



From the Principal's Desk

Our country faces giant challenges in the form of tackling drug abuse and taking rehabilitation measures. The Department of Social Justice & Empowement, Government of India is constantly adopting measures to deal with the menace of drug addiction which is raising its head all over the country. In sync with the measures suggested by the Department, the Victory Against Drug Abuse (VADA) Club of Mehr Chand Mahajan College for Women engaged in organizing programmes, events and sessions to create awareness regarding the detrimental effects of drug abuse and also to create an environment where students ask questions and also know more about the rehabilitation measures. Since youth is the most vulnerable section when it comes to substance abuse, it is crucial that they are focused on by the policy makers and the formation of such clubs across educational institutions is a welcome step in our struggle against drug abuse.

The Pledge Taking Ceremony in August on 'Nashe Se Azadi: A National Youth & Student Interaction Programme' was a clarion call to show solidarity with the objectives of the Department of Social Justice & Empowement. Many events and sessions were organized which resonated with the theme of 'Nasha Mukt' Bharat. Youth sometimes gets lured by peer pressure and sometime succumb to the pressure of 'try something new'. A scholarly lecture by Dr. Debasish Basu, Professor and Head, Department of Psychiatry, PGIMER, Chandigarh busted many myths around the use of drugs and enriched the participants with the various guises that drug traffickers may give to the drugs to make them look 'cool' and 'harmless'. Many competitions were organized including Elocution Competition, Essay Writing Competition and Painting Competition which revolved around the themes of substance abuse, roadmap for a 'Nasha Mukt' Bharat and how the misuse of drugs impacts the social and cultural fabric of the country adversely. Drug addiction erodes resources, leads to increase in crime rate and also disrupts relationships besides the immediate physical and psychological harmful effects. Dr. Nemi Chand Golia, State Liasion Officer (NSS) Chandigarh Administration and a Licensed Psychotherapist from United Sates of America Dr. Nelu acquainted the participants with detrimental effects of drug abuse on mental health and emphasized upon the need to nip the evil in the bud by finding out the reasons behind youngsters resorting to drugs during the awareness Lecture entitled "Drug Abuse and Mental Health" organized in the college campus. The VADA Club also organized a pledge-ceremony on the theme 'Say No to Drugs' and pledge was administered to the students of the college by Student volunteer wherein everyone vowed to stay away from drugs and to make efforts to make India a drug free country. The Poster Making Competition on the theme 'The importance of family in preventing substance abuse' was also organized. The purpose of poster competition was to sensitize and create awareness amongst the public about the menace of substance abuse through creativity and expression. Declamation Contest on the theme 'Say No to Drugs, Say Yes to Life', was organized wherein students participated and spoke about the causes and consequences of drug addiction and they highlighted the negative impact of drug on social, physical and mental wellbeing on the addicts. Students also reminded our duty as responsible citizens to neither misuse the drugs for ourselves nor let our friends, family members indulge in same. Students highlighted positive role of students, teachers, parents and peer groups in bringing about awareness on such issues.

Dr. Sukhpreet Kaur, a Psychiatric Social Worker. Drug-De-Addiction & Treatment Centre, Civil Hospital, Hoshiarpur (Punjab), was invited as a resource person to deliver a talk "Gender and Substance Abuse" wherein explained the consequences of drug abuse ranging from immediate physical problems to fatal consequences like suicidal tendencies and death due to overdose or permanent damage to heart and brain. With the help of elaborate case studies of the substance abusing youth she suggested set back at the family level and bad company to be major cause of drug addiction.

Valedictory session was organised with culmination of all the efforts that the club undertook to eradicate this evil. During the Valedictory session, A rally raising with Posters and Slogans on the theme 'Say no to Drugs, Say Yes to Life' and Pledge Ceremony was organised in the college campus and cash prizes and certificates were given to the winners of the various competitions.

I am deeply indebted to our torch bearers who continue to guide us in all our efforts. I am thankful to Dr. Punam Suri ji, Padma Shree Awardee, Hon'ble President, DAV College Managing Committee, New Delhi for encouraging us to take steps to eradicate drug abuse. I express my gratitude to Shri H.R. Gandhar ji, Senior Governing Body member of the College and Vice President DAVCMC for always inspiring us with and encouraging us to continue in our fight against drug abuse. 

participants in the competition, wherein they highlighted the negative impact of drug on social, physical and mental wellbeing on the addicts. The drugs have become a style in today's world. Today's generation has become gripped with whatever is new or trending in the world. Abuse of drugs can turn out to be very dangerous. It can cause psychological or physical addiction.

