



FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

The academic session of 2022-23 at Mehr Chand Mahajan DAV College for Women, Chandigarh was dedicated, most significantly, to the preparation for the third cycle of Accreditation by the National Accreditation and Assessment Council, Bangalore. After the successful and timely submission of the Self Study Report, and Data Validation and Verification process, the college was all set to host the visit of the Peer Team on April 24-25, 2023.

Led by a Vice Chancellor as its Chairperson, the Team included a Professor as a Member-Coordinator and a former Principal of a college as a Member. During these two days, the team visited all the departments, laboratories and administrative offices; held insightful discussions with the members of faculty and browsed through their research work, reports of departmental activities and achievements with keen interest. Their interaction with the parents, students, alumni, teaching faculty and non-teaching staff was conducted in a very cordial atmosphere.

The Peer Team members not only took an eager interest in the new initiatives of the institution such as the Geo-tagging of 500 trees in the campus, 365 Kwh Solar Plant, Sewage Treatment Plant, Childcare Centre, Digital Lounge and Gym for the hostellers, and the recently developed Poly Greenhouse, they also appreciated the institutional commitment towards the national goals of Swachhta, environmental consciousness and social outreach. The Peer Team was equally appreciative of the endeavours of the IQAC in initiating several quality-oriented steps and projects.

It is owing to all such efforts as directed towards promoting quality culture in every arena and its reflection in our achievements in academics, sports, cultural and social outreach activities that the college was awarded 'A' grade with a high CGPA of 3.22 by NAAC. However, our commitment towards higher goals and greater excellence continues unabated.

A unique achievement of IQAC this year has been the completion of the Project of QR Coding and Geo-tagging of 500 trees existing within the premises of the college. These trees which belong to nearly 78 different species have distinct medicinal value. Some of them are non-specific to the region. By merely scanning the QR Code on the metallic plate attached to each tree, the students can access its botanical/scientific name, history, main characteristics and benefits. This endeavour is a testimony of our institutional commitment to spreading awareness about the need to preserve and maintain a green and clean environment.

MCM DAV College has, since its inception, been a forerunner in introducing new Courses and approaches in pedagogy as and when required. Keeping up the tradition, it is making all concerted efforts to adopt new academic norms integral to a smooth implementation of New Education Policy, 2020. Envisaging a paradigmatic shift in the existing system and approach to higher learning, the college is gearing up to take new initiatives for integrating and preserving the coveted standards of quality in every field.

Keeping in focus the significance attached to Skill Development by the New Education Policy, 2020, the college has encouraged the members of its faculty to design new skill based courses relevant to the demand of the job market. 

Since its inception in 2015, the IQAC has consistently been involved in planning new strategies, programmes and policies to foster quality culture in pedagogy, administration, finance and organization.

The IQAC offers a platform to all the stakeholders of the institution including the management, administration, teaching faculty, non-teaching staff and students to discuss, debate and decide upon all such issues, policies and strategies as pave the way towards disseminating value-based and holistic education to young women in consonance with the institutional Vision and Mission.

ENDEAVOURS AND ACHIEVEMENTS, 2022-23

The **Internal Quality Assurance Cell**, inspired by the cherished goals mentioned in the Vision and Mission statement of the College, has always endeavoured to strengthen and maintain quality in every aspect – academic, sports, examination, evaluation, administration and governance. It is owing to its commitment to this coveted goal that the IQAC was able to meet all deadlines of NAAC required for the re-accreditation process.

The third cycle of accreditation which began with the timely submission of IIQA followed by the Self Study Report and the DVV process, came to its culmination with a smooth conduct of the Peer Team Visit. Led by a Vice Chancellor of a University as the Chairperson, the Peer Team also included a Professor as the Member Coordinator, and a Principal as a Member.

The IQAC conducted several meetings with its stakeholders to prepare for the Accreditation Process. In the meeting held on October 12, 2022, issues pertaining to the repair, maintenance and upgradation of infrastructural facilities; enrichment of Library resources and expansion of learning resources in the hostel library; installation of sign boards, directions and room numbers and steps to make the campus divyang-friendly were discussed. The project of geo-tagging and QR coding of all the trees within the campus was also taken up. The concerned committees/members were instructed to look into these matters and expedite the process.

