Significant steps taken during the session in this direction include:


Existence of Anti-ragging Cell:

The Anti-ragging Cell/Committee of the college was expanded to control and prevent the incidents of ragging in the college, if any. It includes the following members:



Display of Names and Phone Numbers in the Campus:

The names and phone numbers of the members of the Anti-Ragging Cell as well as the Nodal Officer are displayed prominently on hoardings installed at important places in the college to enable students to approach them for help promptly.

Anti-ragging Warning in the Institutional Prospectus:

The statutory warning against Ragging is printed boldly in colour in both, the Prospectus of the College and the Hostel (Online and Offline) for the information of students as well as their parents.

Installation of CCTV Cameras:

CCTV Cameras are installed at vital spots in the campus and hostel to keep a check on the activities of the students in the college premises. The monitor installed in the principal's office serves to maintain a round-the-clock vigilance on any kind of unlawful activity by the students and ensure their safety.

Anti-ragging Undertaking

As per the instructions of the government, Anti-ragging Undertaking was sought from all students at the time of admission. The submission of the document ensures the students' commitment of compliance with the government's policy of eradicating ragging.

Students were also asked to fill Online Anti-Ragging Undertaking at the National Portal of UGC and GOI (www.anti-ragging.in and www.amanmovement.org) while filling up the online admission form of the college.

UGC Guidelines on the Menace of Ragging and a Sample of Anti-ragging Undertaking Form was made available on the College Website for the facility of the students.

Address by the Principal:

Principal Dr. Nisha Bhargava addressed the new comers after the ceremonial Havan in the College to initiate the auspicious beginning of the Academic Session 2023-24 on July 24, 2023, and apprised them of the rules against Ragging. She urged them to report any such case, if at all and also encouraged them to maintain a secure and fear-free atmosphere in the campus.

Introduction of freshers with the Committee & Rules against Ragging:

During the Induction/Orientation Programme held in the college on 29 September, 2023, the Convener and members of the Anti-ragging Cell were introduced to the new students.





The senior students introduced them to the mandatory rules and regulations meant to prevent ragging through creative posters, innovative songs and meaningful skits presented online.

In her address to the student, the Principal of the college Dr. Nisha Bhargava also sensitized the students about the evil of ragging.

Awareness during the Mentorship Programme:

Special Mentorship Sessions were conducted to sensitize the students of all classes and streams about both, the Institutional Code of Conduct and the Rules laid down by the UGC to curb Ragging in the institutions of higher learning. All the Mentors spread awareness about this menace during these sessions held on 19 September, 2023.

Events to Promote Awareness:

- 1. A letter in the form of an e-mail was sent to the parents of all the students of Semester II and Semester IV seeking admission to Semester III and IV before the beginning of the session to sensitize them both regarding the evil of ragging.
- 2. Anti-Ragging Posters prescribed by the UGC as well as those made by the students were displayed at prominent places in the Campus, hostel and Students' Common Room to sensitize the students against the evil of Ragging.
