





Guidelines for Parents and Students

ENTRY RULES

- Parents and students are required to go through the prospectus carefully before signing the Admission Form. Once the form is signed, the complete responsibility of having read the rules and regulations shall lie with the parents and the students, who shall be bound by the same.
- Subject combinations must be checked carefully to avoid subject clashes.
- The college follows Panjab University guidelines for NEP and non-NEP courses, as issued from time to time.

CONDUCT RULES

- Discipline is given paramount importance. Any act of indiscipline can lead to punitive action.
- Lectures shall be counted from the date of commencement of the academic session/course.
- Students will not be allowed to enter the College campus without their I-Cards.
- Students must make it a point to read the Notice Board daily. Ignorance of orders/notices duly displayed on the Notice Board shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.
- All the students are advised to keep checking the college website regularly for important announcements and updates.
- It is the personal responsibility of the student to inform the College office of any change in her address/phone number/email id or that of her parents/guardians. The College is not responsible for any gap in communication in case personal information is not updated by the student.
- Parents are requested to keep in touch with the faculty members as well as attend the Parent-Teacher Meeting which is held annually to keep track of their wards' academic performance and conduct.
- Rights of admission and entry to the College campus are reserved.
- Visitors are not allowed to meet the students during College hours.
- Transportation service for Panchkula and Chandigarh is available.
- Students coming by car/scooter or being dropped should avoid stopping their vehicle in front of the main gate to ensure smooth flow of traffic.
- Students must ensure that ACs, lights and fans in college and hostel areas are switched off when not required.
- Students are advised to avoid carrying large amount of cash, jewellery or any other expensive articles to College. The authorities shall not take responsibility for any loss/theft of personal belongings.
- The College authorities shall not be responsible for students' conduct outside the College.
- The following activities will be viewed very seriously: littering the campus, not using proper bins for dry and wet waste, scribbling on the walls and College property, creating disturbance anywhere in the College campus, tampering with vehicles of the staff members and property of the college, indulging in any kind of unfair means in college or university examination.



- A student who is guilty of misconduct in any way shall not be eligible for any prize, stipend, scholarship, fee concession or membership of any important body of the College.
- Carrying of plastic bottles or bags is not allowed as the college is a single-use plastic free campus.

Note: A student found guilty of breaking rules is liable to be penalized and in extreme cases, may even be expelled from the College.

ANTI-RAGGING REGULATIONS

- A student is required to obtain a minimum of 25% marks in the aggregate of all subjects in the Mid-Semester Test (MST).
- Failing to fulfil any of the given conditions, the student shall have to appear as a private candidate in Panjab University Examination.
- Students are required to clear all the college dues before appearing for the University Examination.

- Leave must be applied for in advance on leave form available in the office.

NEP 2020

This National Education Policy 2020 aims to meet the needs of a rapidly changing world and a knowledge-driven economy. This Policy proposes the revision and revamping of all aspects of the education structure, including its regulation and governance to create a new system that is aligned with the aspirational goals of 21st century education while building upon India's traditions and value systems. It's aim is to develop students into versatile as well as creative individuals with ethical and constitutional values, intellectual curiosity, scientific temper, and 21st century capabilities across a range of disciplines including sciences, social sciences, arts, humanities and languages. Quality higher education must enable personal accomplishment and enlightenment, constructive public engagement, and productive contribution to the society, preparing students for more meaningful lives, work roles as well as economic independence.

IMPORTANT REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES

- **I. Award of Undergraduate Degrees:** A student will be awarded an Undergraduate Degree upon securing a total of 144 credits within three years. An Undergraduate Degree with Honours will be awarded upon securing a total of 192 credits.
- 2. Credit Completion: Each student must aim to complete a requirement of 24 credits per semester or 48 credits in one academic year, in accordance with PU regulations for courses under NEP-2020.
- 3. Course Selection: A student will select courses from the basket/lists offered by the College.
- **4. Major and Minor Course Selection:** By the end of the second semester, students may decide to continue with their chosen Major or request a change. The major course allows for in-depth study of a particular subject or discipline.
- **5.** Change of Major: Students will be allowed to change their major within the broad discipline at the end of the second semester, allowing sufficient time to explore interdisciplinary courses during the first year.
- **6. Language Requirement:** Every student will choose two languages, including English, irrespective of the chosen Degree.
- 7. Updates and Amendments: The scheme is subject to modifications as per UGC and Panjab University Guidelines. Any changes in regulations in subsequent years after admission to the 1st Year will be applicable for the students retrospectively. Students should stay informed about any updates to ensure compliance with guidelines made by the competent authority.

Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes with Multiple Entry Multiple Exit as per NEP 2020

In adherence to the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the College has introduced a revised Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP). This is based on the University Grants Commission's (UGC) guidelines, with a student-centric focus, flexible choice-based credit system, and a multidisciplinary approach. This framework also provides multiple entry and exit options, facilitating students to align their education with their career aspirations by choosing subjects/fields of their interest.

I. Certification and Duration of Study with Multiple Entry Multiple Exit (MEME)

The undergraduate degree will have a flexible duration of either three or four years, with multiple exit options during this period. The structure provides students with the flexibility to enter, exit, and re-enter the programme at various stages, each with its corresponding certification. The table below outlines the various certifications students can earn at different stages of their undergraduate study:

2. Credit-based courses and projects

The undergraduate curriculum will include credit-based courses and projects centered around community engagement, environmental education, and value-based education. Additionally, students will have opportunities for internships with local companies/firms, businesses, artists, craftspeople, as well as research internships with faculty and researchers at their own or other Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)/research institutions. These practical experiences are integral to enhancing students' learning and employability.