In another meeting of the IQAC held on March 21, 2023, it was decided to hold a Mock Drill before the Peer Team visit to ascertain the institutional preparation. Important issues such as the maintenance of Departmental and Committee-wise records, display of SOPs in different laboratories, and timely submission of Self-appraisal forms by the members of teaching and non-teaching staff were discussed. The IQAC also charted a plan to apprise the students of the significance of the accreditation and relevance of the Peer Team Visit.

Needless to say, it was owing to the devotion, hard work and commitment of all the members of the IQAC, that the Peer Team Visit scheduled for April 24 and 25, 2023 was conducted very smoothly and the institution was awarded 'A' grade with a CGPA of 3.22 on a 4 point scale by NAAC in its 3rd Accreditation Cycle.

ANNUAL SHAKUNTALA ROY MEMORIAL LECTURE

IMPACT OF TECHNOLOGY ON SOCIETY

The College, in order to commemorate the Birth Centenary Year of its Founder Principal, organized the annual Mrs. Shakuntala Roy Memorial Lecture (4th in Series) on April 12, 2023. Prof. Renu Vig, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Panjab University, Chandigarh graced the event as the Chief Guest and delivered an enlightening lecture on the topic 'Impact of Technology on Society.' Sh. Harjinder Singh Bhatti, Senior Superintendent of Post Office, Chandigarh was the Guest of Honour while Prof. Arun K. Grover, Professor Emeritus, PEC, Chandigarh; Justice (Retd.) Pritam Pal and Sh. H. R. Gandhar, Vice Presidents, DAV College Managing Committee, New Delhi; Mrs. Sneh Mahajan, Former Principal of the College; Dr. Gurdip Sharma, General Secretary, GGDSD College Managing Committee, Hariana, Punjab and Former PU Senior Senate and Syndicate Member; Mrs. Manju Gosain and Maj. Gen. (Retd.) P K Gosain, Daughter and son-in-law of Mrs. Shakuntala Roy, and Sh. Pradeep Roy, son of Mrs. Shakuntala Roy were Special Guests on this occasion.

In her keynote address, Prof. Renu Vig shared the story of evolution of communication technology from wire to wireless. Quoting the examples of big data technologies, digital revolution, Artificial Intelligence, robotics, etc., Prof. Vig pointed out the different ways in which technology has impacted human lives. Prof. Vig averred that humans must not be enslaved by technology, and should always uphold humanitarian values.

Paying a glowing tribute to Mrs. Roy, Sh. H. R. Gandhar, Hon'ble Vice President, DAV College Managing Committee, New Delhi, recalled with great admiration, how she had turned every adversity into opportunity. He hailed her indomitable grit and quest for excellence, and also commended the College for keeping her spirit alive through this lecture series.

A special Cover was also released during the event as a befitting tribute to Mrs. Roy on her centennial year. Prof. Arun Grover, recalling his personal association with Mrs. Roy and her family, lauded her courage, sense of commitment and hard work in establishing MCM on a firm footing. ROLE OF WOMEN IN NATION BUILDING

The **College** in collaboration with Nivedita Trust for Aahar Kranti. organised an event titled 'Role of Women in Nation Building' on November 12, 2022. A galaxy of dignitaries graced this mega event, including Chief Guest Sh. Som Parkash (Minister of State for Commerce and Industry. Government of India), and Guests of Honour Justice Daya Chaudhary (Former Punjab and Haryana High Court Judge), Dr. Varinder Garg (OSD to Union Health Minister at PGIMER, Chandigarh), Sh. Prem Chand Goyal (Prant Pracharak) Sh.



Narender Kumar, Ms. Mallika Nadda (Social Activist), Jaspinder Narula (Singer) and Sh. Gian Chand Gupta (Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha). The esteemed guests expressed their views on the place of women in the society and women empowerment.

