Date: 13-14.09.2022


Number of Beneficiaries: Average of 50 students per OPDs.

<u>Two-day Interactive cum Awareness Session on Eye Care and</u> <u>Eye Check-Up Camp – 2022</u> Date: 15th – 16th September 2022 Number of Beneficiaries:

- i. For interactive cum awareness Session = 750
- ii. For Eye Check-up Camp = More than 250 (including 60 teaching and non-teaching staff)

Objective: To spread awareness on eye disorders, early detection of ailments, refractive errors and provide free consultation for solutions to the students and staff of the college.

Context: COVID-19 pandemic has led to a sharp increase in our screen time (that involve peering at a digital screen), owing to virtual education, conferences, work from home, online entertainment etc., due to which there is an increase in the number of eye related issues such as eye allergy, dryness, vision (refractive errors), light sensitivity and poor perception etc.

Practice: A two-day eye care awareness camp that included - an Interactive cum Awareness Session on Eye Care and Eye Check-Up Camp – 2022 was organized by NSS Units and Medical Committee in collaboration with SGHS Sohana Hospital, SAS Nagar, Punjab in the college premises on 15th and 16th September, 2022 for the benefit of students, teaching and non-teaching staff.

During this two-day event, **an interactive cum awareness Session on Eye Care** was organized on 15.09.2022, where more than 750 hostellers were apprised about eye refractive errors and treatments including importance of Contoura vision system (LASIK) by Dr. Rashmi. This was followed by (i.e., on 16.09.2022), an Eye Check-Up Camp in Multimedia Hall from 11.00 am to 3.45 pm where more than 250 beneficiaries including 60 teaching and non-teaching staff members availed the facility of Computerised Vision testing, Refraction test, Vision testing manual, Dry Eye Diagnosis, consultation and treatment by the team from SGHS Sohana Advanced Eye Care Centre (Dr Amanpreet Kaur (COO), Dr Madhu (Ophthalmologist), Dr Rashmi, Mr Puneet etc.).

Evidence of Success: Overall, the two-day eye care awareness camp was successful as staff and students availed the free of cost services of Eye Screening, Refraction test (Eye Sight number), Eye pressure test etc.









3. One Day Breast Cancer Awareness Camp - 2022

Date: 14th October, 2022

Number of Beneficiaries: 45 staff members

Objective: To encourage more women to get their screening done and educate them on breast cancer risk reduction and cure

The Context: Breast cancer is the most prevalent form of cancer and has become a major problem all across the world including India. It affects women and can occur at any age but, it is most common in women above the age of 40 years. October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, an annual campaign to raise awareness about the impact of breast cancer. Awareness and timely diagnosis could help in treating and overcoming the challenges of breast cancer. Mammograms are the best way to find breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat and before it is big enough to feel or cause symptoms.

The Practice: A Breast Cancer Awareness Camp – 2022 was in collaboration with Multi Super Speciality Hospital, Sohana, Mohali on 14.10.2022. The camp was organized for the female staff above the age of 40 years who are more prone to the disease. During the camp, a mammography bus equipped with the latest testing techniques and a team of doctors and nurses headed by Dr Piyush – Oncologist was stationed in the college campus for the same. More than 42 female staff including teaching and non-teaching staff of the college was benefitted from this camp. Simultaneous counseling sessions for students and faculty was conducted to cater the needs of the people facing related problems.

Objective: To instill the spirit of responsibility to humanity among the students and motivate them to come forward for noble cause of Blood donation voluntarily.


The Context: Blood is the savior of human lives in times of accidents and other emergencies. Hence the Blood Donation Drive was organized to contribute to the true service to humanity.

Number of Beneficaries: 100



This

7. <u>Lecture on Motivation and Dietary Interventions for</u> <u>Regular Voluntary Non-Remunerated Donations</u>

Date: 25 January 2023

Number of NSS Volunteers participated: 100

Objective: To appraise the volunteers with challenges in achieving 100% voluntary blood donation in India and to motivate the volunteers to come forward and donate blood for the noble cause

The Context: Donating blood and its products are considered essential for community welfare. However, several challenges have been identified at societal levels at cause hindrances in achieving 100% voluntary blood donation that includes societal taboos, the health of the donor, or after-effects of blood donation.

The Practice: To motivate volunteers to come forward for blood donation and discuss myths associated with the process, an enlightening informative session entitled "Motivation and Dietary Interventions for Regular Voluntary Non-Remunerated Donations" by Dr. Suchet Sachdev, Associate Professor, Department of Transfusion Medicine, PGIMER, Chandigarh was organized by NSS Units in collaboration with Medical Committee of the college on 25.01.2023. During the session, Dr. Suchet discussed the origin and progression of Blood Donation banks in India. Data pertaining to blood collection at global level was also discussed by him to let the volunteers know about the current statistics of blood donation worldwide.

Besides, he apprised the volunteers of all the stages of blood donation, donor motivation and challenges they faced during any blood camp. At the end of

his presentation, he explained the importance of healthy food especially rich in vitamins and folic acids in donors' lives that could eradicate the problem of anemia especially in girls, observed during the blood donation camps.

8. Awareness lecture on the Prevention of Cervical cancer

Date: 27 January 2023

Number of NSS Volunteers participated: 100

Objectives: To sensitize volunteers and raise awareness regarding cancer. its prevention, detection, and treatment and to make the volunteers aware of the vaccination for young adolescents against the HPV virus that causes cervical cancer.

Context: Cancer is a disease in which cells in the body grow out of control. When cancer starts in the cervix, it is called cervical cancer. People between the ages of 35 and 44 are most frequently diagnosed with cervical cancer. Around 4,000 people die of cervical cancer per year. This rate is on the decline due to screenings and the HPV vaccine.