Note: a) Students who choose to exit the programme after the completion of the first two semesters must undertake a work-based learning/internship during the summer term. This internship, worth 4 credits, is a requirement for the award of the Undergraduate Certificate.

b) The maximum time in which a student will be allowed to complete the Degree is Seven Years.

3. Semester and Credit Structure

A standard academic year is divided into two semesters, each semester spanning a minimum of 15 weeks. In addition to this, an eight-week summer term is also included in the academic calendar.

During the summer term, students are encouraged to engage in internships, apprenticeships or work-based vocational education and training. This is particularly beneficial for students who plan to exit after two or four semesters of study.

4. Eligibility for Undergraduate Programmes

Specific eligibility criteria for pursuing undergraduate degrees in the discipline of Arts, Science or Commerce are specified in the NEP Regulations on Panjab University website.

5. First Year Undergraduate Programme Structure

Upon admission to the first semester of the undergraduate studies, students are required to outline their course choices according to the structure provided. The template for this academic plan is as follows:

- 2. Every student will ensure that she is taking a specified number of courses in each component of the Curriculum Framework to complete 24 credits.

6. Choice of Courses

Undergraduate students will make course selections from list provided by the College. The choices will fall into categories as outlined below:

6. I Major Course:

This is the primary subject area, a student wishes to delve into during the undergraduate course. It is the area of study that the student is keenly interested in and may wish to pursue as a career. Students can be permitted to change their Major within the broad discipline at the end of the second semester, providing them with ample time to explore interdisciplinary courses during their first year.

6.2 Minor Course:

This is a secondary area of study that complements the student's chosen Major. Students who complete a sufficient number of courses in a discipline or an interdisciplinary area of study other than their chosen Major will qualify for a Minor in that discipline or interdisciplinary area. A student may declare their choice of Minor and vocational stream at the end of the second semester.

6.3 Multidisciplinary Course (MDC/MDSC):

All undergraduate students are required to complete three introductory-level courses relating to any of the broad disciplines. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already taken as their proposed Major and Minor stream under this category.

6.4 Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):

These are Modern Indian Language (MIL) & English language courses focused on enhancing language and communication skills. The courses aim to enable students to acquire and demonstrate core linguistic skills, including communication, critical reading, and expository and academic writing skills.

6.5 Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):

These courses aim to impart practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students.

6.6 Value Added Course (VAC):

These courses are designed to provide extra skills or knowledge beyond the standard curriculum, often tailored towards enhancing employability, promoting entrepreneurship, or developing personal and professional skills.

7. Course Components

Courses will be comprised of one or more of the following components depending on the requirement of a specific discipline:

- Lecture
- Tutorial
- Practicum
- Seminar/ Internship/ Studio Activities/ Field Practice/ Projects/ Community Engagement and Service

8. Research Project/Dissertation Requirement for 4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research)

For students enrolled in the 4-Year Bachelor's Degree program (Honours with Research), it is mandatory to undertake a research project under the supervision of a faculty member in the fourth year. This research project is to be initiated and completed in the eighth semester of the programme.

9. Inclusion of Other Activities in VAC/SEC

The Value Added Course (VAC) and Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) components of the undergraduate curriculum will include a diverse range of extracurricular activities that enrich students' learning experience and contribute to their personal and professional development. These activities will include but are not limited to:

- Participation in the National Service Scheme (NSS)
- Engagement with the National Cadet Corps (NCC)
- Involvement in adult education or literacy initiatives

- For Semester I: After the Merit List is displayed on College Website, the approved applicants will proceed to pay the admission fee online.

Migration from the Affiliated College to Another

- 1.1. Local migration of students shall ordinarily not be allowed only for valid reasons.
- 1.2. No student who has joined one college shall be admitted to another college during the same course unless:
 - (i) the Principals of the colleges concerned agree and the application is forwarded to the Registrar for sanction, accompanied by a prescribed fee which shall, in no case, be refunded, and
 - (ii) the Principal of the college from which he intends to migrate has given the leaving certificate.

 No application for transfer shall be entertained unless the student's statement is supported by Principal who, in the case of migration of students provisionally promoted, shall state all the relevant facts on the application.
- 2. A student who is conditionally promoted shall not be admitted to a higher class by the Principal of the other college, on migration.
- 3. If the applicant be a detained student or one who has been degraded or against whom any disciplinary action has been taken, etc., the Principal shall specifically mention this in his remarks.
- 4. The college leaving certificate shall not be given by the Principal until the transfer has been notified by the Registrar. No admission without such sanction shall be considered valid.
- 5. When migration of a student from one college to another college has been sanctioned, he/she must join the new college within 15 days. Provided that if a student does not avail himself of the migration, within fifteen days from the date of receipt of the letter by the Principals of the colleges concerned, he/she shall have to apply afresh and pay fresh fee in order to revalidate his/her previous migration.
- 6. If a student changes his/her mind after putting in his application for migration, he/she must inform the colleges concerned as also the University immediately.
- 7. If the student changes his/her mind after migration has been sanctioned by the University, he/she must apply for re-migration and follow the entire procedure prescribed by the University once again if he/she has joined the other college. If he/ she has not, he/she must apply for cancellation of the migration certificate through the Principal of the college concerned and return his migration certificate.
- 8. No migration certificate can be issued unless the student has been registered with the University.

FOREIGN STUDENTS