Citing historical references to point out the greatness of women, they also discussed the role of women in making India a 'Vishv Guru'. A book titled 'Processed Food- Implications for Human Health and Sustainable Development' authored by Dr. Nisha Bhargava (Principal), Dr. Minakshi Rana, Dr. Aanchal Batra, Dr. Shafila Bansal and Dr. Shubhmangla Acharya, and a documentary on 'Aahar Kranti' were also released on the occasion. A two-day International Conference was organized by the Department of **Physics** in collaboration with the School of Physical Sciences, Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Mysuru, on 'Beyond the Contemporary Sciences (BCS-2022)' on November 18 and 19, 2022. The event featured 12 speakers from across the globe who shared their expertise in the field of Material Science, Metallurgy, Mineralogy. Ceramics. Polymers. Magnetic Semiconductors, materials, biomaterials and nanomaterials, Prof. B.



R. K Nanda (IIT Madras); Dr. Loganathan Veeramuthu (National Taipei University of Technology Taipei, Taiwan); Dr. B. Murali Krishna (Khalifa University, Abu Dhabi); Prof. Sanjeev Kumar (Punjab Engineering College, Chandigarh); Prof. Sunita Srivastava (Central University, Haryana); Prof. U. B. Sharopov (Physical Technical Institute, Uzbekistan); Dr. Dibya Prakash Rai (Pachhunga University College, Mizoram); Dr. Sathish Kumar (Pharma CADD, Busan, Korea) and Prof. Jeesu Jaskanwar Singh (Panjab University, Chandigarh) shared their expertise on various domains of Material Science and computational design of cathode materials for Al based rechargeable batteries. Conducted in the blended mode (offline and online), the Conference attracted more than 700 participants from prestigious institutions worldwide like Michigan Tech University, USA; Pharma CADD Busan, Korea; Khalifa University, Abu- Dhabi; Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras; National Taipei University of Technology Taipei Taiwan; Physical Technical Institute, Uzbekistan; Punjab Engineering College (PEC), Central University, Haryana; Pachhunga University College, Mizoram and Panjab University Chandigarh.

MCM MODEL UNITED NATIONS-1.0

The **Department of Public Administration** organized a Model United Nations known as 'MCM MUN 1.0' on April 17, 2023 under the aegis of Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the College. The first session of MUN began with All India Political Party Meet (AIPPM) on an agenda pertaining to National Education Policy-2020 focussed on Skill Orientation in Higher Education. The session was chaired by Prof. Anil Monga, Chairperson (Centre for Police Administration, PU) and co-chaired by Dr. Bhawna Gupta, Assistant Professor (Department of Public Administration, PU, Chandigarh) and Ms. Niharika Choudhary, a student member of the Executive Board from the College.

The second session based on the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) was chaired by Dr. Namita Gupta, Associate Professor (Centre for Human Rights and Duties, PU), co-chaired by Dr. Kuldeep Singh, Assistant Professor (Centre for Police Administration, PU) and Mr. Sehajpreet Singh, a student member of Executive Board, from GGDSD College, Chandigarh. Its agenda pertained to Police and Human Rights, and the delegates debated on the stance of member countries in preserving human rights in their respective countries. The MCM MUN concluded with prize distribution in which the best delegates from both the sessions were awarded.



TRANSFORMATION, SURVIVAL AND SUSTAINABILITY IN A POST COVID WORLD & CREATING A NEW BHARAT

A two-day Multi-disciplinary National Conference was organized by the **Postgraduate Department of Economics** on 'Transformation, Survival and Sustainability in a Post COVID World and Creating a New Bharat: Some Dimensions from Punjab and Haryana State' sponsored by Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), North-Western Regional Centre, Panjab University, Chandigarh on May 26 and 27, 2023.

The objective of the Conference was to explore the challenges and opportunities for transformation, survival, and sustainability in the post-COVID world while focusing on Punjab and Haryana, and to propose a policy framework for inclusive and sustainable growth. The Chief Guest, Prof. Y. P. Verma, Registrar, (Panjab University) emphasized the importance of sustainability in technology and praised initiatives of the college such as 'Vocal for Local' and 'Start Up India' for fostering entrepreneurship and innovation among students.