Practice: To generate awareness about Cervical Cancer and its preventive measures, an awareness lecture on the Prevention of Cervical cancer was organized by NSS Units and the Medical Committee of the college in collaboration with Fortis Hospital, Mohali. The resource person of the session was Dr. Shweta Tahlan, Consultant- Gynae Oncosurgery, Fortis Hospital, Mohali.

During the session, Dr. Shweta Tahlan provided a detailed insight into cancer while laying major emphasis on its types, causes, and pre-symptoms of different types of cancer such as Breast Cancer, Cervical cancer, and ovarian cancer. She also elaborated on early detection and available techniques to cure the disease. She apprised the volunteers of HPV vaccination available for young girls. At the end of the session, queries by the audience were addressed by the resource person. **Evidence of Success**: The session was a success as it was able to create awareness regarding cervical cancer among the audience.





9. Workshop on Menstrual Health and Hygiene

Date: 28 January 2023

Number of NSS Volunteers participated: 100

Objectives: To create awareness about menstrual hygiene and to break the

menstrual taboos that jeopardize the health of millions of girls every day.

The Context: Menstrual Hygiene is crucial to the empowerment and wellbeing of women and girls worldwide. However, myths and taboos associated with menstrual health are still prevalent in society that need to be discussed and elucidated.

The Practice: A Workshop on Menstrual Health and Hygiene was organized by NSS Units and the Medical Committee of the college in collaboration with Enactus, SSBUICET, Panjab University on 28.01.2023. The resource person of the event was Professor Seema Kapoor, Enactus Faculty Advisor.

The event commenced with a virtual address by Ms. Geetanjali Bakshi, Coordinator of CSR project Amodini of Versatile Group, Ludhiana. She introduced the project Amodini, which was initiated to break the silence around menstrual hygiene for girls around society and their successful collaboration with the Enactus team. This was followed by an interactive and insightful lecture by Dr. Neelam Sodhi (MD, OBS & Gynecology) on menstrual health and hygiene to change society by being open and honest about menstruation and menstrual hygiene. Project Uday of the Enactus Team seeks to gradually eliminate taboos surrounding menstruation. She was received by the crowd with a huge round of applause and everyone was moved by her words. Dr. Sodhi's talk was followed by Ms. Ravina's talk from Switzerland, who is doing a project with WHO and spoke on the advantages of using reusable cloth pads.

Evidence of Success: The session was fruitful as NSS Volunteers participated enthusiastically in the session. Several myths and taboos associated with menstruation were busted and awareness was generated regarding maintaining menstrual hygiene among women. 11. <u>Mammography and Bone Density Analysis Camp as part of</u> <u>International Women's Day Celebrations</u>

Date: 03rd March, 2023

Number of Beneficiaries: 50 (for Mammography Camp) and 103 (for Bone Density Analysis)

Objectives: To encourage more women to get their screening done and educate them on breast cancer risk reduction and cure and to identify people who are at risk of osteoporosis, a condition where bones become weak and brittle, and to educate them on how to prevent or manage this condition

The Context: Breast cancer is the most prevalent form of cancer and has become a major problem all across the world including India. It affects women and can occur at any age but, it is most common in women above the age of 40 years. Awareness and timely diagnosis could help in treating and overcoming the challenges of breast cancer. Mammograms are the best way to find breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat and before it is big enough to feel or cause symptoms. Also, osteoporosis is a common systemic skeletal disorder leading to decreased bone strength and increased susceptibility to osteofragility fracture. It

is a significant health issue mostly observed in the persons above the age of 50. The mammography and bone density analysis camps are a vital step in promoting women's health and ensuring that they have access to medical care.

The Practice: As part of International Women's Day Celebrations, NSS Units and Health Committee of the Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh organized a Mammography and Bone Density Analysis Camp in collaboration with Amrit Cancer Foundation, Sector 35, Chandigarh on 03.03.2023 in their adopted Village Badheri, Sector 41-D, Chandigarh. The camp was organized along with Blood donation camp and Medical Check Up Camp that was organized by Counsellor Mr Hardeep Singh, President Shiromani Akali Dal, Chandigarh in sweet memory of his father Late S. Gurnam Singh Buterla. The camp was organized specifically for the people above the age of 40 years who are more prone to the breast cancer and osteoporosis disease.

During the camp, a mammography bus equipped with the latest testing techniques and a team of doctors/technicians and nurses were stationed in the village community centre for the same. Besides, a bone testing analysis machine was also made available for the detecting bone related deficiencies for the persons above the age of 25. More than 50 female residents for mammography test and 103 residents for bone density analysis test were benefitted from this camp. Simultaneous counseling cum awareness sessions for residents was conducted to cater the needs of the people facing related problems. At the end, dignitaries as guests praised the efforts of the NSS Units and NSS volunteers of our college for their dedication and hard work in making the event a success.

Evidence of Success: The camp was a huge success that witnessed the enthusiastic participation of more than 50 female residents for mammography test and 103 residents for bone density analysis test.

Number of participants/Beneficiaries : 350

Objectives: To evaluate health status of students and staff of the college

Context: With an aim to create awareness among the masses for preventive healthcare that is the need of an hour, a Medical Camp was organzied.

Practice: Medical Committee of the college in collaboration with Fortis Hospital, Mohali organized a day long medical camp for staff as well students at the college on 31 March 2023 from 10.00 am to 3.00 pm. The camp was organized targeting the population of every age group (including staff members as well as students).