All these drugs have tremendous side effects; these side effects can later give rise to several diseases. In their presentations, students also underlined that the government put stringent initiatives in place so that the menace is eradicated from the society. Accordingly students also reminded our duty as responsible citizens and not to misuse the drugs. Even when we come across any such crime, we should immediately report it to the nearest police station. The students showcased enthusiasm, awareness and concern regarding the issue. The Second event Essay Competition on the theme: "Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan & Road map ahead for its success" was held in Golden Jubilee Conference Hall. There were 26 students participated in the competition out of which 17 students were expressed their views on respective theme in English medium and other in Hindi medium. The purpose of the activity was to generate awareness, gauge their understanding of the challenge to the youth as well as their solutions to the problem of drug abuse. Students suggested solutions like government intervention, community response and redirecting the energy of youth towards more creative and productive directions.



The Third event Painting Competition on the theme: "Impact of Substance use on individuals "was held in Fine Arts Lab. There were 21 students participated in the competition and they highlighted the ill effects of drugs on students as well as artistically displayed various ills and appeals regarding drug abuse through their paintings. The purpose of painting competition was to sensitise and create awareness amongst the public about the menace of substance abuse through creativity and expression. Participants presented their thoughts on canvas with colours expressing drugs as definite death and suffering for not only the addict but the whole family. By illustrating through painting, participants clearly supported choosing of life and urged youth to say no to drugs.

Awareness Lecture On Drug Abuse Among Youth

Objective: The main purpose of the event was to educate and refrain the youth from the use of narcotic substances and spread awareness about the drug not only on individuals on society at large.

The Context: Drug Addiction is emerging to be a serious concern in the country, especially in the younger generation leading to dangerous consequences not just for the persons using drugs, but on the family and society at large. Drug abuse has resulted in an increase in crime rate and has a detrimental impact on society at large. Preventions has proven to be the most effective strategy to counter this problem. The Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment under Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan, is the nodal ministry which plays a significant role in Drug Demand Reduction in the country.

The Practice: The Victory against Drug Abuse Club of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Sector 36 A, Chandigarh, conducted an Awareness Lecture on Drug Abuse among Youth under the aegis of Department of Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment under Nasha Mukt Abhiyan which was convened by College Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava and was coordinated by Dr. Gurjeet Kaur Virk.

The speaker of the event was Dr. Debasish Basu, Professor & Head, Department of Psychiatry, PGIMER, Chandigarh. Dr. Basu, shared his immense knowledge on various drugs, consequences of its consumption and symptoms of drug abusers in his



resource full lecture. It was an eye opening session, where a whole new perspective of Drug Abuse was understood by the participants. The lecture began with the basic terminologies related to drugs, its connection with regard to medicines, drug dependence and drug abuse followed by the classification of drugs such as narcotics, psychotropic substances, and controlled substances and other substances. He emphasized on understanding drugs from biological, psychological and sociological standpoints and effects. While urging not to use derogatory branding like 'addict' for a person who is severely dependent on drugs, he also urged youth not to fall prey to the temporary relief given by drugs as it was a trap. He explained that the narcotic world is a place entry is easy but exit is very difficult to find. Even while deeply aware about the harmful consequences, the victim becomes helpless as he cannot get away from the addiction. The speaker gave a clear insights into the reasons that attract an individual towards drug abuse and its impact on mental and physical health, where signs of drug abuse and its detrimental effects on physical appearance. The participants were made aware about alarming and rising trend of drug abuse among youth in general and women in particular. He drew attention towards various laws and punishments directed by our Government of India to contain drug abuse, but also observed them as inadequate. He emphasised the importance of family and religious values and good company to prevent us all from getting into this danger. He also explained the importance of Karma, selfcare, and hard work were the key elements to achieve success in life. He discussed the ill effects of drug use with more than 100 students and also explained how the mechanism and mind of an individual changes, when one consumes drugs on a regular basis. He advised different ways and methods to handle such situations and also how an institution can spread awareness about the same.



On the event, Principal Dr.Nisha Bhargava addressed the students and mentioned that "DRUGS" refers to Death Regularized under Guise of Solace and then shared a valuable quote, "Understand your potential and act accordingly to reach success". She guided students to choose the right path and succeed in life rather than being a victim of evil practices. This was followed by an interactive session with the students in which students discussed their issues and questions with the speaker. The students really found the session insightful, during the session the speaker also discussed the myths related to drugs. Helping spread awareness regarding such topics is an important aspect and can go a long way in helping save someone's life.

Objective: The main purpose of the event was to educate and refrain the youth from the use of narcotic substances and spread awareness about the drug not only on individuals on society at large.