The Guest of Honour Prof. Sanjay Kaushik, Dean, College Development Council, Panjab University, Chandigarh, highlighted the disparity between education budget and student fees. Prof. Pradeep Chauhan, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, while delivering the Presidential Address, advocated for education as a tool to combat inequality and poverty, and emphasized on the need to empower youth for economic development. Prof. Aswini Kumar Nanda, CRRID, Chandigarh, in his Keynote Address, emphasized on India's resilience in overcoming economic challenges. 125 educationists, scholars, researchers and students presented their views, in blended-mode, on different sub-themes of the Conference.



WORKSHOPS

HANDS ON ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

The **Department of Physics** organized 'Hands on Electronic Equipment,' a skill-based workshop on August 29, 2022. The resource person for the workshop was Mr. Balwinder Singh Rawat, Managing Director, Lab Tech Equipments, Ambala. He provided practical knowledge and hands-on training to the students in repairing various electronic gadgets used in household such as fan, bulbs, grinder, electronic irons etc. More than 40 undergraduate students participated enthusiastically in this workshop.

UNDERSTANDING ELECTORAL DEMOCRACY IN INDIA

The **Department of Political Science** organized a three-day workshop from September 5 to 7, 2022 on the theme 'Understanding Electoral Democracy in India'. Dr. Suraj Thapa, Asst. Professor and Deputy Nodal Officer-ELC, PGGC-11, Chandigarh; Ms Richa, Ms Ashima and Ms. Hardeep Kaur from the college were the resource persons. The event highlighted the various dimensions of electoral democracy in India and how it has evolved over the years. The workshop was attended by 56 students.

DIGITAL TOOLS: A GATEWAY FOR RESEARCH IN SOCIAL SCIENCES



NEW ENDEAVOURS /BRIDGE COURSES

CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME IN ENVIRONMENT EDUCATION

The **Department of Botany** and **Eco Club 'Parivesh'** hosted a Capacity Building Programme in Environment Education titled 'Forests: Blueprint of a Healthy and Sustainable Future' on March 28, 2023 under Mission LIFE. The programme, supported by Punjab State Council for Science & Technology and Ministry of Environment & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), aimed to deepen awareness about environmental issues, particularly on the role of forest resources in a sustainable future. Dr. Rohit Sharma and Dr. Pancy from Dr. Y. S. Parmar University of Horticulture and Forestry led two sessions. Dr. Sharma delved into natural products in drug discovery, while Dr. Pancy discussed the importance of non-timber forest products (NTFPs) for livelihood and economic growth. 7-DAY WORKSHOP ON FINANCIAL LITERACY



During the visit, 40 students distributed refreshments, sweets, diyas, and handmade Diwali cards, while also participating in enjoyable games and activities along with the elderly residents. The seniors actively engaged in the festivities while sharing their life experiences and imparting blessings and inspirational talks to the students.

MAMMOGRAPHY SCREENING CAMP

A free Mammography Screening Camp was organized by the **Medical Committee** on November 10, 2022, to promote awareness about early diagnosis of breast cancer among women in the villages. The activity aimed to raise awareness about the importance of regular medical check-ups and health consciousness. Collaborating with Sohana Multi Speciality Hospital and the NSS unit of the school, the camp held at Government Model Senior Secondary School, Maloya, facilitated interactions between rural women and medical professionals, highlighting the significance of early detection and treatment of breast cancer.

DONATE A PAD

A Pad Collection Drive titled 'Donate a Pad', organized by the **Women Development Cell** on February 20-21, 2023 saw participation from 18 students and 3 teachers. Its objectives included increasing awareness about menstrual hygiene, improving access to high-quality sanitary napkins, and advocating environmentally friendly disposal methods. The drive concluded with the distribution of sanitary pads on 'International Women's Day' on March 8, 2023. It benefitted the underprivileged women in Attawa village, Sec-42, and the slum area of sector 25, Chandigarh.



