follow ethical practices while writing research papers or dissertation. She gave hands- on training to the budding researchers on how they should attribute if they are referring to the online knowledge repository.



28 October 2022: References and Bibliography

Prof Aneel Kumar Raina (Retd) from the Department of English and Cultural Studies, Panjab University, was the Resource Person for deliberating on the strategies of writing 'References and Bibliography'.

He apprised the young scholars of the rationale behind citing sources, whether online, digital or printed. Prof Raina focussed his session on MLA 8th edition as Postgraduate students use it for their dissertation. He deliberated on subtle distinctions of using bold, italicised and underlined case, depending on the sources being mentioned in the Bibliography. The session was very enlightening as the students shared their doubts with the eminent academic.



29 October 2022: Research Publications: Guidelines for Beginners

Prof. Dilip Barad, Department of English, M.K. Bhavnagar University, Gujarat was the resource person and the topic for the session was 'Research Publication: Guidelines for Beginners'.



It was indeed a very enlightening session where the budding research scholars learnt the nuances of research. Prof Barad began with an activity wherein the participants were to fill up the forms for identifying the key areas of their interest. This aimed at helping them formulate their research ideas. They also learnt how application of a theory to a text not only adds fresh insights but also helps them to explore new paradigms about the text.



He suggested that researchers should read their papers in seminars and conferences so that their scholarly endeavours published thereafter may be substantiated by the questions asked by the audience and remarks made by fellow researchers. He also added that one may refer to various websites like that of Taylor and Francisto explore journals and also to learn the steps of publishing their research papers. The session ended with the participants asking various questions relating to research which were adequately answered by the resource person.

30 October: Doubt and Feedback Session

Outcome of the Programme

Around 95 students and faculty members of the Department of English benefitted from the interactive sessions in the Workshop. The queries of the participants were answered satisfactorily by the resource persons. The students felt motivated to take up research initiatives and to write dissertations specifically.

Mr. Vivek Atray, ex-IAS officer, an author and Motivational Speaker, and Mr. Jupinderjit Singh, a writer and Special Correspondent, The Tribune engaged in an enthralling conversation about the art of creative writing. Mr. Vivek Atray shared how writing helps in processing emotions and finding meaning in strenuous circumstances. He emphasized the importance of self-reflection in creative writing and the role it plays in catharsis. Mr. Jupinderjit Singh shared a deep insight into the creative process of writing non-fictional and investigative works through his writings Butchered for Love, based on a real life honour killing of a Canadian born Indian girl Jassi, and Discovery of Bhagat Singh's Pistol and his Ahimsa. His works demonstrate a deep engagement with contemporary issues facing Punjabi society and a commitment to exploring the complexities of human nature and social dynamics.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava applauded both the clubs for undertaking this initiative to broaden the horizons of young aspiring writers and initiating them into the subtleties of creative writing. 30-Hour Certificate Course in English Literature

15th June 2023 to 25th June 2023



Department of English, Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh organized a 30 hour Certificate Course in English literature, from June 12, 2023, to June 25, 2023, encompassing early modern period to contemporary literature reinforced by general discussion of literary terms, genres, theories and critical practices.

Under the guidance of Principal, Dr. Nisha Bhargava and Head of the Department, Ms. Neena Sharma, the workshop aimed at training students in critical and theoretical rigor with a strong base of knowledge in the subject of English Literature. The course comprised two-hour long sessions for 10 days. Doubts and queries were resolved before the end of the session. Learners were also given a quiz at the end of each day to assess their learning. Students, researchers, and faculty members joined the course from diverse parts of the country. The course began on June 15 with the session titled "An Introduction to English Language and English Literature" delivered by Ms. Anita Kasav that traced the origin and growth of English as a language and the subsequent production of literature in the same. The shift in language was traced from Indo-European and Germanic people till modern-day English. The lecture then briefly touched upon how English literature has transformed over the different eras starting from the Old English period (1066) till the 21st century. The participants were attentive, responsive, and extremely enthusiastic. On the second day of the course, the learners were introduced to the "Form and Content in Literature" by Dr. Urvi Sharma. This session focused on acquainting the students with the differences between prose and poetry alongside reading the theoretical aspects of reading the two different forms. Various literary genres and literary devices were also covered during the session. On the third day, Ms. Samridhi Sharma delivered the session titled "The Origin- Introduction to Greek Mythology and History of English Literature" which gave a detailed introduction to Greek Literature and Mythology. In addition, the

history of English Literature was traced from the Anglo-Saxon period till the Renaissance. Prominent writers and works of all ages were also discussed during the session. On the fourth day, a detailed discussion was held on the Elizabethan and Neoclassical movement in English Literature by Ms. Ritu Yadav. The impact of the Renaissance on the writings of this period was discussed thoroughly. Major poets and writers and their works were reviewed. Striking beliefs of the Neoclassical age like humanism, reason, skepticism, and individualism were highlighted. On the fifth day, a lecture on "Subjectivity, Sublimity, and Supernaturalism: Understanding the Creative Spontaneity of the Romantic Age" was delivered by Ms. Avnoor Makhu. Participants were apprised of the historical background, major movements, significant social, political, and economic reforms, literary characteristics, major writers, and their popular works of the Romantic age of English Literature. They showed great enthusiasm for learning and were interactive throughout the lecture.On the sixth day, the scheduled session by Ms. Karishma Chauhan explored the changing notions of science, morality, and society, during the reign of Queen Victoria. Some major historical events, achievements, and revolutionary ideas that challenged the former theological and conservative social structure leaving people in a state of confusion were discussed. The literary features of the age, literary movements, some groups formed by the writers of the age, Victorian poetry, the rise of the novels, revival of the drama, were also deliberated along with some prominent writers in the era. It was followed by a brief discussion on the emerging modern era posing some challenges to the previous movements of the Victorian period. On the seventh day, the session by Ms. Anita Kasav focused on "Chaos and Possibilities: English Literature in the Twentieth Century and Early 21st Century". The lecture explained different variants like politics, economics, social structure, psychology, and philosophy, of the century in terms of literature. The shifts in literary movements and literary forms were discussed through the works of prominent writers of the age. A brief was discussed in terms of explaining the implications of political, economic, social, and psychological unrest on the generation of different art movements. The participants were attentive, responsive, and extremely enthusiastic.

On the eighth day, learners were introduced to different literary approaches by Dr. Urvi Sharma and Dr. Manika Arora that could help them understand the nuances of writing and reading literature. The session emphasized on the different theoretical approaches of New Criticism, New Historicism, Eco-criticism, Marxism, Feminism, and Psychoanalysis. Various examples were given to help the learners comprehend the application of these theories in literature.On the ninth day, the lecture on "Indian Literature in English and Translation" was delivered by Dr. Manika Arora. The history of colonialism, the politics of the English language in the Indian context, significance and challenges of translation were discussed. A brief history of important literary trends, movements and writers as well as seminal works of translation was also discussed by the resource person. Participants showed an enthusiastic response and took active part in the discussion.On the tenth day, Ms. Anita Kasav apprised the students about the significance and application of Research Methodology. Dr. Urvi Sharma shared the open educational resources with the students to help them access research resources easily. The session introduced the learners with essential software to assist in their research endeavors.

On the final day of the course, June 25, an interactive session was organized where all the doubts and queries of the learners were addressed by the resource persons with respect to their research areas, career avenues and history of English literature. The course concluded with the encouraging feedback of the learners who found the course extremely enriching and highly interactive.
