In the inaugural lecture 'An Introduction to Research: Emerging Areas in Academic Scholarship', Prof Akshaya Kumar introduced the participants to the latest and emerging trends in research.



Dr. Neeraj delivered a very informative and enlightening talk on 'Open Educational Resources and Research'. Dr. Meenu Gupta dealt with the nuances of technical writing of dissertation for Postgraduate students. In the workshop on 'Research Ethics', Prof Deepti Gupta

highlighted the problem of plagiarism in research and also gave hands-on training to the budding researchers on attribution while referring to the online knowledge repository. Prof Aneel Kumar Raina deliberated on the strategies of writing 'References and Bibliography' and apprised the young scholars of the rationale behind citing sources, whether online, digital or printed.



The series culminated with a session titled 'Research Publication: Guidelines for Beginners' by Prof Dilip Barad. Around 95 students and faculty members of the Department of English benefitted from this workshop that

proved to be a fruitful endeavour to initiate the young learners into critical thinking and innovative perspectives.

The resource person enlightened the participants about various important softwares namely Endnote, Mendley, Latex available free of cost online which can be used for formatting, language editing and managing references. He also shed light on how to avoid plagiarism while writing a research article with the help of para-phrasing and in-text citation. The importance of a covering letter at the time of submission of the research paper for publication was also discussed by the expert. The session was very informative and helpful for all the participants including students, research scholars and faculty members.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava lauded the consistent efforts of the Skill Development Committee for promotion of skills in varied fields. She added that academic research holds immense relevance for the society and thus, such an endeavour is highly beneficial.

MCM holds webinar on the process of writing and publishing quality research



Keeping in mind the significance of quality research for expanding human knowledge base, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh organised a webinar on 'Process of Writing and Publishing Quality Research Papers in Indexed Journals'.

Dr. Neeraj Kumar Singh, Deputy Librarian, AC Joshi Library, Panjab University was the resource person for this highly informative webinar which sought to enlighten faculty, research scholars and students about various aspects of quality research. Over 310 people viewed the webinar and benefitted from the expertise of the expert who has published 12 papers in Scopus indexed journals. Covering comprehensively the various aspects of writing a quality research paper, Dr. Neeraj impressed upon the need to develop an understanding of the reviewer's perspective by trying to comprehend the criteria reviewers apply for selecting research papers. With publish or perish as the guiding principle, Dr. Neeraj dwelt upon the nuances of writing good quality research papers including selecting the title of the paper, tools for literature search, writing the abstract, introduction and literature review, research methodology, presentation of data for maximum impact and data visualisation tools. He also shed light on sources for finding peer reviewed indexed journals for publication of one's research. The participants were also apprised about various metrics for assessing a journals' performance like Journal Impact Factor and H-5 Index, as well as author level metrics like H-Index and Altmetrics. The webinar was well received by the participants. Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava, who is also a reviewer of an Elsevier journal, lauded this endeavour for decoding the crucial process of writing and publishing good quality research, for the benefit of various stakeholders in the academic world.

The participants learnt to create different formations using cement like big leaves, foot prints, tortoise, lady bugs and mushrooms. A waterfall effect was given by using curtains dipped in cement mixture. Soft toys like teddy bears and parrot were also dipped in cement mixture and settled on a fallen tree. Pots of different sizes were painted with different colours and styles which were installed on the fallen tree. An oversized swan was made with cement, truck tyre and stones in which planters were planted to complete the garden look. The participants were also taught the technique of lippan art using shilpkar, colours and mirrors. Different motifs were made on the entrance door of Fine Arts Lab like, fish, elephants, flowers, peacocks, etc.

Dr Kapur remarked that the federal as well as state policy in the US have created critical barriers to justice for immigrant women. She suggested that Indian migrant married women, in order to keep intact the cultural stereotypes of

functional family, never come out and discuss domestic violence perpetrated by their husbands. She added that for the financially dependent spouse, the conditions may be even more severe. Dr. Kapur also highlighted cultural and linguistic barriers as a deterrent to reporting cases of assualt. Citing high rates of domestic violence among Indian diaspora, Dr. Kapur concluded that gaps between laws, policy and implementation should be bridged and advocacy may be helpful in the processes. The lecture was attended by over 75 students.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava expressed appreciation for this initiative to raise awareness about a socially relevant cause. She added that the monster of domestic violence needs to be tackled through such awareness sessions and sensitising the youth.

Skill development workshop in Beekeeping held at MCM



The Department of Zoology at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh, in association with Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India, organised a 3-day skill-based workshop titled 'Beekeeping for Beginners' under VENTEL Action Plan.

Mr. Madan Sharma, Founder, Global Apiaries India, conducted the workshop that witnessed keen participation of 40 students. On day 1, Mr. Sharma shed light on the fundamentals of beekeeping including information about different species of honeybee, their life span, breeding, feeding, reproductive cycle and life history. He apprised the participants about the diversity in honey bee species which includes Apis dorsata (Rock bee), Apis laboriosa (the Himalayan giant honey bee), Apis cerana indica (Indian hive bee), Apis florea (dwarf bee), Apis mellifera (European or Italian bee) and Tetragonula iridipennis (Dammar or stingless bee).



He also shared some life-saving tactics as a means of protection from honeybee swarms along with his intriguing personal experiences in this field. Special emphasis was laid on ecological significance of beekeeping. On the second day, Mr. Sharma educated the participants about various

bee products including the highly nutritional royal jelly, medicinal products such as honeybee venom, bee wax, bee bread and propolis.

The participants were also shown various documentaries and video clips on honey harvesting, capturing a swarm and beekeeping business. Essential apiculture equipment such as a bee smoker, hive scrapper, honey extractor, beehive frame, queen excluder and a beehive were also shown to the students. On the third day of the workshop, Mr. Sharma guided the participants about seasonal management of bee boxes and protection of beehives during adverse conditions. He informed the participants that honey production is a lucrative business, economically profitable enterprise that generates employment opportunities, and added that with the current skyrocketing demand of honey, bee product manufacturing has a wide scope in today's market. The participants found the workshop immensely useful as it widened their horizons by providing knowledge about various aspects of apiculture.

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava highlighted the significance of the workshop as she said that it is a relevant step towards motivating the youth to explore entrepreneurial opportunities in beekeeping and to help in conserving biodiversity. She informed that the college undertakes various skill development initiatives like this one with the objective of promoting innovation and entrepreneurship, and enhancing employability quotient of the students.