RESEARCH INITIATIVES

The **College** is forever committed to promoting Research at all levels. 69 research scholars registered under the teachers of different departments while 17 Research scholars enrolled themselves under various supervisors in the Research Centre of the Post Graduate Department of English. In all, 24 teachers of the college are guiding Ph.D. candidates in various fields.

The College has created an ecosystem for innovation and initiatives for the creation and transfer of knowledge. To promote the same, 10 workshops and seminars were conducted on important topics such as Research Methodology, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), and entrepreneurship during the year including a workshop on Photoshop, Research Methodology, Entrepreneurship Skills, and a Workshop on Entrepreneurship in Electronics.

During the session, 21 Research Papers in the Journals notified on the UGC website were published by the faculty of the college. 5 books and 6 chapters in books were also published by the faculty during the year while 2 faculty members got their research articles published as conference proceedings. Many collaborative activities for research, faculty, and student exchange programmes were organized during the year to supplement the research initiatives of the college.

INTERACTION WITH ALUMNI

Dr. Uppal's engaging discourse provided valuable insights to enhance communication prowess, underlining its pivotal role in personal and professional triumph. The session was attended by a spirited gathering of over 100 participants.

Another session held on March 14, 2023 showcased Ms. Prableen Bajpai, Founder of FinFix Research and Analytics Pvt Ltd, an illustrious alumna from the 2002 batch. Ms. Bajpai delved into the crucial domain of Financial Literacy for Women, elucidating asset categorizations, goal-driven portfolio structuring, and the imperative of women's financial empowerment. The session, drawing over 100 participants comprising students and faculty, facilitated insightful dialogue and personalized guidance on investment frameworks. These impactful sessions underscored the commitment of the alumni association and the college to holistic education and the enduring bond between alumni and students.

PARENT TEACHER MEETING

The **Parents Teacher Association (PTA)** held an annual meeting during the academic year 2022-23, with the aim to provide a platform for parents to engage with teachers and discuss concerns about their children's education. This meeting coincided with the visit of the NAAC Peer team to the college on April 24-25, 2023. Parents were invited to interact with the team during this period, resulting in approximately 45 parents actively participating in the meeting. This initiative reflects the ongoing commitment of the PTA and the college to foster effective communication and collaboration between parents and educators for the holistic development of students.

The interaction with the NAAC Peer team added a valuable dimension to the meeting, allowing parents to gain insights into the college's assessment and accreditation processes, further enhancing transparency and engagement within the educational community. Moreover, the positive feedback received from parents about the college's efforts and achievements indicates a strong sense of satisfaction and appreciation among the parent community.

PLACEMENT INITIATIVES

Throughout the academic year 2022-23, the **Placement Cell** of the College diligently pursued its mission to bridge the gap between students' professional aspirations and their employability. 97 students were successfully placed in esteemed companies, including Accenture, Algomil IT Solutions, Allen, Amazon, Arvind Textile, Aviva Life Insurance Co. India, RT Global Infotainment, Decathlon, eClerx, Hike Education, ICICI Prudential Life Insurance, and IDS Infotech, among others. Additionally, four students secured valuable internship opportunities. The highest stipend offered to a candidate reached Rs. 2,64,000 per annum, while the highest annual salary amounted was Rs. 5,82,000 per annum, reflecting the calibre of our students and the opportunities provided.

The Employability Enhancement Programmes played a pivotal role in preparing students for the industry. Initiatives such as the Certificate Programme in Banking, Finance, and Insurance (CPBFI) provided industry exposure. Moreover, our collaboration with Mahindra Pride Classroom, a CSR initiative of the Mahindra Group and Naandi Foundation, focused on enhancing students' communication, presentation, and interview skills, fostering problem-solving abilities, promoting teamwork, and instilling a sense of responsibility. These efforts underscore our commitment to nurturing well-rounded, job-ready professionals and ensuring our students excel in their chosen careers.
